CAREER DAY SET FOR APRIL 8

Christian Brothers graduates from various professional fields will return to campus once again when the Alumni Association sponsors the eighth annual "Career Day" program on Wednesday, April 8.

"Career Day," which is planned in cooperation with the school's Career-Guidance Center, provides the student body with an opportunity to learn more about future careers from professionals representing more than 75 fields. The day's format is designed so that students can attend three different 45-minute sessions during which speakers

not only make presentations about their occupations but also entertain questions and provide answers as well.

Alumni Association Vice President Rick Cabral, '70, is coordinating this year's event and is currently in the process of recruiting speakers for the various career opportunities. Cabral is hopeful that he can fill all the speaking spots with CBS graduates. Cabral is being assisted on campus by

Tim Loree of the school's counseling department. In order to assist in planning purposes, Loree recently surveyed the student body to ascertain their preferences for presentations.

Since its inception, "Career Day" has proven to be a highlight of the school year with students receiving practical and current information and alumni having the chance to interact with and become part of the students' education. The school administration regards the program as an integral part of its advising process prior to registration in June for the succeeding school year.

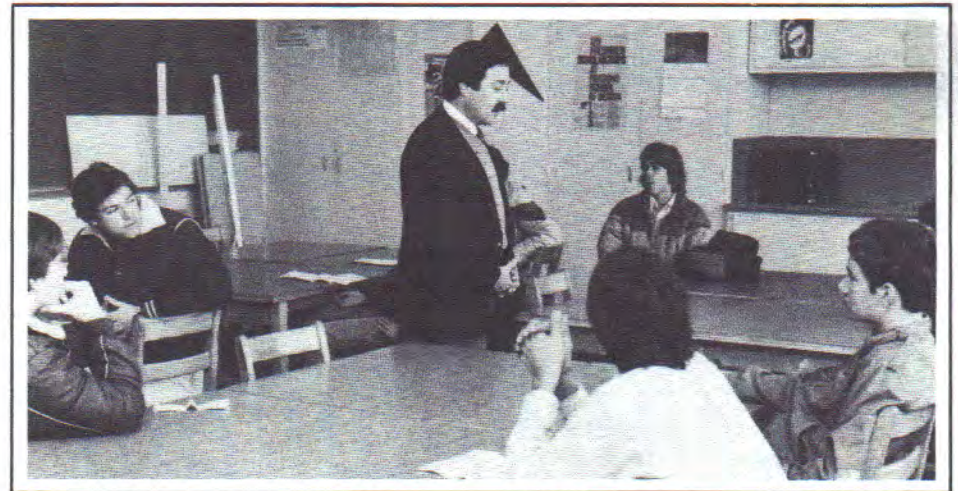
"Campaign for Excellence" Underway

The Annual Alumni Appeal for 1986-87 kicked off in late December with Brother Richard Camara, F.S.C., Principal, calling on all alumni to meet a goal of \$150,000 in order to erase the school's deficit.

"Campaign for Excellence" has been selected as the slogan for this year's Appeal, highlighting the school's 111-year tradition of providing quality Catholic education for young men of various racial, religious, and economic backgrounds.

"I believe we have the finest, most comprehensive educational program in the Sacramento area," said Brother Richard. "In order to preserve this commitment to excellence, I am asking all alumni to invest in the Family that others invested in when they were students here at Brothers."

This year's tuition is \$2400, some \$964 less than the actual cost to educate each student. Through parents, support groups, and subsidiaries, the school is able to reduce the considera-

ble deficit, which this year is a projected \$40,000.

The intent of "Campaign for Excellence" is to insure the superb quality of a CBS education. Currently, some 95 percent of each graduating class attends college upon leaving CBS. In order to maintain that level of excellence, an innovative and creative teaching staff must be retained in addition to attracting students that can benefit from the liberal arts education the Brothers offer.

"We believe that a \$150,000 goal must be realized by our alumni," said Brother Richard. "This will not only erase this year's deficit but point us toward the future as well."

