Lions, Dragons, Pacers Will Start Court Campaign Tonight

Football this year for local prepsters is a thing of the past—well, almost—so naturally the basketball players are ready to back up points.

The youngsters will start dribbling and shooting for keeps on three fronts tonight with the C. K. McClatchy High School Lions going to Auburn, the Sacramento Dragons to San Juan and the Grant Union Pacers to El Camino. The Christian Brothers Gaels will open their campaign next Tuesday by playing host to Roseville.

Chauncey Wilson's Lions and Regis Hurley's Gaels are a long way from being at full strength. That is because several of their players will be banging heads in the grid finale between the schools Thursday at Hughes Stadium.

Depending On Gridders
Wilson is depending plenty on gridders Frank Geremia, Gus Gianullas, Allen Wimberly, John Balaam and Bob Taylor.

"We'll line up tonight with Ray Davis and Ed Lynn at forwards, Jim Johnson at center and Doug Pierce and John Buckley at guards," said Chauncey. "We'll be a pretty fair club once the football players get into shape. It'll take a little while for them to loosen up."

Davis and Lynn are veterans from the 1952-53 quintet with the former being a consistent scorer. There's a good long shot

and Johnson starred for the Bs last season while Buckley is a newcomer.

Call Starters
Hurley names center Dave Higgins, forward Don Terra and guard Mike Eberhard as definite starters for the Gaels.

"They played last year and are looking okeh," commented Regis. "Larry Lynch, Rich Separovich, Al Zuniga and Bob Estacio are up from the B team. "We're expecting George Thomas, Dick Bordisso and Dan Sanchez to join us after football is over. If they work in effectively we should do all right."

The Brothers do not have much height. Higgins, at six feet two inches, is their tallest player.

Few Dragon Veterans
At SHS, F. J. (Pop) Brorsen is starting virtually from scratch.

The only veterans are Ken Finch and Bob Kelly, who showed good size and considerable inexperience last year.

"Of course, Roosevelt Beatty, Ben Crocco and Gary Buckman of the football squad just started to practice," said Pop. "I don't know yet how much they'll help."

"Against San Juan we'll start with Finch, Kelly, Lloyd Olsen, Dick Hogge and Lew Cobb."

The Dragons rated as a top outfit in the Sac-Joquin Conference last year until midterm graduations took away Jim Peenstra, Jim Lyon and Harvey Fong. Nevertheless, they stayed in title contention and finished in a second place tie with Grant.

Tentative Pacer Starters
Ernie Marks, coach of the Pacers, lists center Fred Scott, guards Jack Henry and Walter Torrence and guards Jim Doris and Dale Hobbs or Travis Montue as his tentative starters.

Scott rates as a fine prospect and Marks is expected to work many offensive patterns around him. Torrence and Henry played for the class B conference champions in 1952-53.

"Montue looked good with the Bs two years ago but didn't play last season," remarked Ernie. "We don't figure to be as strong as we were a year ago when we took second in the conference and won the Gridley invitational tournament."

Marks named John Masters, Jerry Corker and Dick Schlenker as his first line of substitutes.

Roseville Preps Down CBS Cage Quintet 44-41

The Roseville High School Tigers got off to a good start last night and led all the way while defeating the Christian Brothers Gaels 44 to 41 in the latter's basketball opener on their home court.

Six Sacramento area schools which may someday form their own new conference, will parade their basketball talents at Community Pavilion tonight in a triple-decker cage show for the March of Dimes.

Everyone connected with the hoop show is donating his services and thus contributing to the fight against the great triple-decker, polio.

This includes the ticket sellers and takers, Northern California Officials Association referees, custodians, scorekeepers, managers, etc.

THE PREP show is replacing the one which ended last year when the officials, teachers and sportswriters finally agreed the court game was for the younger bodies.

Schools participating in the program are Sacramento High, McClellan, Grant Union, Christian Brothers, El Camino and San Juan.

El Camino and San Juan compete in the Sierra Football League now but Camino will enter the Sac-Joaquin Conference to start the next football season. Others, with the exception of independent Christian Brothers, are, of course, in the Sac-Joaquin Conference.

THIS WILL mark the second pavilion appearance of Grant Union's undefeated team. The Pacers were impressive in their showing as they walked off with the first Sac-Joaquin Conference Tournament, beating Sacramento High in the final game.

The Pacers drew Christian Brothers for their opponent tonight and the two teams will start the show at 7:15 P. M. The Brothers, while winning only one game in four starts, are nevertheless a threat to the Pacific Mark's Pacers. The Gaels are always tough against intraleague foes and in addition (ES) Coach Regis Hurley gives his team a fighting chance against any opponent tonight.

ES has beaten only Yuba City but lost by only three points twice to Roseville. McClellan only beat Roseville by a point the first time the teams played.

"WE JUST haven't been able to hit the bucket," Hurley said yesterday. "We've been getting good shots, too. But I think the kids are starting to loosen up now and it shouldn't be long before we start winning our way."

The Gaels-Pacer clash should be one of the best of the evening and will get the Dimes show off to a good start.

At 8:15 P. M. McClellan meets San Juan, coached by former Sacramento State cager Irv Wall. It will be the first meeting of the teams this season.

SHS Wins Fourth Straight As Gaels Suffer 50-36 Loss

The Sacramento High School Dragons led virtually all the way in racking up their fourth straight basketball triumph with a 50 to 36 verdict over the Christian Brothers Gaels in the community pavilion.

Although they never saw the lead after the first quarter last night, the boys from Twenty

First and Broadway were within striking distance at 36 to 43 with 1:48 remaining. Then the roof caved in as Lew Cobb made two free throws and Roosevelt Beatty, previously scoreless, bagged a layup and three points from the foul line.

Sacramento used a zone defense and, except for Dave Higgins' lefthanded hooks, the Brothers depended primarily on casts from far out. They had little luck and the taller Dragons, especially Bob Kelly and Ken Finch, had the board advantage.

Tight Going

The score was tied thrice in the early going. A free toss by Finch and Dick Hogge's 15 footer gave the Dragons a 10 to 7 edge at the quarter and they stayed ahead.

CBS closed the count to 11 to 13 on Higgins' hook but the home club countered with seven points in a row to go in front 24 to 15 at halftime.

After George Thomas and Higgins narrowed the margin to five points in the third period, Benny Crocco and Hogge hit from 15 feet out and Finch, Kelly and Hogge added a free throw each for 31 to 19. It was 35 to 25 entering the final quarter.

Free Tosses Count

Dan Sanchez shaved the difference to 29 to 35 with a setup and a 25 footer. Thereafter, however, the Gaels failed to toss in a field goal. Sacramento made only two shots from the floor but pulled away with 11 free throws.

Hogge's 17 points were high. Kelly and Higgins had 12 each while ballhawking Crocco contributed 10.

In the B game the Dragons rallied for a 35 to 31 victory after trailing 12 to 14 at the half and 17 to 22 at the end of the third period. A 20 footer by Ken Fong in the last minute broke a 31 all deadlock.

Al Taylor netted 17 points for Sacramento. Al Zuniga of the Galets tallied 12.
