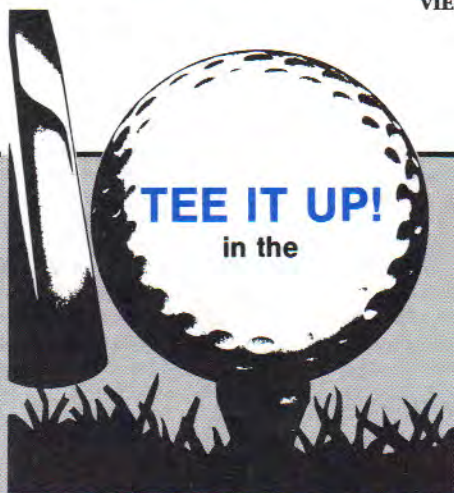
I received a note from a friend in Fresno who did not graduate from Armstrong but her son is attending Christian Brothers and she reads the *CONNECTION*.

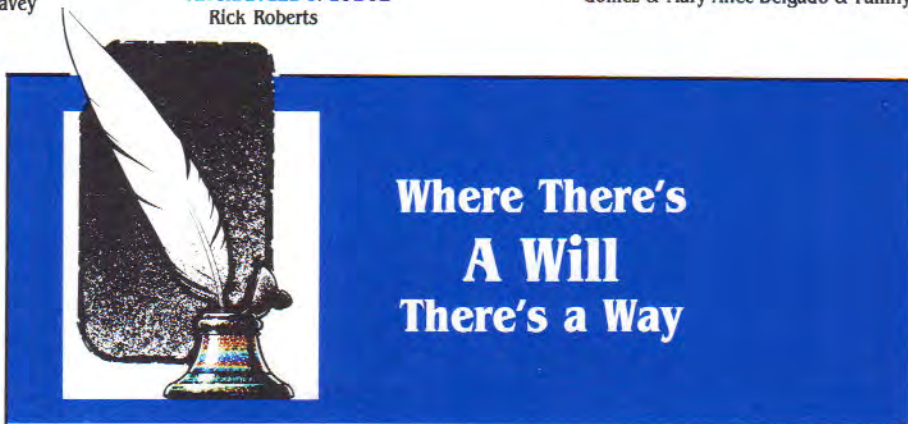

CB DIALING FOR DONORS BRINGS SUCCESS



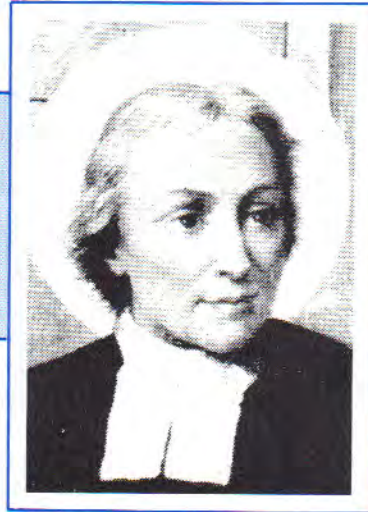
