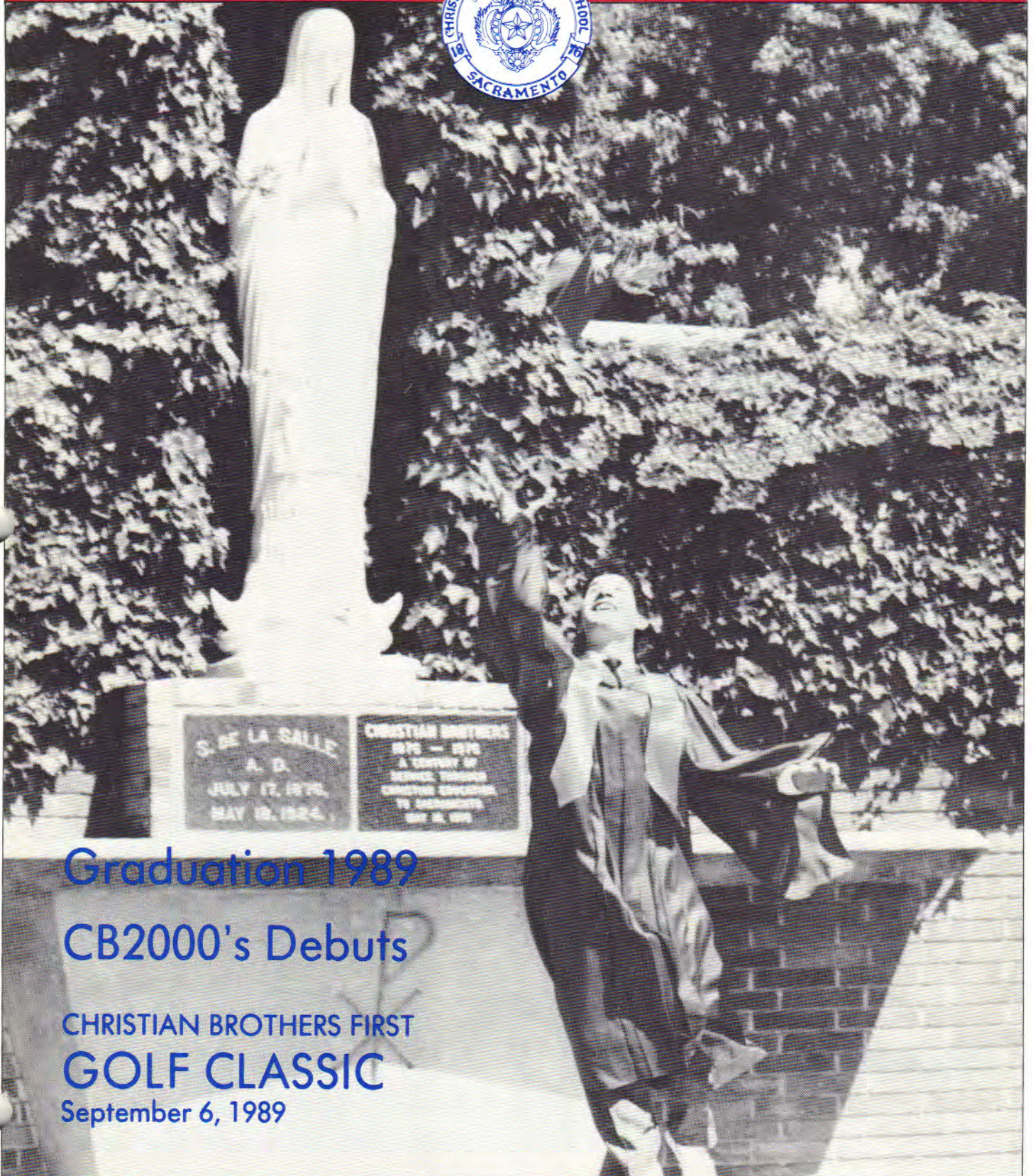

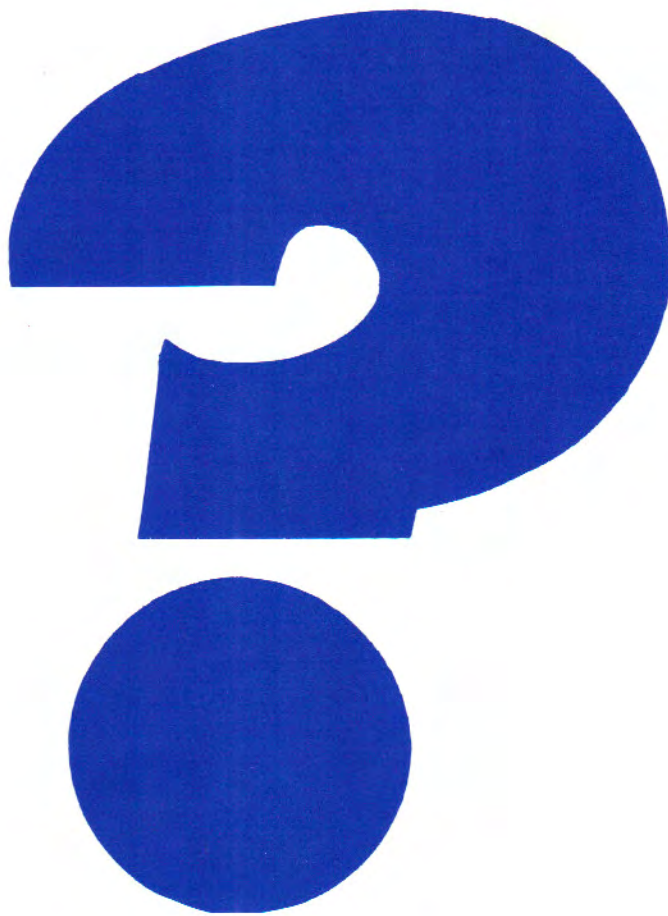

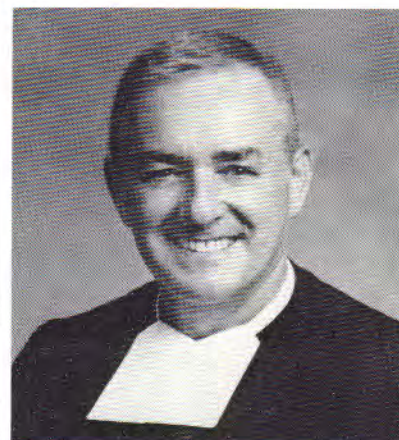
THE CHRISTIAN BROTHERS CONNECTION

## PERRY NEW PRESIDENT OF REGENTS

The new president of the Christian Brothers High School Board of Regents, Manuel Perry, began his association with CBS different than most. Although he attended McClatchy High School, his active association demonstrates that people from other high schools can still get involved at CBS. Perry's loyalty to the school earned him an honorary degree later in life for his years of dedication and service to CBS.

Perry attended Sacramento City College and the University of Oklahoma, where he concentrated in business. He went on to serve as a staff sergeant in charge of personnel with the United States Air Force stationed in Bittburg, Germany for three years. Upon returning to Sacramento he accepted an officer manager trainee position with New York Life Insurance.

His association with New York Life has been a successful one for over thirty-five years. As one of the firm's busiest agents, he specializes in estate and business planning insurance. Recently, New York Life honored him with membership in the "Chairman's Council," a select group of the company's highest producers nationally. He has been a director of First Commercial Bank since 1983 and has served as Chairman of the Board since 1985.

Perry has devoted a significant amount of his time to community organizations. Over the years he has served as president of many groups, including St. Elizabeth's Social Club, the American Portuguese Club, and the Southside Improvement Club.

Perry has been very active with the American Legion Baseball Club for over 20 years, serving in various managerial and administrative posts, including acting as State Chairman in 1980. In 1981 he coached the Kennedy / Valley American Legion team all the way to the World

