

DIRECTOR'S NOTES: The Royal Family

George S. Kaufman and Edna Ferber's The Royal Family opened in that famed Broadway year of 1927 when 275 new productions opened. The week of Christmas that year had eighteen shows open in six days. Eleven of those opened on Monday, December 26th! There has never been any other time to compare to that prolific year-the same year that talking pictures were introduced to the world with The Jazz Singer. The next night. Show Boat opened and then on the 28th: The Royal Family. Although the character names were changed to protect the quilty, everyone knew the play was about the Barrymore family. Upon hearing about the impending production, Ethel Barrymore demanded to read a script and was as incensed as she thought she would be. Her lawyer advised her that her brother John was the only family member that might actually be libeled. There is something of the careless indifference associated with the character of Tony Cavendish, that John Barrymore couldn't be bothered to return his sister's frantic calls to stop The Royal Family from becoming the big long running hit that it was. Catching the play in Los Angeles, brother Lionel thought it pretty humorous and so did everyone else.

That Los Angeles production stared Frederic March as Tony, who reprised the role in a 1930 film version under the title *The Royal Family of Broadway*. Produced at the beginning of the sound era, the film is stilted by today's standards; many scenes and a few characters are cut, but the performances are winning and the play's excellence shines through. This is one of many films of the period still awaiting a quality restoration and DVD release.

In 1975, Broadway saw the first revival, starring Rosemary Harris as Julie, which was subsequently taped for television. Rosemary Harris returned to *The Royal Family* as the elderly Fanny Cavendish in the most recent Broadway revival of 2009, where I was first introduced to the play. This raucous comedy, filled with the cleverness of our friend George S. Kaufman, who gave us *Animal Crackers* and those classic collaborations with

Moss Hart, and the pathos and depth of character that was the hallmark of Edna Ferber, make *The Royal Family* a multi-course feast. Today, *The Royal Family* is on its way to being reimagined as a musical by William Finn—something to look forward to soon on Broadway.

More than just a send-up of the Barrymores, The Royal Family is actually a Valentine to the people of the theatre. They are eccentric, vain, smart, wild, worldly, progressive, dedicated and above all loyal—to each other as well as their craft. Our own family of players, some of whom our regular audience has been enjoying in every production of the past two years, understand and identify with the Royal Family's unalterable conviction that the play is indeed the thing and the show must go on.
