Welcome to the State Fair! I hope you are enjoying our return to an era of innocent fun in a simpler time.



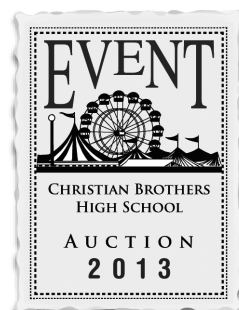

AUCTION RULES

ABSENTEE BIDDING

Absentee bids for items in the auction have been accepted from friends of Christian Brothers who are unable to attend. Absentee bids for Silent Auction items will be placed on the bid sheet as the opening bid. For Live Auction items, if an absentee bid exceeds all others at the conclusion of the floor bidding, the auctioneer will announce the absentee bid and the floor bidders will have the opportunity to raise the bid.

LIVE AUCTION RULES

1. The live auction will begin at approximately 7:30 p.m. It will consist of the live auctioning of items in the order they appear in this catalog.
2. All bidding at the auction will require a bid number. Your personal bid number is located on the separate bidder sheet placed inside this auction catalog. Since this number is required for all bidding and purchase of items, please remember your number and keep your catalog and bidder sheet with you during the auction.
3. During the live auction, when you want to bid on an item, raise your bidder sheet to attract the auctioneer's attention. The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer shall be the purchaser. In the event of a dispute between bidders, the auctioneer shall have sole and final discretion to determine the successful bidder or to re-offer and resell the article in dispute. When the auctioneer calls "SOLD," title to the article passes to the highest bidder who thereupon assumes full risk and responsibility for the article.

SILENT AUCTION RULES

1. The silent auction will begin at 5:30 p.m. and the auction tables will be closed at various times until approximately 7:15 p.m.
2. All items in the silent auction have bid sheets nearby. To make a bid, write your bid number on the sheet next to the amount you are willing to pay.
3. The amount of each minimum bid and bid increase is printed on the bid sheets. A bid which does not meet the minimum bid or minimum increase will be deemed invalid.
4. "Buy It Now:" A bidder who wishes to guarantee that he or she will win an item may place a guaranteed bid at the bottom of the bid sheet. When making a guaranteed bid, please notify a marshal and that bid sheet will be removed.
5. Your written bid number constitutes a contract to buy.
6. Each new bid must be written on the next available blank space on the bid sheet. The closed bid circled by a marshal constitutes the winning bid. In the event of a dispute, an auction official shall act as the final authority and shall determine the winning bidder. This decision is final.
7. To determine if you are a silent auction winner, check in at Cashiering located in the Field House after 9:00 p.m. If you are the successful bidder, a cashier will take your payment and give you a receipt. Payment in full the night of the auction is mandatory. Payment may be made by cash, check, VISA or MasterCard. All items must be paid for by the conclusion of the evening.

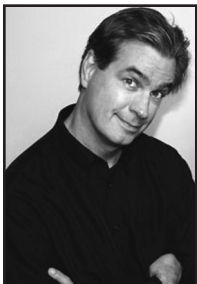
AUCTION RULES

GENERAL AUCTION RULES

1. All sales are final and there will be no exchanges or refunds.
2. Items may be removed that evening only by exhibiting a paid receipt at the door at the time of departure.
3. Value set forth opposite some items being auctioned are estimates only and are not warranted by Christian Brothers High School for tax purposes or for general sale.
4. All items must be paid for in full before the buyer's departure for the evening. Payment may be made in cash, personal check (made payable to Christian Brothers High School), VISA or MasterCard.
5. Unless otherwise specified, all auction items and services must be used within one year after March 16, 2013. Unless otherwise specified, dates and times are to be arranged between buyer and donor at their mutual convenience.
6. Christian Brothers High School has done its best to catalog and describe the property correctly, but all property is sold "as is" and Christian Brothers High School neither warrants nor represents, and shall in no event be responsible for the correctness of description, genuineness, authorship, or condition of the property. No statement contained in the catalog or made orally at the sale or elsewhere shall be deemed to be such a warranty, representation, or assumption of liability.
7. Activities sold at the auction are to be undertaken at the sole risk of the purchaser. Christian Brothers High School shall not be or become liable or responsible in any way for the loss, injury, or damage to or in respect of any person or property howsoever caused or arising from such activities.
8. All persons engaged in bidding for any item in the live or silent auctions agree by so bidding to pay the amount of his or her bid for said item if determined to be the successful bidder.
9. Persons bidding for silent auction items further agree that if a subsequent bid is disqualified or otherwise stricken for any reason prior to the close of bidding, the last and highest bid on the bid sheet will be deemed the successful bidder.
10. The closing Marshal will make the final determination of the successful bidder of any silent auction item. The auctioneer will be the final judge of the successful bidder for any item sold in the live auction.
