The visiting lightweights tipped the local B five in the preliminary, 35 to 23.

A former star at the Grant Technical College and the Sacramento State College, Hurley is making his start in the coaching field with the Brothers.

Sal Vasquez led the Gaels in the scoring column with seven field goals and three free throws for 17 tallies. Joe Simoni of the losers netted 14 counters.

Jack Colbert of the Brothers drew praise for his work in controlling the backboards. Colbert is a forward and also does duty at center.

Ralf Lara was the sharpshooter for the winning B cagers as he poured 18 points through the hoop.

# CBS Gaels Blow Lead, Lose To Lodi Cage Team

The Christian Brothers Gaels blew an eight point lead late in the second half as Lodi High School's Flames came on to take a 45 to 42 basketball decision last night on the losers' court.

Not until the clock showed five minutes remaining did the visitors, rated as tops in the Sac-Joaquin Conference, find themselves on the pleasant side of the score. That came on Ken Flaig's tipin for 38 to 37, after which the big pivot man netted a layup to keep Lodi in front during the closing and exciting minutes.

The Brothers narrowed the gap to 41 to 42 on Will Towne's layup off a fast break, their only field goal in the fourth quarter. Dean Robinson, who turned in a strong floor game for the Flames, sneaked under the bucket for the two points which iced matters.

## Lead At Quarter

CBS, losers by a lopsided count in Lodi a month ago, tallied first on Sal Vasquez's 20 footer. Twice the Flames knotted the count, at 5 all and 11 all, but Towne, accepting Jack Colbert's feed, moved the Brothers ahead, 13 to 11, at the quarter.

In the next stanza, with Vasquez hitting three straight from 20 feet out, the locals stretched their advantage to 26 to 18, Flaig and Robinson, however, reduced it to 27 to 22 at halftime.

With Bill Ross effective on hook shots the Brothers went ahead, 36 to 28, two minutes before the start of the final period. Suddenly they hit a cold streak while the Flames showed plenty of heat in racking up eight points in a row for 36 all.

During the rally Jerry Smith connected on a 15 footer, Robinson and Flaig on a pair of gift tosses each and Flaig on a follow shot. Ron Limeberger made it 37 to 36 for the Gaels, then Flaig hit twice to turn the tide.

## Three Players Foul Out

Robinson and Vasquez fouled out in the last minute. Ross left the game midway the fourth quarter. Vasquez, city's leading prep scorer, netted four buckets in the first half, drew his fourth violation shot before the intermission and did not mark the column thereafter.

Flaig, netting seven field goals on tips, had 20 points. Robinson added 16, half of it from the foul line. Towne CBS with 12.

The Lodi lightweights topped the Gaels, 46 to 34, after a 22 to 17 edge at the Norman Fletcher made 19 the victors, George Thomas for the losers.

There were plenty of scores in the stands. Taking notes were Coaches Gus Mota and Ernie Marks of Grant Union, Art Ryman of Woodland and Gilhain of Folsom.

# Grant Withstands Gael Rally For 38-27 Victory

Thirteen straight points in the early going gave the Grant Union High School Pacers enough cushion last night to withstand a fourth quarter rally by the Christian Brothers Gaels and leave the CBS gym with a 38 to 27 basketball triumph.

Coach Gus Mota's charges from Del Paso Heights were really on the beam in the first half. During those 16 minutes they meshed 10 out of 21 field goal attempts, a phenomenal average.

They started their hot streak after Will Towne's follow up had put the Gaels ahead, 4 to 2.

## Pacers Go Ahead

Fred Scott, a freshman with the poise of a senior, tied matters, with two tosses from the foul line. Then Ed Aguirre, a south-paw sharpshooter, hit from 20 and 10 feet out and Jerry Mathews added a pair of 15 footers. Carl Rolfe's free throw made it 13 to 4 at the quarter.

Scott nailed a tipin to start the second period. Thereafter the clubs exchanged buckets fairly evenly, with CBS trailing at the half, 12 to 24.

