Entries may be offered in six categories: painting, drawing, sculpture, printmaking, photography and original crafts.


There will be one alumni award, one faculty-staff award, six student awards.

Our West Coast Province does own a winery which produces premium wines and brandy which are marketed under THE CHRISTIAN BROTHERS brand. From this the Brothers are able to provide a substantial subsidy to all the educational endeavors of the Brothers in California and Oregon. However, this subsidy is not nearly sufficient to provide scholarships and to cover the expenses of these institutions. That is why we must have successful Development programs in all our schools and colleges.

As part of the tercentenary of the founding of the Christian Brothers, Mont La Salle Vineyards and St. Mary's College are sponsoring a tour of Europe encompassing visits to areas associated with the early history of the Brothers (Reims/Paris and the motherhouse in Rome as well as the wine areas of Italy and France.
