Regents Initiate Annual Giving Appeal For 1983-1984

At the first meeting of the school year on September 15, President John Jackson, Sr., requested that each Regent make a pledge to the Annual Giving Appeal to begin the drive for the Development Program Fund for 1983-84. The Board responded fully with the conviction that people interested in the goals of the Program would find the Appeal a worthy cause for a charitable gift each year.

The Development Program strives to build a twofold bridge — one to the 21st century so that Christian Brothers can continue to serve the educational needs of the families of the Sacramento area and the other to fill the gap between what each student pays for tuition and the actual cost per student to operate the school each year.

Letters are being mailed by the Annual Giving Committee, co-chaired by Charles Sylva and Len Panattoni of the Board of Regents, to alumni, parents of students and of alumni, and to business firms in the Sacramento area requesting

a donation to the Development Program for 1983-84.

This issue of the CONNECTION has a financial report of the Program for 1982-83. It is evident that the response last year fell short from that of previous years. The inability of the Regents to adequately aid the school with the operating deficit in 1982-83 made it necessary to recommend a raise in the tuition for this year.

The Annual Giving Appeal gift may be an unrestricted donation or it may be assigned to a special project or to one of the endowed or memorial scholarships or to the general scholarship program that provides tuition for specified individual students who qualify as needy students.

Annual Giving gifts may be pledged now and paid in installments or later in the school year.

The committee will follow up this year's direct mail appeal with phone contacts in order to increase the number of alumni participating in the program.