Grant stretched its advantage by a single tally in the third stanza and entered the last eight minutes on the pleasant end of a 32 to 19 reading. Don Donsing's gift toss made the gap larger by one, then Coach Regis Hurley's quintet caught fire.

Tony Latino accepted Sal Vasquez's perfect feed for a layup, Towne netted two free throws and Latino and Vasquez found the range from 20 feet out for 27 to 33 with three minutes remaining.

Frank Childers, however, caught the Gaels napping and broke clear for a layup. Aguirre's short set shot and Masters' one pointer insured the triumph.

## Game Is Rough

It was a rough game, especially in the latter stages. Five personal fouls were called in the first half, with the final total finding 11 against CBS and seven against Grant.

The outcome snapped a three game Gael winning streak and accounted for the Motamen's fifth consecutive victory.

Masters had 11 points for scoring honors, while Towne and Aguirre trailed with nine each.

## Grant Bs Win

In the B game the undefeated Grant five trounced the winless Gaels, 46 to 33, with Jack Huckabay's nine points showing the way. Don Terra of the losers tallied 14.

## Feenstra Top Scorer

Feenstra led the point makers with 11 and did a fine job of covering Sal Vasquez, the city's top prep scorer. Vasquez made only one field goal. Ross contributed 10 and Towne nine to the CBS total.

The Gaels lost Ross because of an injury to an ankle and Vasquez on five personals in the late going.

## B Team Wins Handily

Sacramento's B team had an easy time toppling the Gaels, 46 to 22, with Frank Stewart's 14 points paving the way.

About 1,200 filled the main floor bleachers. Seating arrangements in the balcony have not been completed.

The Dragons are slated to go to Fairfield tonight for class A and B engagements against the Armijo Indians.

# Dragons Make Nine In Row By Defeating Gaels

The Sacramento High School Dragons weaved the Christian Brothers Gaels into a knot last night and emerged with their ninth straight basketball triumph, 35 to 26, in the new community pavilion's baptism of fire.

Coach F. J. (Pop) Brorsen's unbeaten charges used a weaving offense almost exclusively and that, along with their 16 for 30 from the foul line, told the tale.

CBS, like Sacramento, netted 10 field goals but missed 10 of 16 free pitches. Referees Roy Tamm and Val DeFlores tooted 37 violations, two dozen against the losers.

## One Point Lead At Half

It was quite a game in the first half, at the end of which the Dragons led, 15 to 17. In the third period, however, Coach Regis Hurley's quintet turned colder than the night air, passed erratically and failed to register a two pointer in 10 tries. The Gaels also missed four free throws before Jack Colbert broke the ice with 30 seconds left in the quarter.

Meanwhile, SHS was enjoying its finest moments. Tipins by Harvey Fong and Jim Feenstra, Brook Lowe's jump shot, Jerry McCrum's follow and Feenstra's gift toss stretched the margin to 27 to 17 before Colbert's connection. Lowe's free throw made it 28 to 18 starting the final stanza.

The Brothers, with Colbert driving in for a layup and Bill Ross hitting twice and Ron Limeberry once from the foul line, closed the gap to 23 to 29 with five minutes remaining. One minute later the scoreboard read 31 to 25 as Will Towne's bucket matched two charity throws by Fong. CBS got no closer.

## Strong Rebounding

The first stanza featured strong rebounding by the Dragons, who excelled in that department, and the inability of the Gaels to locate the hoop. Hurley fretted while his cagers slugged 11 successive field goal attempts and trailed at the quarter, 10 to 5.

Sacramento fell into a tie twice, at 11 all and 13 all, in the second period and dropped behind, 14 to 15, when Towne hit from the corner. Free throws by Feenstra and John Parkinson, plus Feenstra's hook shot, regained their lead, 18 to 15, then Towne cut the margin to a single tally with a tipin a few seconds before the half.
