DIRECTOR'S NOTES: TWELVE ANGRY JURORS

Twelve Angry Jurors began life as Twelve Angry Men, a television play written by Reginald Rose in 1954 for CBS. The following year it was adapted for the stage for the first time, but has seen several adaptations through the years. High School theatre groups picked it up immediately because of its natural educational value in depicting what it's like to serve on a jury, but also a flexibility in casting. Although the story started out with a cast of men, it has since been adapted for an all female cast, Twelve Angry Women, and a combination of the two, which you are about to see now, adapted by Sherman L. Sergel.

The first London production premiered in 1964, but Broadway didn't see the show until 2004. Produced by the Roundabout Theatre Company, the Broadway production ran 328 performances and then toured the U.S. with Richard Thomas as Juror Number Eight. All the while, between the TV debut and the Broadway debut, the play was produced countless times in high schools all over the country and continues to be a relevant favorite, even in the 21st Century. Through his twelve characters, Rose's observation of human nature has proven to be universal regardless of the decade.

Sydney Lumet made his directorial debut with Henry Fonda starring in a film version of *Twelve Angry Men* in 1957. Henry Fonda and Reginald Rose were the producers. The film has become a classic in its own right, being selected in 2007 for preservation in the United States National Film Registry by the Library of Congress as being "culturally, historically, or aesthetically significant."

The story runs in real time and is played without intermission.




