June 29 is the date for the third annual Golf and Tennis Tourney and Dinner for former men and women students of Bishop Armstrong and Christian Brothers high schools.



Brother Norman noted the many achievements of the school during Brother Richard's first term as chief administrator. The self-evaluation of all departments of the school by administration, faculty and staff with input from students and adult support groups resulted in a full term accreditation of six years by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. As a byproduct of the self-evaluation, the Curriculum Committee has been working on a "Profile of a Christian Brothers" Graduate" as an instrument for each department to use for ongoing evaluations of curriculum offerings and methodologies. Brother Richard has been a very active member of the Curriculum Committee on this project.

The Departments have also worked on better articulation among themselves with regular presentations at faculty meetings of the goals and procedures used in various academic disciplines.

Brother Richard has also worked closely with the Board of Regents in their various capacities of advisory assistance to the administration. In particular, he has responded positively to the Task Force in improving the security on campus and undertaking long range studies as to how Christian Brothers High School can best serve the Catholic secondary educational needs of Sacramento.

The physical plant has received alterations, not only for greater security of personnel and propety, but for greater efficiency of staff. Improvements have been made in the administration wing,

## Regents' Efforts Bring To Reality New Guidance Center

Irv Rios and Norman Montgomery of the Board of Regents have spearheaded a determined effort to satisfy a need for a Guidance/Counseling Center for the school. Mr. Pat O'Brien and his staff have presented the Regents a case statement for having facilities to meet students away from the administration office and to have a room for a Career Center aside from one that is used for classes during the day. Brother Richard also presented the need for more office space with the expansion of computer operations for accounting and registration.

Mr. Montgomery was instrumental in obtaining a building that was available at Re-Ed West Center for children on Fair Oaks Blvd. With this school closing, and the property sold to new owners, he was able to have the building donated by the new owner, Mr. Larry Afzal of Afzal and Devereaux Ventures. The building is estimated to be worth \$125,000.

With the professional architectural assistance of Regent Ron Carissimi, a figure of \$50,000 was established as the cost of moving and installing the building on the campus at Sacramento Blvd. Mr. Rios appealed to the Arata Brothers Trust for funds and received \$29,666.00 for speccific expenses estimated in the project. With donated services of Montgomery Movers and other services, the Regents advised Brother Richard to move ahead on acquiring the building.

It is expected that the new Guidance Center will be located near Ambrose Hall on the North end of the campus and will be ready for use when school resumes in September.

The Arata Brothers Trust have been donors to other projects at CB, through the intermediary of former Regent, Betty Downey. Funds were provided for renovations in the cafeteria, improvements in security and major repairs and upkeep of buildings and grounds. The Trust was set up in the wills of Andrew, Frank and Charles Arata, local grocers.
