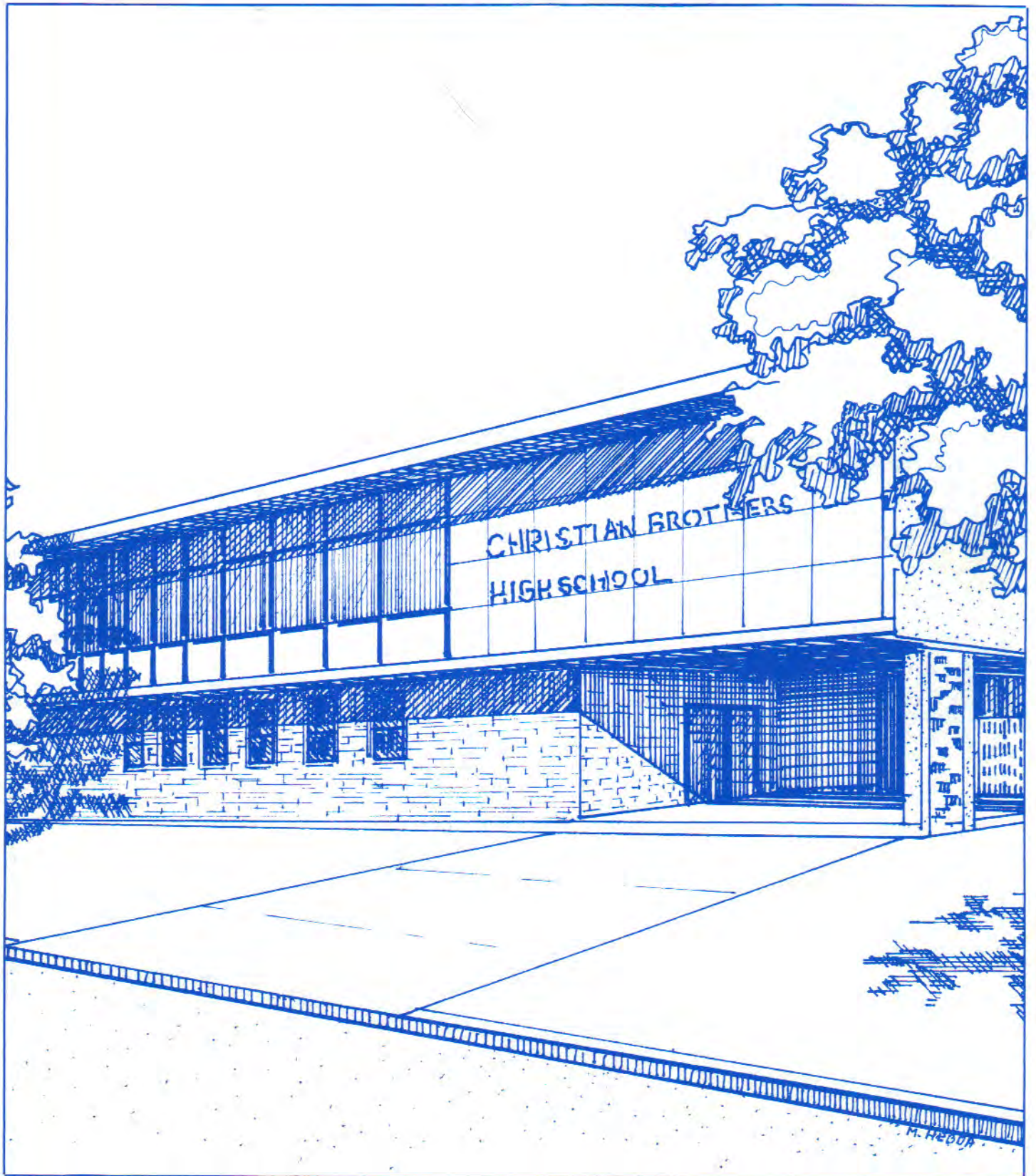

Brother Miguel of Ecuador to be Canonized



Blessed Brother Miguel, FSC

On October 21, 1984, the Christian Brothers throughout the world, including faculty and students of Christian Brothers High School, Sacramento, will be celebrating the recognition of sainthood of one of its members when Pope John Paul II will canonize Brother Miguel Cordero of Equador at ceremonies in Rome.

Brother Miguel was born Francisco Febres Cordero in Cuenca, Equador, of a middle upper class family. He studied at a Brothers' school from the age of 9.

He spent most of his teaching career at Qunito, Ecuador. He was noted as a language scholar and translated and wrote many text books for the schools in Latin America.

The secret of the holiness of his life lies in his words: "nothing can bring greater happiness than doing God's will for the love of God." Despite ill health, opposition from his family when he first expressed his wish to become a Brother and the love of his native country, he was willing to take on assignments that were taxing to his health and that took him away from his family and native land. He charmed his students, edified his confreres and inspired all who came in contact with him.

He died in Spain in 1910. His remains were brought back to Equador in 1936. In 1954 a public monument was erected in Quinto to honor Brother Miguel: "renowned religious teacher, scholar, a great patriot and a true, steadfast man."

He was beautified in 1977 with Brother Mutien Marie of Belgium.

