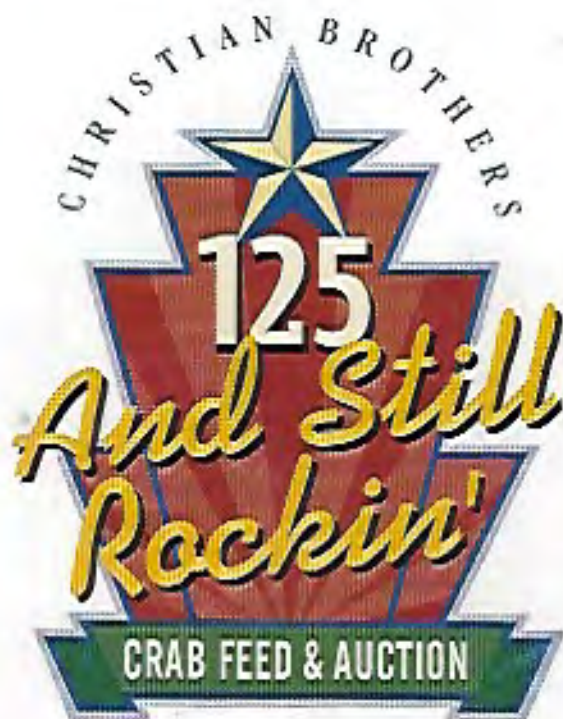

5. Unless otherwise specified, all auction items and services must be used within one year after November 2, 2002. Unless otherwise specified, dates and times are to be arranged between buyer and donor at their mutual convenience.
6. Christian Brothers High School has done its best to catalog and describe the property correctly, but all property is sold "as is" and Christian Brothers High School neither warrants nor represents, and shall in no event be responsible for the correctness of description, genuineness, authorship, or condition of the property. No statement contained in the catalog or made orally at the sale or elsewhere shall be deemed to be such a warranty, representation, or assumption of liability.
7. Activities sold at the auction are to be undertaken at the sole risk of the purchaser. Christian Brothers High School shall not be or become liable or responsible in any way for the loss, injury, or damage to or in respect of any person or property howsoever caused or arising from such activities.
8. All persons engaged in bidding for any item in the live or silent auctions agree by so bidding to pay the amount of his or her bid for said item if determined to be the successful bidder.
9. Persons bidding for silent auction items further agree that if a subsequent bid is disqualified or otherwise stricken for any reason prior to the close of bidding, the last and highest bid on the bid sheet will be deemed the successful bidder.
10. The closing Marshal will make the final determination of the successful bidder of any silent auction item. The auctioneer will be the final judge of the successful bidder for any item sold in the live auction.

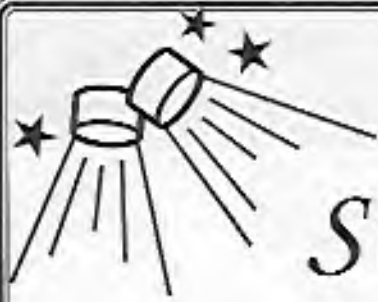

Live Auction Rules

1. The live auction will begin at approximately 8:00 p.m. It will consist of the oral auctioning of items in the order they appear in this catalog.
2. All bidding at the auction will require a bid number. Your personal bid number is located on the back of the auction catalog. Since this number is required for all bidding and purchase of items, please remember your number and keep your catalog with you at the auction.
3. During the live auction, when you want to bid on an item, raise your catalog to attract the auctioneer's attention. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the purchaser. In the event of a dispute between bidders, the auctioneer shall have sole and final discretion to determine the successful bidder or to re-offer and resell the article in dispute. When the auctioneer calls "Sold", title to the article passes to the highest bidder who thereupon assumes full risk and responsibility for the article.

Silent Auction Rules

1. The silent auction will begin at 5:00 p.m. and the auction tables will be closed at various times until approximately 7:30 p.m.
2. All items in the silent auction have bid sheets attached or affixed nearby. To make a bid, write your bid number on the sheet next to the amount you are willing to pay.
3. The amount of each bid increase is printed on the bid sheets. Your written bid number constitutes a contract to buy.
4. Each new bid must be written on the next available blank space on the bid sheet. The closed bid circled by a Marshal constitutes the winning bid. In the event of a dispute, an Auction Official shall act as the final authority and shall determine the winning bidder. This decision is final.
5. To determine if you are a silent auction winner, check in at the cashier's table after 9:00 p.m. If you are the successful bidder, take your bid number to the cashier's table where a cashier will take your payment and give you a receipt. Payment in full the night of the auction is mandatory. Payment may be made by cash, check, VISA or MasterCard. All items must be paid for by the conclusion of the evening.

1970 Graham Vintage Port (Portugal) -- Bottled in Portugal by one of the world's leading port producers, William Graham and Company of England, this port is considered by wine experts to be among the finest ports of this century. It is now fully mature and ready to drink.

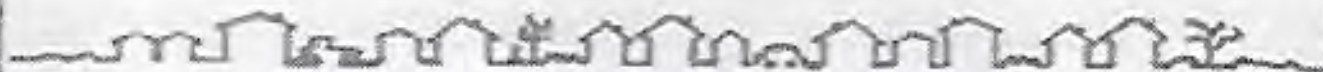
