RE: The early return from Saint Mary's Homecoming

It is with a heavy heart and much deliberation that I write this memo to you about the circumstances that necessitates the early return of the Drill Team. An explanation is in order.

Primarily, let it be very clear that in no way have the girls, individually or collectively, been responsible for this action. They have performed and been exceptionally well received by the majority of the Saint Mary's College High School Community of students, Fabulty, Parents and friends. A number of unfortunate verbal confrontations prompted by the Saint Mary's Songgirls and various other individuals in reaction to the presence of the Drill Team has necessitated the early return of the girls. This decision, while not a pleasant one for the girls or our students, was thought to be in the best interests of all concerned.

I would hope that this will be a real opportunity for growth and learning for all those affected and that in the future another chance to work together might be possible. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation; please accept my apologies for any inconvenience that this action might cause you.
