Co-Ed Summer School Begins June 16

Christian Brothers High School will again sponsor a co-ed summer school for high school students, June 16-July 23 and a special pre high school program, June 27-23. Classes meet Monday through Thursday.

The high school program includes 25 offerings to enrich a student's background or to make up for courses which have been unsatisfactory. The pre high school program is for 7th and 8th graders who want development in math, language arts or a special sports clinic.

Summer school bulletins may be obtained by calling the school office. Deadline for pre-registration is June 12.

Development Program Awards Merit Scholarships

The Board of Regents will continue to offer Merit Scholarships to students who best demonstrate potential for excellence at Christian Brothers High School.

These scholarships are for four years, however, winners must maintain a 3.0 G.P.A. and exemplary conduct.

Criteria for the scholarships are based on the following: 1) placement test, 2) school record and recommendation, 3) written statement by the student, 4) discussion of prepared material with faculty representatives.

Winners for 1981-82 are: Donnovan Somera, St. Ann's School (full scholarship); Peter Tobia, St. Mary's School (half scholarship); Paul Oliva, Holy Spirit School (half scholarship).

Winners of previous years, who have been maintaining an average of 3.5 GPA, will continue their scholarships next year. They are: Fernando Erisman, David Maes, Ted Coe, Harlan Imbery and Michael Roche.

The Development Program of the Board of Regents also contributes to the tuition assistance program for families who demonstrate a need for grant-in-aid.

For 1981-82, \$25,000 will be budgeted by the Development Office for scholarships and tuition assistance.

Regents Spur Development Program Appeal

At the end of the 3rd quarter of the current fiscal year (March 31), the Board of Regents noted that efforts to reach the goal of \$115,000 for the Development Program of 1980-81 are falling short of expectations.

Interest from endowed funds will provide scholarships and grants-in-aid, but an additional \$45,000 is needed in unrestricted donations to augment faculty salaries and help with the operating deficit in the school accounts for the school term.

The appeal for the Development Program has depended this year mainly on direct mailing to alumni, parents and business firms. The Regents plan to follow up these mailings with personal contacts.

Three former teachers have passed away: Brothers Frank Curley, Luke Daly and Conrad Dreschler.

BROTHER FRANK died March 1 in Mercy Hospital after several years of heart problems. He came to CBS in 1977 from New Jersey as a teacher of Social Studies. In the last two years he had charge of the student store.

BROTHER LUKE first came to Sacramento in 1936 when he taught at 21st and Broadway until 1938. He returned to Bishop Armstrong High School in 1958 until 1965. Brother Luke died in Napa where he was Sub Director of the Senior Brothers Community at Mont La Salle.

BROTHER CONRAD died in Napa at the age of 87. He was the last living Brother to teach at 12th and K, 1921-22. He also taught at 21st and Broadway 1927-28, 1932-33, 1947-50. Most of his teaching career was spent at Sacred Heart High School, San Francisco.




Brothers' Boys Retire As Pastors
