RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS,  
COUNTY OF SACRAMENTO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA  
CONGRATULATES

CHRISTIAN BROTHERS HIGH SCHOOL  
ON ITS 125<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY

Whereas, in 1876, Miss Maggie Cunningham was inspired by the work of the De La Salle Christian Brothers at Saint Mary's College in San Francisco to pursue the establishment of Christian Brothers schools in Sacramento; and

Whereas, Archbishop Joseph Alemany dedicated St. Patrick's Institute at 12<sup>th</sup> & K Streets on July 15, 1876, and a week later the Christian Brothers began classes for 200 students; and

Whereas, in 1896 day school, known as Sacramento Institute, changed its name to Christian Brothers College; and

Whereas, due to the deterioration of the school at 12<sup>th</sup> & K, and the commercial value of the asbestos-cement property, in 1922 the school moved to an abandoned Sacramento Public School building at 35<sup>th</sup> & J Streets, now the home of Sacred Heart Church; and

Whereas, the Christian Brothers opened the newly named CHRISTIAN BROTHERS HIGH SCHOOL, at what is now 21<sup>st</sup> and Broadway in 1924 and subsequently moved to its current location on Sacramento Boulevard, now known as Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard in 1957; and

Whereas, CHRISTIAN BROTHERS HIGH SCHOOL, presently serves 1,000 young men and women, has an active alumni base of over 10,000, and has been such an integral part of the history of Sacramento that a great majority of its citizens know of it personally, or have themselves been directly associated with Christian Brothers High School; and

Whereas, CHRISTIAN BROTHERS HIGH SCHOOL, continues to contribute to the growth of Sacramento, especially the neighborhood of Oak Park, by its commitment to comprehensive quality education with a moral focus; and

Whereas, the Christian Brothers have shared 125 years of their 320-year-old educational heritage with the Catholic community of Sacramento, ensuring the ongoing success of CHRISTIAN BROTHERS HIGH SCHOOL through their dedicated school community of faculty, administration, staff, parents, alumni, Board of Trustee members, and Christian Brothers.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved that Sacramento County Board of Supervisors, County of Sacramento, State of California, does hereby congratulate and commend the CHRISTIAN BROTHERS HIGH SCHOOL and the De La Salle Christian Brothers on the occasion of their 125<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and commend them for outstanding services to the Sacramento community.
