CLASS REUNIONS

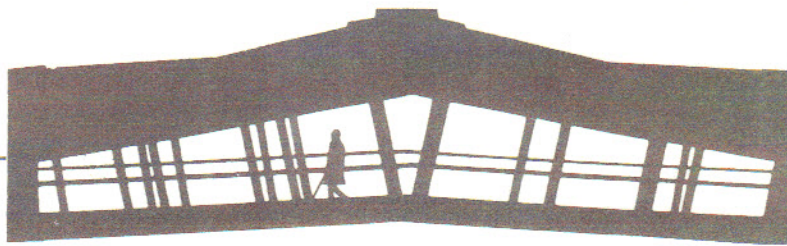
Celebrating the 20th and 30th anniversaries respectively, the classes of 1962 and 1952 will have their reunions this month.

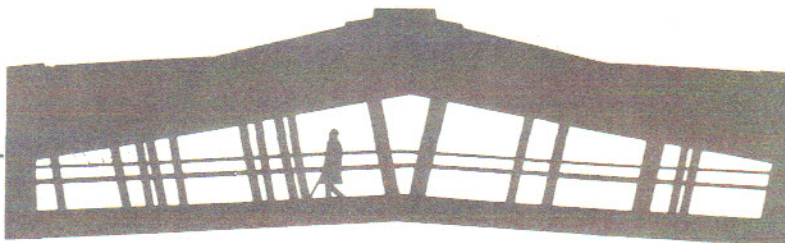