Series, making them one of only three teams from Sacramento in more than 50 years to reach the World Series.

Perry and his wife Mary Jane have been married for 33 years. They have five children: Lori, Christianne, Lynn Marie, Ken, and Brian. Ken and Brian are both graduates of Christian Brothers. Recently, Ken was named President of the Alumni Association and serves on the Executive Board of Regents with his father.

Manuel Perry brings with him life-long leadership capabilities and the aptitude for tapping into the talented wellsprings of others. As president of the Board of Regents, Perry looks forward to working with others to spread the word that CBS is one of the best schools in the Sacramento area.

## MADRIGAL SELECTS STANFORD FROM FIELD OF NINE

Christian Brothers' outstanding senior, Oscar Madrigal, has finally decided to sign a letter of intent for Stanford University. After months of consideration and visitations, Oscar made his choice from a total of nine universities including Yale, M.I.T., Princeton, Harvard, UCLA, USC, U.C. Davis, and UC Berkeley. Several of the institutions were offering him full scholarships, including UCLA and U.C. Berkeley.

In addition to the \$18,000 scholarship offered him by Stanford, Oscar has won over \$7,000 in private scholarships based on academic excellence, leadership, and potential for future success. Scholarships were awarded to him from Bank of America, Two/Ten, Jostens, PG&E (James B. Black and HEA), National Society of Professional Engineers, National Hispanic, and Sacramento Hispanic Chamber of Commerce.

Future goals for Oscar include

receiving a B.S. in Mechanical Engineering and, through Stanford's coterminal program, also to acquire an M.S. in Aerospace Engineering. After working as an engineer, he plans to obtain an MBA at Harvard.

