We look forward to honoring Steve '69 and Kathleen Mahaney as our 2017 Ambassadors of the Year and to sharing some exciting news with you tonight regarding the future of our school.

While much has changed in our 142 years in Sacramento, we hold steadfast to the tradition of our Founder, St. John Baptist de La Salle, and his insistence on finding and fostering the gifts unique to every student. We have outstanding programs in academics, the arts, athletics and Christian service. With your help, we lead the region in providing \$2.7 million of need-based tuition assistance to 423 deserving young men and women. 
