The Falcons fied Cordova (8-2, 5-2) and three-time defending Division II Sac-Joaquin Section champion Oak Ridge (6-4, 5-2), who both won Friday night. A coin flip at 9 a.m. today at Cordova will determine which team will go to the playoffs.

Christian Brothers is happy to finish the regular season strongly and to be in contention for the playoffs late in the season.

"It's just an incredible feeling," coach Andre Johansen said. "From Day One, we knew we had the talent and the ability to win big games, and we were able to win our share this season."
