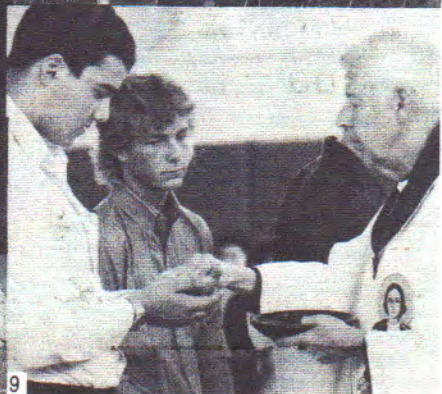

## Relocation of School Study Moves Forward with Task Force II

In May Brother Richard Camara, F.S.C., Principal, Brother Bertram Coleman, F.S.C., along with Task Force members Messrs. Charles Sylva, Leonard Panattoni and Ron Carissimi made a formal presentation to Brother Norman Cook, F.S.C., Provincial of the Christian Brothers and his Council at Saint Mary's College on the progress of the Task Force studying the feasibility to relocate the school.

The report reflected the continued commitment of the Task Force to this major project and the need for further guidelines as new phases of the study develop.

The Council commended the outstanding progress of the Task Force and appointed a special committee of the Council to work with the Task Force to set up necessary criteria for acceptance of possible gifts of property and for the selection of a definite site for the future location of the school.

## Co-Ed Summer School Begins June 17

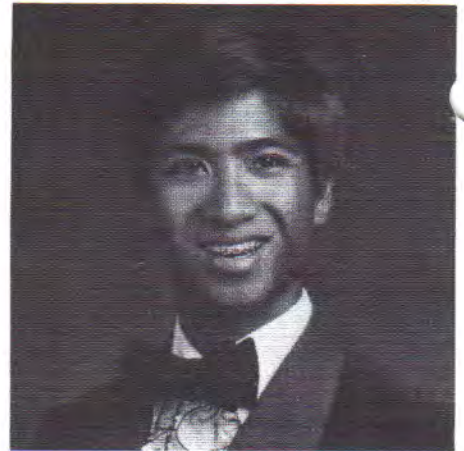

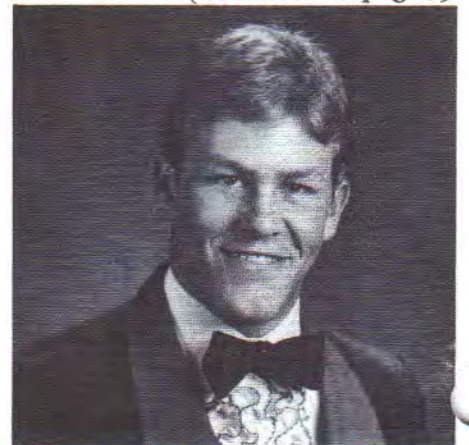
The Salutatorian was Brent Kranig and the Validictorian was Donovan Somera. Somera was student body president in his senior year; Kranig was an outstanding wrestler, qualifying for the National Wrestling Championships to be held in July in Iowa.

Following the Baccalaureate Mass on May 31, awards were presented to the graduates. The General Excellence award for academics was presented to Donovan Somera. For outstanding service, John Graham was given the Brother Ambrose Service Award. The De La Salle Medal for Religion was earned by Pat Dolinar.

Mr. Pat O'Brien, Guidance Director, surveyed the seniors for continued education plans. Ninety percent of the class intend to enter college; 78% of the seniors plan to finish in a 4-year college or university.

Mr. O'Brien also announced the winners of outstanding scholarships among the graduates. Donovan Somera received a \$1,000 L.G. Balfour Foundation National Honor Society scholarship, competing against

Robert Benefiel, a student of St. Charles Borromeo School, Sacramento, was the winner of a four-year tuition scholarship at Christian Brothers High School. Robert is the son of Robert Benefiel '67.

The Merit Scholarship program, established by the Board of Regents, honors students who give evidence at entrance of outstanding academic potential. Winners qualified as finalists by test scores, grades and recommendations. Round-table discussions with teachers and student leaders determined the winners.

Half-tuition scholarships will go to David Rose, also of St. Charles, and Peter Salzman of Sam Brannon Middle School. Runners up were awarded Honors at Entrance and include Jason McKenna of Sutter Middle School, Gregory Onishi of Our Savior Lutheran and Brian Ramil of St. Anne's.

Scholarship winners must maintain a 3.3 grade point average each semester. A recent survey has shown that past finalists are averaging 3.7.

In addition to these scholarships, the school sets aside more than \$75,000 to assist needy students with tuition aid.

Somera is one of 450 winners announced by the National Association of Secondary School Principals. Each high school NHS chapter could nominate two seniors based on their leadership, scholastic achievement, character and service. While at Christian Brothers, Donovan has been student body president, French Club president, member of the National Honor Society and California Scholarship Federation, yell leader, tennis team letterman, Merit Scholarship winner at entrance to CB and maintained the scholarship throughout his four years. His classmates voted him Valedictorian of the class. He plans to enter Stanford in the Fall.

Michael Marquez was awarded a Regents' and Chancellor's Scholarship at the University of California, Berkeley. The scholarship is given in recognition of academic excellence and potential and awarded to only the 200 top incoming students. Michael has also received a scholarship to attend Stanford and has decided to continue his education there.

