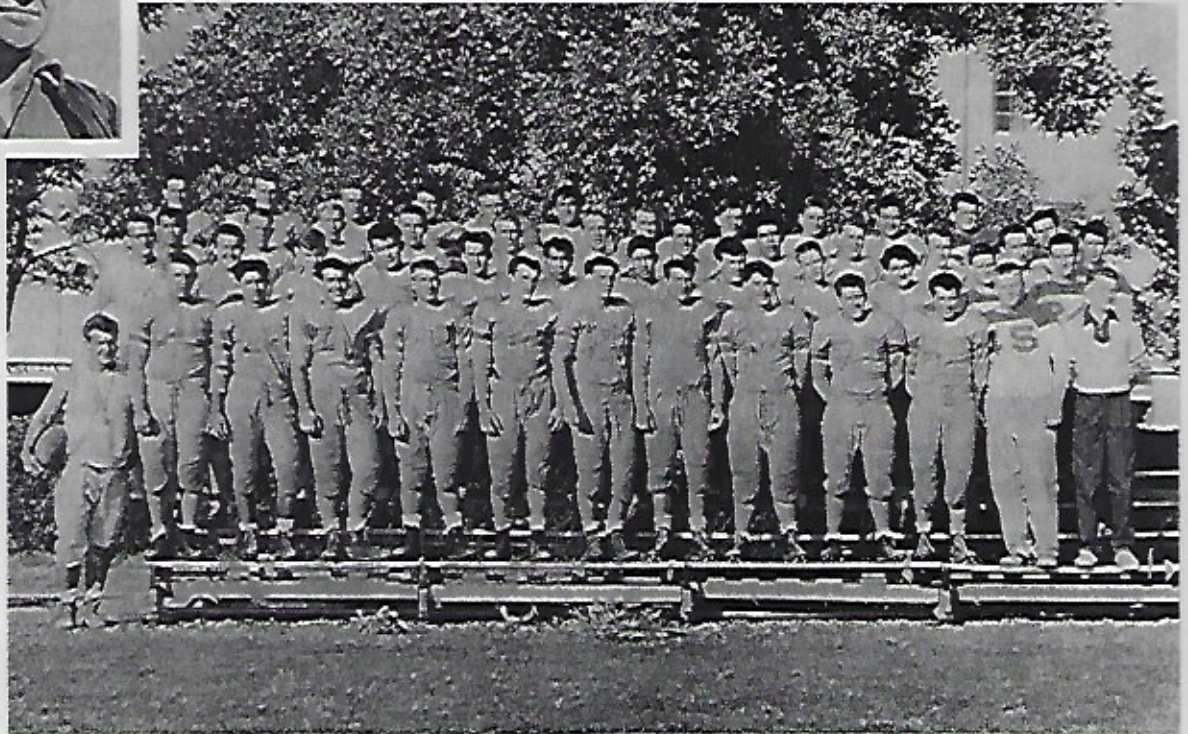


# football . . the varsity made victory a habit
