# Annual Giving Appeal Gains Momentum

After six weeks since alumni received letters from John Jackson, Jr., President of the Board of Regents, appealing for their support of the Development Program through an annual donation, 88 responses have been received for a total of \$11,095.

With additional support from parents and non-alumni Regents and members of the Regency Club, the number of donors, as of November 15 when the CONNECTION went to press, was 111, giving \$17,411.

Meanwhile, during the month of November, the Annual Giving Committee, under the co-chairmanship of Charles Sylva and Leonard Panattoni have made further contact with other potential donors and organized, with the help of the Alumni Association, a phone committee of alumni to make further contacts to explain the financial needs of the school and how the Development Program is assisting with these needs so students will not be denied a Catholic high school education at Christian Brothers because of lack of funds to meet tuition costs.

While Christian Brothers High School is not a participating agent of the United Way for the California State Employees' Campaign, it is listed under the non-affiliated agencies which may receive designated funds. If any of our alumni or parents are giving to the United Way through payroll deductions, they may request that their donations be designated for Christian Brothers High School.

Both teams are defending league champions from last year, the soccer team winning the TOC for Northern California two consecutive years in a row.


The final playoff game for the football team will be played after this article goes to press. Vince Delgado won the Metro area rushing title in football with 1,617 yards.
