A. IDENTITY AND HISTORY

More than 100 years ago a young priest in Rhine, France, experienced a series of circumstances that resulted into his founding a group of men which came to be known as Brothers of the Christian Schools, or, in this country, as Christian Brothers. These men were not priests, but religious laymen whose main purpose as a group was the Christian education of young boys who were not able to attend the public

Eventually these men formed themselves into a religious community, with vows that were recognized by the Catholic Church. Their role of life indicated that they were committed to live in community, share their resources, and teach these young boys catechetically.

While the students of the early schools of the Brothers did not pay tuition, the Brothers found patrons and parishes who would subsidize the institutions, although there were occasions when these subsidies were not forthcoming. Today, the students pay a tuition fee, but it does not equal the cost to operate the school and there is still a need for finding subsidies from other sources.
