Companies Operating In Sacramento In 1876

1. Wells Fargo Bank On July 13, (1852) the Company opened its first office, as a banking and express company, on Montgomery Street in San Francisco. Wells Fargo also began business in Sacramento at about the same time, gateway to the mines.

2. Burnett & Sons Planing Mill (1865) Philitus and his oldest son, Henry Burnett started a small shop in the rear of the family's home. They became known for their fine cabinets and staircases.

3. McClatchy Newspaper Inc. (1857)

4. McKesson & Robbins, Inc. (1860) Henry Kirk founded a Pharmacy he named Kirk and Co. and in 1918 it became Kirk, Geary And Co. In 1928 with about 100 employees it became part of McKesson & Robbins, Inc. There are descendants of the Geary family that attended Christian Brothers.

5. Sara Lee Baking Group. (1848) It started as the Pioneer Baking Co. It was purchased by Henry Schnetz in 1880. After working for his father, his son Earl started The Betsy Ross Co. Their have have been members of the Schnetz family that have attended Christian Brothers.

6. Mercy Nuns. (1857) Started their first School in Sacramento at St. Rose church at 7th and K Street.

7. Catholic Church. (1850) Bishop Alemany, newly appointed bishop of Monterey, appointed a Fr. Augustive P. Anderson to Sacramento to establish a church in Sacramento.

8. Fuller-O'Brien. (1848) Willian Parmer Fuller came out to Sacramento for gold, but like most prospectors, turned to other endeavors. In his case, it was the manufacture of paint.

9. Breuners Furniture. (1856) John Breuner, the founder, was born in Baden Germany. He immigrated to Ohio in the early 1850's. He came to Sacramento in 1856 and started his company by traveling around making "cradles" used to separate the gold from the earth. He later set up a "Ware Room" where he made and sold furniture. Over the years Breuners became one of the leading furniture stores in America with 18 locations.

10. Nicoletti Culjis & Herberger Funeral Home. (1869) Originally it was Miller & McMullen. The name was changed to Miller-Skelton and in the 1960's and became Miller-Skelton-Herberger when purchased by Suerdon Herberger. Mr. Herberger is still alive. There were some members of the Herberger family who went to Christian Brothers.

11. Union Pacific railroad. (1863) The groundbreaking ceremony for the Central Pacific Railroad was held Januray 8, 1863 at the foot of K St. The rails connected with the Union

Pacific Railroad in Utah in 1869 to complete the transcontinental RR. The Southern Pacific was formed in 1865 and was purchased by the Central Pacific on July 11, 1868. In 1884 the Southern Pacific became the corporate name for all of the Central Pacific holdings. On August 3, 1994 the UP and SP announced their intent to merge under the Union Pacific name.

12. H.C. Muddox Company, (1878) Even though the company was formed 2 years after the opening of Christian Brothers first school, it is interesting to note the the company (now named Pacific Coast Building Products) is a subcontractor in the building of our new Science and Technology building. Originally the plant made sewer pipe and dealt with residential construction. Now 75% of its business is commercial.

Dear Mark,

This will be pretty much off the top of my head, but I'll take Kirrene's list first.

Wells Fargo, Burnett & Sons (Burnett Miller, the current boss, ~~ex~~ is the former mayor), and McClatchy Newspapers are all still in business.

Even if it still exists, I don't believe McKesson still ~~xxxx~~ has a presence in Sacramento, and I don't consider Sara Lee a local concern even if it did swallow up the Schnetz interests.

The Mercy nuns and the Catholic Church are still doing business as usual if one can consider what they do as a business.

There are still Fuller-O'Brien paint stores in operation although I don't know if there are any Fullers or O'Briens connected with them at this time.

The same is true of Breuners (John Breuner having been something of a shirttail relation of mine). The ~~xxxx~~ business was sold to Bay area interests, moved out of town, and while there still is a Breuners store out off I-80, I think the only connection is the name.

As for Nicoletti, Culjis & Herberger, that mortuary is now owned by a Canadian outfit. Not only are there no Millers or Skeltons left, there also are no Nicolettis or Culjises. One Herberger still may be an employee, but that family actually came rather late~~ly~~ to the business.

It appears there is a direct chain of management and ownership from the Central Pacific of 1865 to the Union Pacific of today - - not that the present company enjoys very congenial relationships with the city.

H.C. Muddox, remains, from my perspective, the real deal.

So from Kirrene's list I'd say that Wells Fargo, Burnett & Sons, McClatchy, Mercy, the Diocese, UP and Muddox all fit your requirements. I question the credentials of McKesson & Robbins, Sara Lee, ~~BYEHNREYS~~ Breuners, Nicoletti et al, even if they still are in business somewhere.

On the Business Journal list, I would exclude any outside Sacramento County (e.g. Fred P. Tuttle III and all the community newspapers).

Wells Fargo is repeated from the first list, as is Breuners, but I'd still question the latter's true eligibility. McClatchy is fine, as is the Folsom Telegraph (being in the county) and, of course, Burnett & Sons. Oh, and Miller Funeral Home of Folsom too.

And Nicoletti, Culjis & Herberger's owner is listed as the Lowen Group International, Inc., which pretty well excludes them in my opinion as a local firm.

Another avenue you might pursue, Mark, and no doubt a more reliable one than my personal memory, is the California State Fair, which for years sponsored a statewide Hundred Year Club. I'm not sure if it still exists, but I'm sure the lists still do, and that for ~~1976~~ 1976 would list all the businesses in the state which existed in 1876. It should be easy for someone to pick out the Sacramento ones, and I see no reason why anyone out there would refuse a request for access.

And that's the best I can do.
