#### SEUSSICAL DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Theodor Seuss Geisel, known better to us as Dr. Seuss, emerged as an illustrator and political cartoonist in the 1930s. His first children's book, *And to Think I Saw it on Mulberry Street*, was published in 1937 and started him on a long journey that revolutionized children's literature. During World War II his work was centered around the war effort, but he returned to children's books with *If I Ran the Zoo* in 1950. What followed was an output of over 60 children's books, including a series of early readers that finally replaced the stilted "Dick and Jane" series with imaginative and clever characters and stories. His books have inspired 11 animated TV specials, 5 feature films and the musical you are about to see.

Seussical draws its story mostly from the Horton the Elephant books. As Horton does his best to help save the community of Whoville living on a speck of dust, a myriad of other Seuss characters representing 20 Dr. Seuss books, interact with Horton's story—all pulled together by the emblematic emcee portrayed by "The Cat in the Hat." A musical based on Dr. Seuss books seemed obvious, for after all, the TV specials all had wonderful songs, but the composition duties went to Broadway veterans, Lynn Ahrens and Stephan Flaherty, who had made important contributions in the 1990s with Once on this Island and Ragtime. This all seemed like a hit in the making, but the premier in 2000 was panned by critics and closed in the red.

The authors went back to work on the show for a subsequent national tour headed by Cathy Rigby as The Cat in the Hat and it did well. That version went into secondary licensing and has been popular with regional and educational theaters ever since. The authors went back to work on the show again for a smaller Theatreworks U.S.A. produced tour, which is the version we are presenting for you now.

This phenomenon of continuing to work on a musical after it closes on Broadway to get it right was unusual at the time. Typically, once a show premieres it is set in stone. However, treating the Broadway production of Seussical as a learning experience to go back and make the show work has ensured that this musical has an enduring place in the cannon. I myself watched this transition in real time. The Broadway production was grandiose and was even confusing as too much of the elements not directly connected to Horton's story with the Who boy, Jojo, muddied the waters. The first national tour tightened the material a lot and took a more sensible approach to the scenery. The Theatreworks U.S.A. production streamlined the entire enterprise again with a less-is-more concept that clearly focused the story around Horton helping Jojo's plight. This version was my personal favorite and as an agent handling the show during my time in New York, working for Music Theatre International, I brought this version to the attention of anyone inquiring about the title.

Dr. Seuss didn't just make reading fun—with a careful hand, he also enlightened young minds by instilling empathy for people's differences, advocating for diversity, promoting the welfare of the environment and asking us all to be good citizens in a turbulent world. This musical not only captures the whimsy and imagination of Dr. Seuss, but also his sense of humanity.

#### **ABOUT THE AUTHORS**

LYNN AHRENS won Tony, Drama Desk and Outer Critics Circle Awards and received two Grammy nominations for Broadway's Ragtime. For Twentieth Century Fox's animated feature film Anastasia, she was nominated for two Academy Awards and two Golden Globes. She and longtime collaborator Stephen Flaherty received the Oscar Hammerstein Award for Lifetime Achievement, and in 2015 they were inducted into the Theater Hall of Fame. Broadway: Anastasia; Once On This Island (Olivier Award, Best Musical; Tony nominations, Best Book and Score); Seussical (Grammy nomination); My Favorite Year; Chita Rivera: The Dancer's Life; Rocky; Madison Square Garden's A Christmas Carol; Ragtime (2010 Broadway revival). Off-Broadway and regional: Lincoln Center Theater's Dessa Rose, The Glorious Ones (both Drama Desk-nominated) and A Man of No Importance (Outer Critics Circle Award, Best Musical); Lucky Stiff; Little Dancer (Kennedy Center world premiere). Film and television credits include A "Christmas Carol" (NBC-TV); Camp (IFC Films); "Schoolhouse Rock" (ABC-TV) and others. (Emmy Award and four Emmy nominations). She is a Council member of the Dramatists Guild of America, a co-founder of the Dramatists Guild Fellows Program, and a Lilly Award winner for Lyrics, www.ahrensandflaherty.com

STEPHEN FLAHERTY is the composer of the Broadway musicals Ragtime (Tony, Drama Desk, OCC Awards, two Grammy nominations), Seussical (Grammy, Drama Desk nominations), Once on This Island (Tony nomination, Olivier Award, Best Musical) and Rocky. Additional Broadway includes Chita Rivera: The Dancer's Life (original songs) and Neil Simon's Proposals (incidental music). Stephen has also written four musicals at Lincoln Center Theatre: The Glorious Ones (OCC, Drama Desk nominations), Dessa Rose (OCC, Drama Desk nominations), A Man of No Importance (OCC, Best Musical, Drama Desk nomination) and My Favorite Year. Other theater includes In Your Arms (Old Globe), Little Dancer (Kennedy Center), Lucky Stiff (Playwrights Horizons) and Loving Repeating: A Musical of Gertrude Stein (Chicago's Jefferson Award, Best New Musical.) Film includes Anastasia (two Academy Award and two Golden Globe nominations), the documentary After The Storm and Lucky Stiff. Mr. Flaherty's concert music has premiered at the Hollywood Bowl, Boston's Symphony Hall, Carnegie Hall, the Guggenheim Museum and Symphony Space. Stephen and Lynn are members of the Dramatists Guild Council and co-founders of the Dramatists Guild Fellows Program. In 2015 they were inducted into the Theater Hall Of Fame.
