

Brother Norman Cook, FSC, Provincial, appointed Brother Richard Camara, FSC, Principal of Christian Brothers High School, Sacramento, to succeed Brother Jerome Gallegos, FSC. Brother Richard will assume his responsibilities July 1, 1981.

La Salle High School, Concord, to be Principal, succeeding Brother Michael Meister, FSC, who will be continuing his doctoral studies full time next semester. Brother Norman explained that the transition in administration for both schools would be smoother by these appointments.

Brother Jerome had been in the administration of the Concord school before coming to Sacramento, July, 1979. Brother Richard has been Vice-Principal of Christian Brothers for the last three years and was Principal of Justin-Siena High School, Napa, before his Sacramento assignment. Brother Richard brings to his new job both experience and familiarity with the local situation.

Brother Richard was first assigned to CBS in 1958 and was Director of Resident Students in 1964 when the school at 21st and Broadway closed and the boys of the 9th and 10th grades there joined the junior and seniors boys at Bishop Armstrong High School.

FINE ARTS CENTER PROPOSED AS MEMORIAL TO DOUGLAS LEE NELSON '82

Douglas Lee Nelson, a Christian Brothers High School junior, died on December 4, 1980, just one day after his 17th birthday.

To perpetuate his memory — and to fulfill a dream Doug had — a fund has been



set up to build a fine arts center on the campus. The facility, to be called the Douglas Lee Nelson Fine Arts Center, will provide a setting for the exclusive development and encouragement in various expressions of the arts—painting (in all its aspects), sculpture, multiple of the content of the provided of the content of the provided of the content of the content

sic and drama, plus the more contemporary fields of communication, television, radio and film making. It is envisioned as more than a workshop and classroom, but also as a facility for theatrical productions, concerts and exhibitions.

Doug Nelson had an intense interest in the arts, which possibly first was evident when he was but 8 years old. He became a motion picture mogul — writing and directing a neighborhood movie, with his brother, David (CBS '75) behind the camera. Doug's creative talent was to be reflected for the remainder of his life through a variety of activities. Before he had entered the seventh grade, he took part in a summer Music Circus production, playing a munchkin in "The Wizard of Oz" with the Hudson Brothers. The following year, he took a new role as stage, lighting and sound co-manager for his school's (Holy Spirit) production of the same play.

At Brothers, Doug also could be found in journalism as a reporter on the Talon staff and as both photographer and advertising salesman for the Crest. Drama reappeared when he was a cast member of "Hobbit", and film making was a continuing avocation. His spirit and drive were evident outside of school as he helped with parish festivals (he was an altar boy five years), as a volunteer for Easter Seals, Cerebral Palsy and KVIE telethons, and as a worker for La Salle Club Frolics. During holidays he was busy with distribution of baskets for the less fortunate. He was a member of Junior Achievement.

During vacation, too young to obtain a paid job, he became a playground volunteer, teaching arts and crafts to children. Less than two months before his death, he was a guest disc jockey for radio station KZAP. He seemed to have boundless energy and diverse telepts.

Doug had long expressed a need for a center where creative talents could be continuously enriched, so it is appropriate his parents, Dick and Sue Nelson, put forth their suggestion and endorsement on a Fine Arts Center in his name. Although the fund is small now, it will continue to grow until the center is a reality and already a committee is working to provide architectural drawings. A program for fund raising is being established, spearheaded by the Nelsons and donations will be continuously accepted.

As the Nelsons say, "Doug was not a spectator of life; he was a participant who reached out to all that life had to offer. He loved life to its fullest. He lived it well."