Thomas Borge was selected as a finalist in the John D. Issacs Memorial Scholarship Contest, a competition based on science projects displayed at the California State Science Fair. As a finalist, Borge was flown to Los Angeles on May 23 to display and explain his project which deals with El Nino's effect on American River Salmon. El Nino is a warming phenomenon which has affected all life on the Pacific Coast.

At Christian Brothers Tom was able to take six years of science including Biology, Ecology, Chemistry, Human Physiology and Advanced Biology. He plans to specialize in Environmental Biology beginning at Sacramento City College next year.

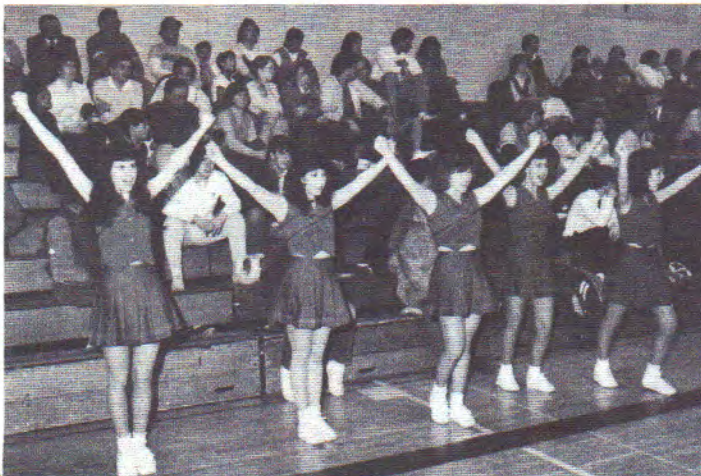

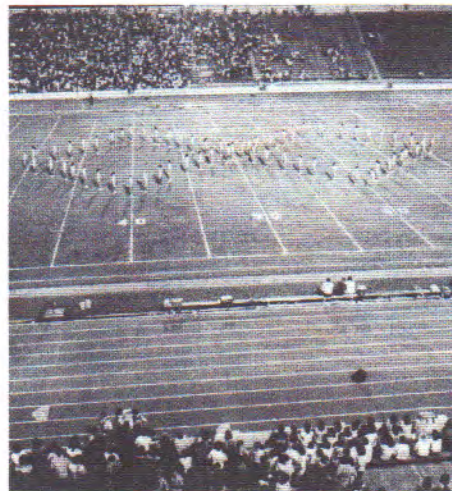

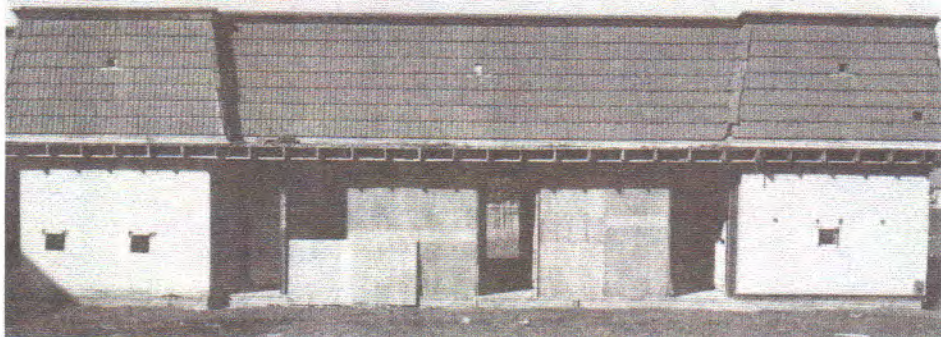
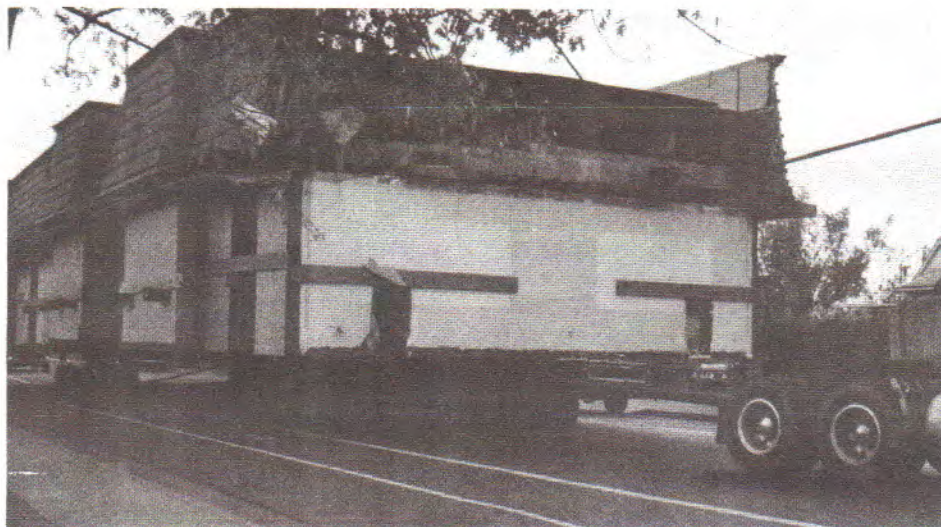
## New Counseling and Guidance Center to Open in Fall
