Prefect and direct tie to the Christian Brothers who taught them is Brother Bertram, while another connection with the past was reestablished in June, when Brother Joseph, their own teacher in years past, emerged from his retirement in sylvan Moraga to join the Brotherhoods in celebrating the 45-year anniversary of the class of 1936.

So if you think like (and perhaps enjoy a drink like) the Brotherhoods, perhaps you'd enjoy becoming another link in their never-to-be-broken chain. All you have to do is ask.
