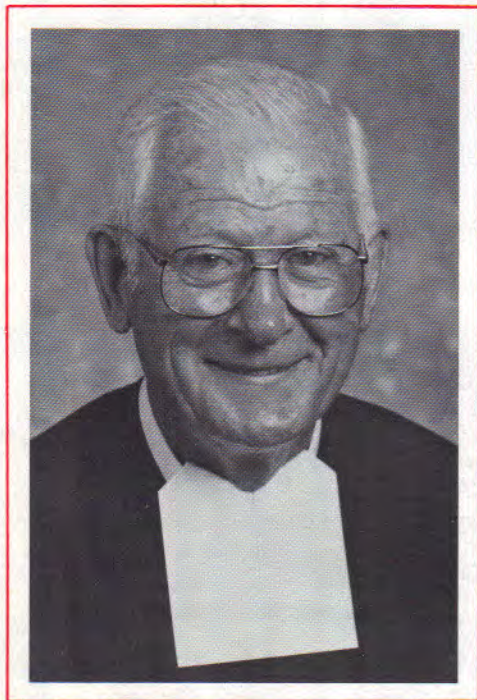

BROTHER EDWARD REMEMBERED

The Christian Brothers community together with former students in the Sacramento, San Francisco, and Los Angeles areas were saddened recently at the announcement of the passing of Brother Edward Welch, FSC, on August 12, 1985. He was 77.

Mass of Christian Burial was offered by former school Chaplain, Fr. Ben DeLeon at All Hallows Church in Sacramento and prayers at the casket were presided over by Bishop Francis Quinn following the mass. Brother Edward was buried on August 19 at Mont LaSalle, Napa.

Brother Edward was born in Winona, Minnesota in 1907 and joined the San Francisco District of The Christian Brothers in 1928. His assignments included teaching at the Brothers' schools in Los Angeles, San Francisco, Berkeley, Napa, Moraga, and Sacramento. During his lifetime he also served as Director of Mont LaSalle High School in Napa, Director of Student Brothers at St. Mary's College, and Vice Principal at Cathedral High School in Los Angeles.

A devoted teacher, Brother Edward spent the last 18 years of his life at Christian Brothers High School.

Memorial gifts in Brother Edward's honor may be made to Christian Brothers High School. May he rest in peace.

Christian Brothers Celebrates Founding

One hundred ten years! A long time, indeed, since an energetic young maiden lady, named Maggie Cunningham saw her fund-raising efforts brought to fruition with the opening of what has, at various times, been known as St. Patrick's Institute, The Sacramento Institute, Christian Brothers College, Christian Brothers School, Bishop Armstrong High School ... and hopefully last ... Christian Brothers High School.

The reasons behind the establishing of a school by the sons of St. John Baptist de La Salle, the Christian Brothers, in Sacramento were basically two: the desire by Catholics to provide a religious education for their children and general dissatisfaction with quality public education as it then existed. Accomplishing this task took a good five years.

Finally the impetus from Father Patrick Scanlan and doorbell ringing and arm twisting by Miss Maggie Cunningham, the great day arrived ... establishing the first High School in Sacramento offering both academic and commercial classes. Officially known as St. Patrick's Institute after the patron saint of Sacramento (then Grass Valley) Diocese, the school was dedicated July 16, 1876 by Archbishop Joseph Alemany. The next day the Brothers began enrolling students and by the following Monday ... July 24th ... 200 students began their first classes.

The school opened its doors in the nation's centennial year at 12th & K Streets on the site that is now the state office building. There were four classrooms with seats for 260 students. All of this required the expenditure of \$24,000, a substantial sum for that day. In just 10 months after its opening, the school conferred its first diplomas ... two, to be exact ... in the Assembly Chamber of the Capitol, just two blocks away, with Governor William Irwin presiding.

During the next two decades the school ... still known as Sacramento Institute ... thrived until, in 1896 and at the urging of Bishop Thomas Grace of Sacramento, it became Christian Brothers College. The term "college" was not inappropriate, for in those days it was possible for a student to spend his years from the first grade through three years of college right there at 12th & K Streets before ... if he wished a degree ... transferring to Saint Mary's College. Thus it was that the concept of the junior college became a reality to the Sacramento area in the hands of the Brothers a good twenty years before Sacramento Junior College as an adjunct of Sacramento High School, began offering post secondary courses.