The annual Appeal will culminate with the phone-a-thon February 23-26 and March 2-3. Those alumni who do not respond by mail will be contacted by student callers in an effort to secure their support for "Campaign for Excellence."

FOOTBALL '86: The Tradition Continues

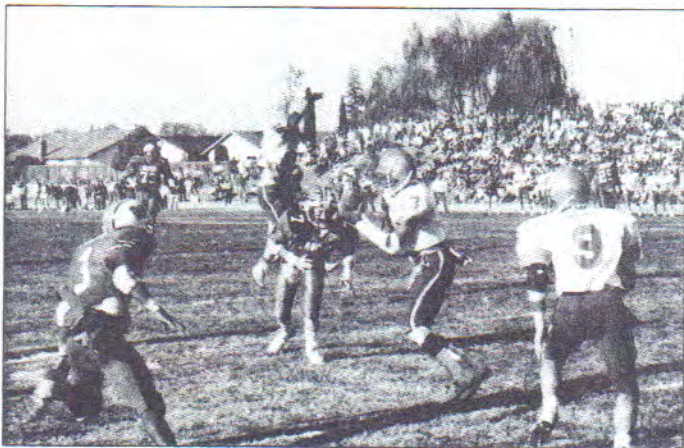
In retrospect, Dan Hawkins, Christian Brothers High School's rookie head football coach, had it pegged from the outset.

"I told my wife when I first met these guys that I thought they had the potential to win the section and that they had the potential to be mediocre," said Hawkins.

Hawkins' Falcons lived up to both of his inclinations about them. Stumbling to an 0-2 start, including a 13-10 defeat administered by Jesuit, the Falcons looked like anything but section title contenders. By the time the 14th game rolled around on December 12 however, the Falcons could look back on the carnage they had wrought. Behind them lay a string of 10 victories in 11 games, including a convincing 20-7 win the previous week over Cordova that had broken the Lancers' 25-game win streak and given CBS the unofficial City Championship title. In front of them remained one confrontation: a date with Vintage High School of Napa in the Sac-Joaquin Section Championship game, CBS' third such berth in five years.

On a bitterly cold night in Napa, the Falcons' suffered a 14-0 loss to the Crushers but it did nothing to diminish the accomplishments of Hawkins or the Falcons. Though they had failed in their efforts to match the achievements of Craig Rundle's 1981 team and Jeff Tisdell's 1983 club, both of which claimed the Section pennant, the Falcons had carved their own niche in the hallowed history of Christian Brothers football. It was a season to remember, a tradition not only continued but heightened as well.

"I'm not surprised we did that well," said Hawkins. "At Christian Brothers, you can win the Section in any given year. The support of the school, the staff, the coaching staff, the students, and the parents is phenomenal. Not a lot of coaches get support like you get here. Not just in terms of winning but all things — counseling, the administration helping out, teachers working with the students, everything. With that kind of support, you can't help but be successful."

And most important to this success were the players themselves. "The personal development of these guys was 'the' most rewarding thing about this year," Hawkins said. "There was more growth individually and cumulatively than I have ever seen. The development and progression of the players attitudes and personalities was what I enjoyed most.

"Initially, I saw a group of guys that were multi-faceted, certainly not similar. There was a real potpourri — guys with athletic ability, over-achievers, guys that were shy, everything. But they also shared a number of things in common. Their desire to play football, their strong ties to CBS. They really feel proud of being a part of the tradition of this school. It is a common thread."

For some coaches, the tradition and the common threads might have been a bit overwhelming, especially after the Falcons inauspicious beginning. Certainly, the school's decision to hire Hawkins, who was 25 years old when he was named coach last May, raised a few eyebrows. But following in the recent legacy of Rundle and Tisdell only strengthened Hawkins' resolve.

"I never felt any pressure from outside sources," said Hawkins. "The pressure came from within myself. I think the pressure is all in how you view

yourself. I knew I could do this. I have enough confidence in my abilities that even when we were 0-2 I thought we could do well.

