DIRECTOR'S NOTES IMPORTANCE OF BEING EARNEST

This classic comedy of manners by Oscar Wilde has been a perennial favorite since 1895. The play is absolute fluff, though it did aim at blowing up the social rules of the upper class in England by making them ridiculous. This witty confection has proven to stand the test of time, productions being too numerous to have been set down in the historical record, though we know it has been seen on Broadway in nine separate productions—the last being 2011.

The play has been adapted for the movies three times: 1952 with Dame Edith Evans, who was well-known for playing Lady Bracknell on the London stage, a 1992 film used an all black cast, and a 2002 film with Dame Judi Dench, Reese Witherspoon, Colin Firth and Rupert Everett.

Oscar Wilde's theatre career began with Salome in 1891, which premiered in Paris, but was denied a license to produce in England due to a restriction on portraying Biblical subjects on stage at the time. His London debut play was Lady Windermere's Fan, which was a big success and was followed by two more hit comedies: A Woman of No Importance and An Ideal Husband. All within four years, these plays, plus The Importance of Being Earnest, cemented Wilde's reputation as the most successful playwright of his time and added to his already distinguished literary career of poetry, essays, articles, books and the enduring classic, The Picture of Dorian Gray.

I have been using "Earnest" as an example of Comedy of Manners and late 19th Century theatre in my Theatre Arts class all along. When we finish reading the play as a class, someone always suggests that we do a production—it seems that contemporary teenagers find it to still be amusing. Our 2023 cast is excited to share the fun with you!