Brother Cianin, founding director-principal, was succeeded by members of his institution whose names ... Bertram, Sabinian, Genebren and Victor Ambrose ... are now footnotes to history. In 1900 Brother Vellesian came onto the scene only to return years later in the 1920's to preside over the construction of the "new school" at 21st & Y Streets.

The downtown school was falling apart and the commercially valuable property ... still owned by the diocese ... was sold. This put Brother Vellesian, his faculty, and student body in a position that was, at best, somewhat awkward. The property had to be vacated by June of 1923, and it would take a series of miracles to have a new school ready for the start of classes in August. Vellesian, a practical man, preferred to depend on his own resources rather than tax divine providence. The result was a move to the abandoned East Sacramento Public School building at 39th & J Streets, where Sacred Heart Church now stands.

It took seven months to iron out the details of construction. The contract was let on Feb. 4, 1924, ground was broken on Feb. 11th, and the cornerstone laid on May 18th. Students were in their classrooms and Brothers and boarders in their living quarters by Sept. 15th. Brother Vellesian did have his miracle of sorts and on November 5, 1924 the school officially became known as Christian Brothers School.

The thirties saw an athletic program reach an even par with other schools of the area. The gridders, under young Jim Flynn, were able to stun Sac High's purple dragons two years hard-running (at which point Sac High followed the only sensible course and hired Flynn) and Henry "Bud" Hana's basketball and baseball teams played all comers on even terms.

It was during the depression years that the school suffered a premature aging process when maintenance money was just not there. The well loved Brother Patrick kept the boiler together with bailing wire and magic to provide heat for the classrooms. Meanwhile, the Brothers, on too many mornings, were shaving with cold water. Brother Patrick was also responsible for a major curriculum revision that revitalized the academic program of the school.

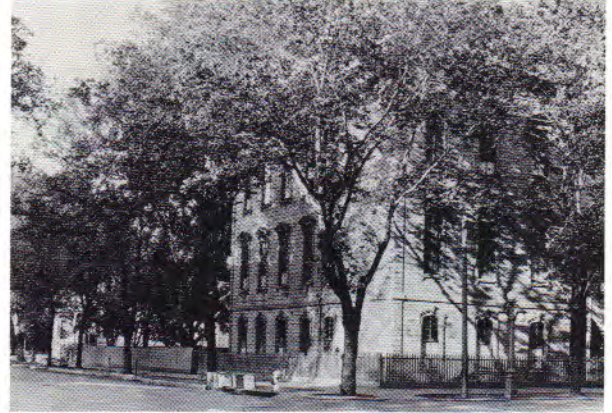
The toll of time was felt simultaneously by Christian Brothers, and the two girls high schools ... St. Joseph & St. Francis ... and thus it was in 1957 Bishop Armstrong High School, a co-institutional experiment in Catholic secondary education was opened, and old Christian Brothers remained as a feeder school, offering freshman and sophomore classes only, and it appeared that never again would a diploma bear the name "Christian Brothers."

Tradition finally was served ... and restored ... in 1964, when two new four year high schools for girls made it, once again, possible for a four-year high school (grammar school classes had been discontinued in 1957) under the Christian Brothers to exist in Sacramento. The culmination was the restoration of the old name, in 1968, with the addition of one word: Christian Brothers High School.

The "old boys" from the Sacramento Institute are gone now and the ranks of those who still call it the "Brothers College" are thinning. But the graduates, young and old, will still agree to a man that what Daniel Webster once said in arguing the famous Dartmouth College case also applies to this alma mater:

"... it is a small school, but there are those who love it ..."

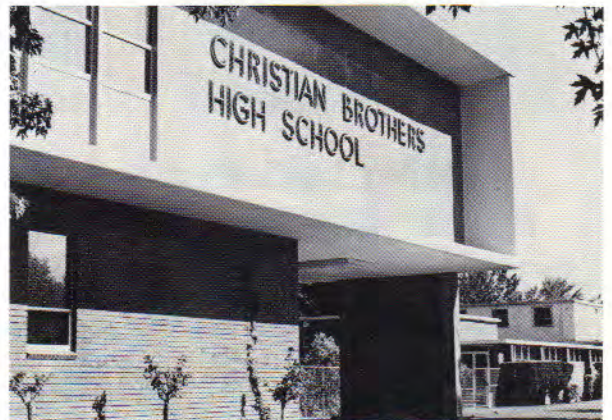
And as we celebrate 110 years of quality educational service in the greater Sacramento area, we begin to build for the future an even stronger Christian Brothers High School.