Christian Brothers In Sacramento 108 Years

Christian Brothers High School began its 109th year in Sacramento with the opening of school at a capacity student enrollment.

CB Class of 1984 Continues Traditions of Continuing Education Beyond High School

As has been the tradition with all the classes which graduated from Christian Brothers/Bishop Armstrong High School since World War II, most of the graduates continue their education beyond the secondary school level.

Ninety-six percent of the Class of 1984 has registered for college this Fall, with a majority (51%) choosing to continue their education at local community colleges. Nearly all of those bound for the community colleges, however, are planning on subsequently matriculating in a four year institution.

Twenty-one percent of the class is attending Sacramento State College, 12% enrolled in private colleges, 8% at the University of California and out of state institutions.

The most popular schools, in terms of numbers, are listed in order: Sacramento City College, 40; Sacramento State University, 24; American River College, 18; St. Mary's College, 11; University of California, Davis, 8; Cosumnes River College, 7.

Twenty-three of the graduates are recipients of the California Grant Program which provides tuition up to \$3,500 per year at the college in California they attend.

The only Sacramento winner of the prestigious Youth Opportunity Foundation Scholarship for 1984 is senior Ernest Martinez. The Foundation chooses the best and brightest 200 graduating high school seniors of Hispanic origin for its Exceptional Scholar Award. Ernest plans to major in Biology at the University of California, Davis. (Information for this article furnished by Mr. Patrick O'Brien, Director of Guidance/Counseling.)

Brother Brian's assignment for 1984-85 is helping with the student retreats at Christian Brothers Retreat Center, St. Helena.



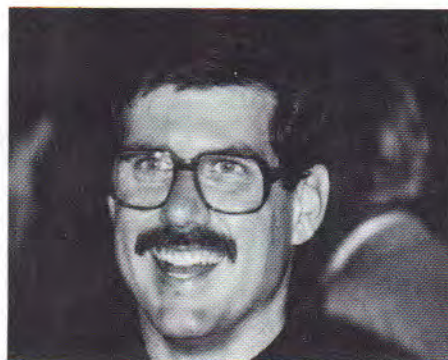

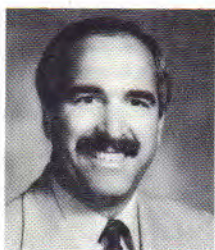

Ron Limeberger and Jim Westlake are Co-Chairmen for these games.

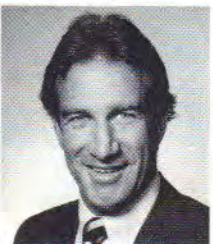
Baseball Bus Trip

A popular event of the last two years has been chartering a couple of busses to welcome alumnus John McNamara as manager of the California Angels in his first game against the Oakland A's.

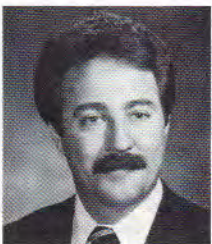

The Board of Regents were established in 1976 when Brother Ronald Rogenback, principal at the time, discussed with a group of men and women who were involved in the public celebration of centenary of the school in Sacramento the financial problems of operating Christian Brothers High School.

As an advisory group to the Principal and his Administrative Board, the Regents assist the school in fund raising through its Development Program to bridge the gap between tuition paid by students and the

Annual Giving Appeal "Bridges The Gap"

The logo that heads the list of Donors for 1983-1984 on page 10 illustrates the two-fold objective of the Development Program of the Board of Regents: 1) bridge the gap to the next century by assuring the continuation of the services of Christian Brothers High School to those families that have been traditionally served by the Brothers and 2) bridge the gap between the tuition fee and the actual cost per student to operate the school. Meeting both objectives is the reason for the Annual Giving Appeal.

To Whom Are We Appealing?

The majority of the annual giving donors have been our **alumni**, but not in large numbers. Due to the generous offer of time on the part of several alumni last year, more alumni were contacted by phone and a greater response was realized. This year plans are being made to involve more alumni in two nights of a phonathon to increase the number of alumni donors.

The Board of Regents and the school

administration have also initiated an appeal to **parents** in a special appeal letter for a "Parent Gift Program," whereby, parents who can afford to do so, are encouraged to close the gap of \$650 — the difference between the tuition fee of \$1,925 and the actual cost per student of \$2,575. Not all parents can close this gap, but those that can make some contribution will be helping those who cannot afford the full tuition fee. Since it has been the tradition of the Christian Brothers that no deserving student be denied the opportunity of attending their school because of a family's inability to pay tuition, tuition grants and scholarships are provided through the Development Program.

Parents of alumni who have appreciated the education received at Christian Brothers are also invited to participate in the Annual Giving Appeal.

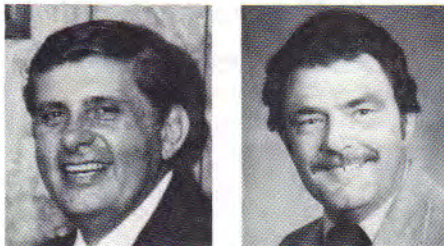

La Salle Club to Hold 41st Annual Frolic, October 21

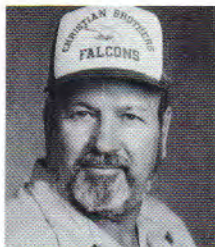
