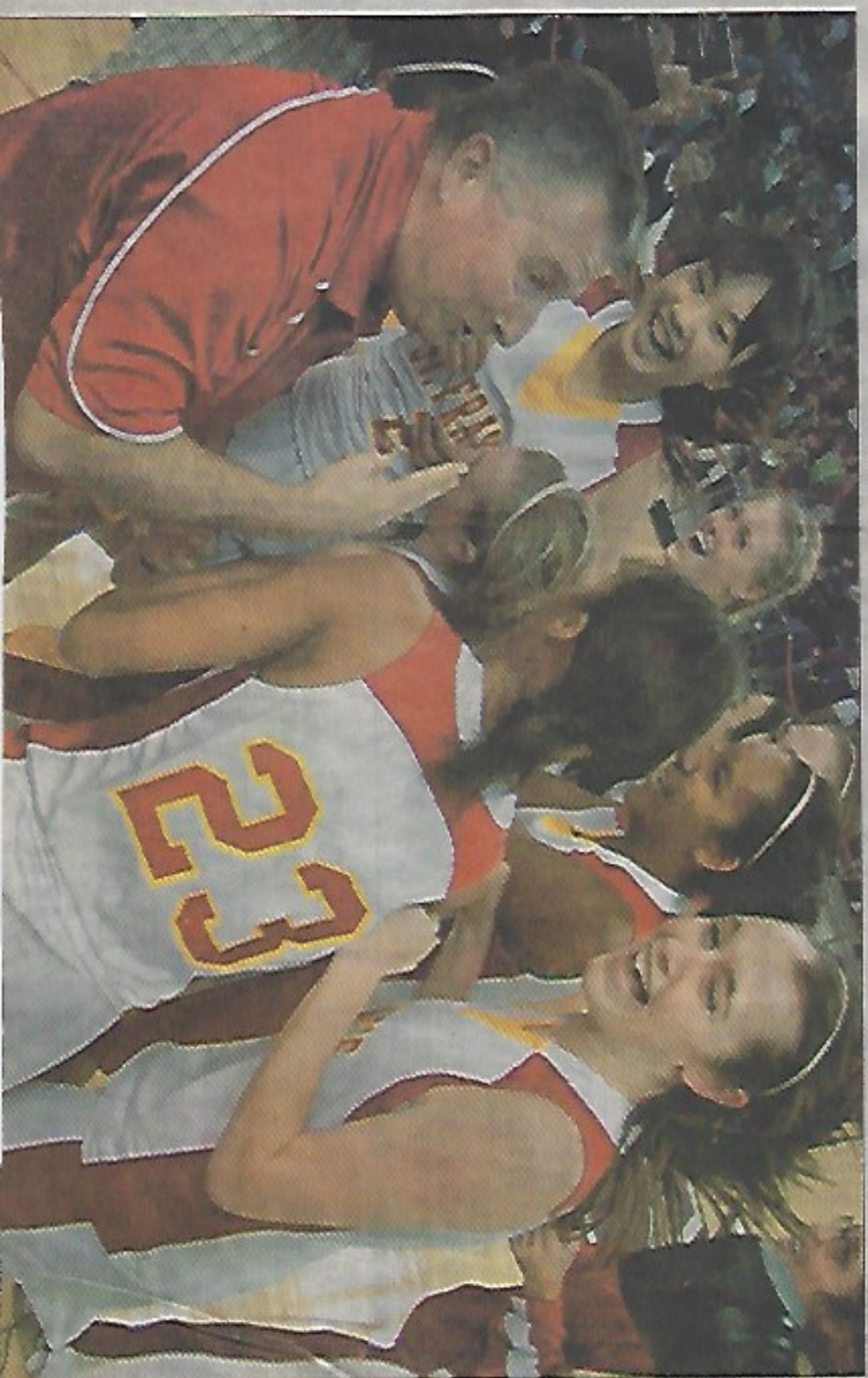

Turning point: Senior forward-Brittany Woodard made two free throws with 8.9 seconds left to secure the Falcons' win. Katie Hoekman, a sophomore center called up from the junior varsity for the playoffs, had given the Falcons a 58-55 lead on a 10-foot baseline jumper with 1:22 remaining. Hoekman, who had nine points on 4-for-4 shooting, then blocked a potential go-ahead attempt by the Crusaders' Brandi Henton with 9.2 seconds to play.

Highlights: Get the rebound, make the outlet pass and run the floor. That's the formula the top-seeded Falcons (27-4) used against Modesto Christian (27-4), which won section titles in D-V in 2006 and '07. The Falcons opened the third quarter with a 10-2 run to build a 47-31 advantage with 3:43 left in the period. They needed every bit of it — plus Woodard's late free throws — to stave off the No. 3 Crusaders. "I kept my composure and didn't think (about the fact) that I was shooting them in Arco Arena," Woodard said.

Key performers: The Nevada-bound Woodard had 18 points and 11 rebounds. Amara Wainwright, who went 4 for 5 on three-pointers, scored 14 points for the Falcons, who won their first section championship. Jessica Graham had 15 points and eight rebounds for the Crusaders.

What's next: Christian Brothers hosts a Northern California Regional playoff game Tuesday. The Crusaders play on the road.