School on 21st and Broadway

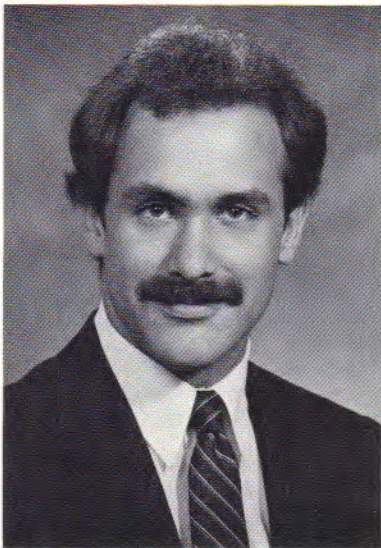


Christian Brothers High School today

Christian Brothers On The Move School Relocation Definite In The Future

Brother Richard Camara, Principal, recently informed the faculty and staff of Christian Brothers that he is firmly committed to a future relocation of the school. The decision to relocate came after 3 years of study by a special task force formed by the school's Board of Regents and after approval was received from Brother Norman Cook, Provincial for the West Coast province of the Christian Brothers. After the decision to relocate was made, a second task force was established to identify, evaluate, and secure a future building site. This group is still working on their assignment. Already the school has received a number of land donation offers in North Natomas and South Sacramento with hope of other offers yet to come. A minimum of 40-50 acres is projected to be needed.

While the relocation still has a number of questions yet to be addressed, the school is moving ahead with plans for a new campus location within the next few years.

Briefly ...

Class of 1985 Onward and Upward

92% of the class of '85 will go on to college, reports Mr. Patrick O'Brien, Director of Guidance and Counseling. Of the 162 graduates, 72 have enrolled in four year colleges this fall.

Twenty-two graduates were accepted in the University of California system and thirty four enrolled in the State University system. Other schools which accepted members of the class of '85 include: Saint Mary's College, University of the Pacific, Stanford, USC, Creighton, Howard, and Tuskegee.

Curriculum Expanded

With the beginning of the 1985-86 school year, Christian Brothers high School embarks on the first phase of its ambitious Master Plan for Cur-

riculum Development. The program is aimed at providing students with more opportunities consistent with recent proposed and mandated changes by the University of California and the State College and University system as well as an enhanced liberal arts education reflective of the Christian Brothers tradition.

Under the new curriculum students will now be able to take four years of English; two years of American and World literature; four years of Social Studies, Foreign Language, Science, and Math; three and one-half years of Religion; two years of Physical Education; and one year of Fine Arts.

"Our work on curriculum development and the resulting program we are instituting is reflective of our strong commitment and desire to provide not only a first-rate liberal arts education but also a comprehensive and demanding college preparatory program," said Brother Richard Camara, F.S.C., Principal. "We realize the ambi-

tious nature of this endeavor and look forward to the challenge that it provides for all members of the Christian Brothers family."

Campus Ministry Program Introduced

A campus ministry program has been introduced at CBS this year and will be directed by Brother Martin La Bastida, F.S.C.

The campus ministry program will be responsible for the coordination of all school liturgies and student religious activities such as retreats, mission donations, and Christian action.

The campus ministry team also includes school chaplain, Father Roy Doner and the following faculty members: Michael Hebda, Brian Hoey, Joseph Lukawski, Jon Kaempfer and Brother Bede Van Duren, F.S.C.

Football. The football season opened on a note of optimism with the quantity and quality of players who turned out for fall practice. Coach Jeff Tidel remained cautiously optimistic about the coming season however, due to the inexperience of his team. Look for Brothers to go through a period of learning and adjustment this season gaining strength as they go. As the pre-league schedule winds down, CB had a strong showing at the Jesuit game with a 35-7 blowout, while losing close ones in the final minutes against El Camino and Pittsburg, 13-10 and 21-17 respectively.
