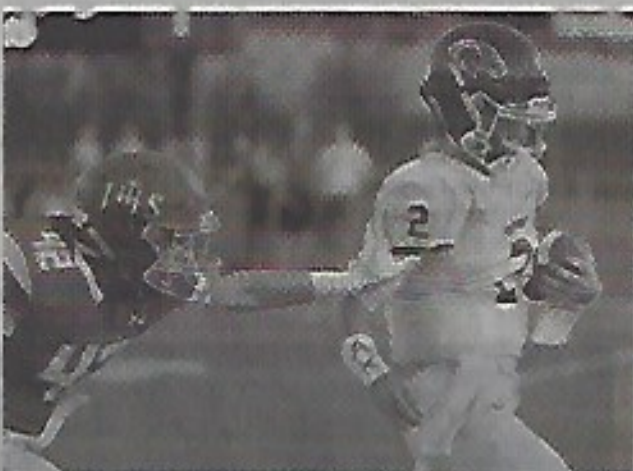

# Statistics are nice, but it's playoff time

**T**he thing about statistical marvels is the numbers really only matter in victory, especially the postseason, where every yard, every score and every stop count.

A quick peek at regular-season stat leaders entering the Sac-Joaquin Section football playoffs, which start Thursday:

- Gunnor Faulk of Christian Brothers has a section-leading 38 touchdown passes, including four or more in seven games, and he will have to keep firing away to drive the third-seeded Falcons back to the Division III finals. He has 20 scoring passes to tight end Spencer Webb.
