A Nostalgic Look Back . . .

During the week the various classes at the College under the charge of the Christian Brothers have been undergoing an examination preparatory to the holiday vacation. Yesterday afternoon the term closed, examinations were made of the classes in the higher branches, both by the teachers and capable examiners not connected with the school, and the pupils acquited themselves with great credit—with remarkable credit considering that none of them have been under instruction in the College under five months, and many of them only a month or so. The pupils were self-possessed and by every movement and answer, gave evidence of the excellent training to which they had been subjected, and of their confidence in and love and respect for President Cianan and his able corps of assistants.

The progress of the College has been very gratifying to its friends and promoters, and it already gives ample evidence that it will be a worthy and able helper in the great cause of education, with the probability that it may soon be acknowledged as a leader in this section. It already numbers about 300 pupils actually 295 on the roll—though it has been scarce five months in existence. The combined rolls of the College and St. Joseph's Seminary for girls, under control of the Sisters, show a list of 700 pupils—about one fifth of the school children of this

A noteworthy feature of the students of the College is their general intelligent and respectful appearance, as well as their manifest desire to excell in their studies. The

classes in algebra, plain trigonometry and bookkeeping have shown such unmistakable proofs of advancement, that the College authorities are confident that by the close of the year in June next, all or the greater portion will be entitled to diplomas or certificates entitling them to diplomas.

Those public spirited citizens who furnished the means for erecting and equipping the College may rest assured that they never made a better investment of a like amount of money. Their brightest anticipation in connection with the institution will undoubtedly be fully realized.
