The acoustic shells will be put to use immediately in the performing arts department, but they are also a critical piece of equipment for the new performing arts center as part of the theater set-up. The acoustic panels will provide the ability to fine tune the acoustics of the new performing arts center to ensure an optimum environment for the performers and optimum sound for the listening audience. In continuing in the tradition of excellence, these acoustic panels are a critical piece in building a comprehensive, serious, college preparatory visual and performing arts program.

FUND-AN-ITEM KBFT Cameras

KBFT is the student television station here at Christian Brothers High School. The station was founded in 2002, and is currently in its seventh school year of operation. **KBFT** broadcasts a live, closed circuit program to all students and staff as well as to a web audience three times per week. The "KBFT Morning News" is a ten to fifteen minute program that includes school announcements, world news, sports, weather and more. The show is entirely run by students.

The popularity and success of the **KBFT** program is evident in its accomplishments and awards over the years. **KBFT** has received national recognition by STN, the Student Television Network, and has been ranked as the #1 high school news broadcast in the nation in 2003, 2004, 2005, and 2006. **KBFT** was also awarded the number one live sports broadcast in the nation in 2007 and number one student broadcasting program in 2009. Several graduates of Christian Brothers High School who participated in **KBFT** have pursued careers in both television news and news media. Graduates have worked at local Sacramento stations KOVR, KCRA, Fox 40, KTXL, and the San Diego station KFMB.

AUCTION RULES

Absentee Bidding

Absentee Bids for items in the auction have been accepted from friends of Christian Brothers who are unable to attend. Absentee bids for Silent Auction items will be placed on the bid sheet as the opening bid. For Live Auction items, if an Absentee bid exceeds all others at the conclusion of the floor bidding, the auctioneer will announce the Absentee bid and the floor bidders will have the opportunity to raise the bid.

General Auction Rules

1. All sales are final and there will be no exchanges or refunds.

6. No statement contained in the catalog or made orally at the sale or elsewhere shall be deemed to be such a warranty, representation, or assumption of liability.
7. Activities sold at the auction are to be undertaken at the sole risk of the purchaser. Christian Brothers High School shall not be or become liable or responsible in any way for the loss, injury, or damage to or in respect of any person or property howsoever caused or arising from such activities.

8. All persons engaged in bidding for any item in the live or silent auctions agree by so bidding to pay the amount of his or her bid for said item if determined to be the successful bidder.
9. Persons bidding for silent auction items further agree that if a subsequent bid is disqualified or otherwise stricken for any reason prior to the close of bidding, the last and highest bid on the bid sheet will be deemed the successful bidder.
10. The closing Marshal will make the final determination of the successful bidder of any silent auction item. The auctioneer will be the final judge of the successful bidder for any item sold in the live auction.

Live Auction Rules

1. The live auction will begin at approximately 8:00 pm. It will consist of the oral auctioning of items in the order they appear in this catalog.
2. All bidding at the auction will require a bid number. Your personal bid number is located on the separate bidder sheet placed inside this auction catalog. Since this number is required for all bidding and purchase of items, please remember your number and keep your catalog and bidder sheet with you during the auction.
3. During the live auction, when you want to bid on an item, raise your bidder sheet to attract the auctioneer's attention. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the purchaser. In the event of a dispute between bidders, the auctioneer shall have sole and final discretion to determine the successful bidder or to re-offer and resell the article in dispute. When the auctioneer calls "SOLD," title to the article passes to the highest bidder who thereupon assumes full risk and responsibility for the article.

Silent Auction Rules

1. The silent auction will begin at 6:00 pm and the auction tables will be closed at various times until approximately 7:55 pm.
2. All items in the silent auction have bid sheets nearby. To make a bid, write your bid number on the sheet next to the amount you are willing to pay.
3. The amount of each bid increase is printed on the bid sheets. Your written bid number constitutes a contract to buy.
4. Each new bid must be written on the next available blank space on the bid sheet. The closed bid circled by a Marshal constitutes the winning bid. In the event of a dispute, an Auction Official shall act as the final authority and shall determine the winning bidder. This decision is final.
5. To determine if you are a silent auction winner, check in at Cashiering located in the cafeteria after 9:00 p.m. If you are the successful bidder, take your bidder sheet to the cashier's table where a cashier will take your payment and give you a receipt. Payment in full the night of the auction is mandatory. Payment may be made by cash, check, VISA or MasterCard. All items must be paid for by the conclusion of the evening.