"I wouldn't have put in for the job if I didn't feel I could set the world on fire. I feel I can accomplish things I want to do. To me, we did what we were supposed to do. With the kind of atmosphere and support that's around Christian Brothers, we couldn't help but be successful. I would have felt like I hadn't done my job otherwise. But hey, this is it!"

Having lived through his "pressure," Hawkins has set his sights on next season. The Falcons return a number of top-flight players including Matt Haag, John Regino, Mark Peterson, Cary Newton, Les Thomas, and "All-World" wide receiver Mike Delmugnaio. Coupled with a talented group of upcoming players from the sophomore team that swept to the Metropolitan League title, the Falcons chances look bright.

"It wouldn't surprise me if we start slow. I think everyone will be pleasantly surprised with the way the passing game comes along. We'll be alright."

In the meantime Hawkins plans to make sure that his players are alright academically.

"I felt bad about those kids who lost their eligibility at the quarter due to grades. I felt I didn't do enough for them. We're going to be running study halls after school now. I'm telling the kids, 'If you don't come in, don't play.'"

Most likely they'll be in. As Hawkins said, "I really felt the kids had fun this year. That's what a lot of them told me. I feel like the kids that made it this season will have something that will live with them for a long time. By combining a number of different personalities and experiences, I feel we were able to bring some lessons to these kids."

No doubt if the first set of lessons is any indication, the Hawkins era of the CBS tradition should really be something special.

"COMMITMENT TO EXCELLENCE" GROWS

Driven by their desire to continue to enhance Christian Brothers High School's 111-year tradition of providing "the finest, most comprehensive, educational program in the Sacramento area," the administration and faculty have taken steps to expand and diversify the Master Plan for Curriculum Development that was implemented in September, 1985.

Recognizing that approximately 95 percent of each graduating class attend college upon graduation, the school's Curriculum Committee began an exhaustive study in late 1983 in order to assess the curriculum's ability to meet proposed changes in entrance requirements at the University of California and the State College and University. The result was an increase from a six to seven period day, a 240 to 280 credit requirement to graduate, institution of subject area requirements in Foreign Language, Fine Arts, and Literature, and continued requirements in Mathematics, Science, English, Social Studies, Religion, and Physical Education. In addition, the school began remedial programs in Reading, Mathematics, and English in recognition of the commitment to lower ability students as well. Thus the Brothers' tradition of providing quality education for students of wide-ranging abilities and backgrounds was maintained.

Not content with an encompassing liberal arts education for all of its students, Christian Brothers went about upgrading its facilities as well. Most notable in this area was an entirely new AT&T system for the student computer center and a new Counseling and Guidance facility, Edward Hall.

Having launched the Master Plan, the Curriculum Committee and the faculty have used 1985 to the present to take the steps to fine-tune the curriculum. Among these steps are a mathematics testing system administered in conjunction with the University of California that enables the department to not only place students more effectively but to adjust its program to meet the needs of individual students. Also, a diagnostic test compatible with the Placement Examination has been added to measure student improvement in reading, English, and mathematics. Last spring, the current juniors were given the exam and showed an average improvement of 3.2 grade levels in their first two years

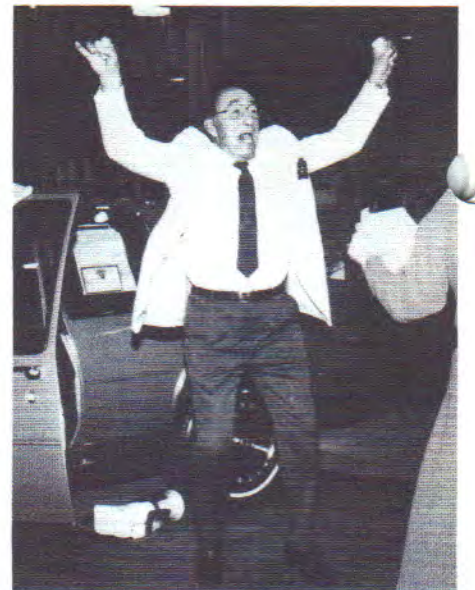
Jan Rovane, who last year worked as the school's attendance secretary, moved