Oscar's parents, Juan José and Carmen Madrigal of St. Joseph's parish in North Sacramento, are extremely proud of Oscar and their other children. Oscar's younger brother, Alejandro, presently attends St. Joseph's Grammar School, and his sister, Sandra, attends Bishop

Manogue. His older brother Ruben is a Christian Brothers graduate currently attending U.C. Davis as a Bio-Science major with intentions of entering medical school.

The Madrigal family clearly values Catholic education which provides the challenge and the opportunity for excellence. Alejandro and Sandra both are on the "A" Honor Roll while Ruben has maintained a 3.3 grade point average in his college studies. Oscar himself has maintained a 4.3 GPA, the highest in his

class.

Oscar has big dreams, but he is confident that Christian Brothers has prepared him well, just like the thousands of CBS graduates before him.

## FOUR IN-COMING FRESHMEN EARN SCHOLARSHIPS

Brother Richard Camara, F.S.C., principal of Christian Brothers High School, has announced winners of the school's Regents Scholarship Program, a competition which provides scholarships to outstanding incoming students.

Winners of the scholarships, valued at \$1,600 per year, are Constantine Baranoff of Brookfield School, Jason Brooks of St. Patrick's School, Michael Kuzmich of St. Mary's School, and Eric Weber of Our Savior Lutheran School.

The winners of these scholarships, which are sponsored by the school's Board of Regents, are expected to maintain a 3.3 grade point average each semester of attendance. A recent study of past finalists has

shown these students maintaining a much higher average, 3.6. Past winners have gone on to Stanford, St. Mary's College of California, M.I.T., and the University of Virginia.

The competition also awarded Honors at Entrance to Michael Chisler of All Hallows, Andrew Dwyer of St. Robert's, Eric Larson of Sam Brannon, Brian Pinkney of St. Patrick's, and Jason Pollack of St. Ignatius.

Program Director Patrick O'Brien estimates the value of the scholarships to be over \$7,000 for the

four years. In addition to these academic grants, Christian Brothers sets aside more than \$50,000 to assist needy students to attend the school.

Christian Brothers had a first when Harvard University visited the campus on May 17 to speak to prospective sophomores and juniors. Harvard representative Sara Salvide spoke to top underclassmen who are beginning their selection process in choosing colleges. CBS was the only Sacramento-area school Salvide visited this year.

## BROTHER RICHARD ENJOYS 35 YEAR ANNIVERSARY

Brother Richard Camara, F.S.C., Christian Brothers High School principal, celebrated his 35th anniversary as a Christian Brother on April 29. A Mass held at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament was followed by a reception at Christian Brothers, attended by approximately 300 of Brother Richard's relatives and friends.

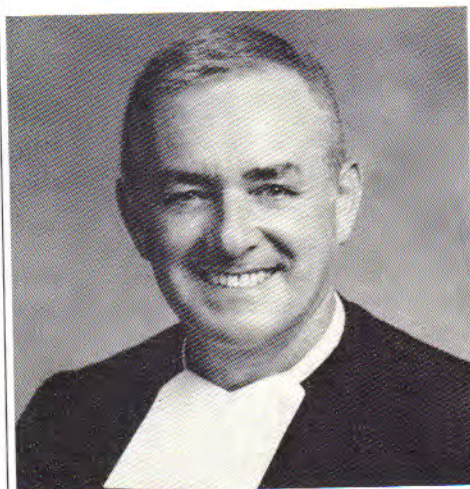
"At this phase of my life," Brother Richard said, "I'm able to see more clearly God's design of why He has chosen me to do His work and with that has come a conviction that influences all that I do."

Since July, 1981, Brother Richard has served as principal of CBS. Brother Mark Murphy, Provincial for the San Francisco District, recently announced the re-appointment of Brother Richard as principal through June, 1993.

After entering the Christian Brothers novitiate in July, 1953, Brother Richard attended Saint Mary's College where he earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in History and English in 1958. Brother Richard also received a Masters of Education degree in counseling from Loyola (L.A.) University in 1969.

Brother Richard began his teaching career in 1958 when he was assigned to CBS as teacher and prefect of resident students at the 21st and Broadway location. On August 15, 1960, Brother Richard professed his final vows at Mont La Salle. When the boarding department at CBS closed in 1964, he moved to St. Mary's College High School in Berkeley in the same capacity he had held at CBS.

In June, 1966, Brother Richard began one of his most memorable assignments when he was asked to be-

come the founding vice principal of Justin High School in Napa. During the 1974-75 school year, Brother Richard served as principal of Justin-Siena High School.

After a one-year stint as vice president of the Christian Brothers Winery in Napa, Brother Richard was assigned in 1976 to Sacred Heart High School in San Francisco as a teacher and counselor. A sabbatical year of study in Spain and at the Christian Brothers Motherhouse in Rome followed before he was asked to return to Sacramento in July, 1978, as Dean of Students and teacher.

"I feel privileged to be part of the tradition and heritage of Christian Brothers High School," said Brother Richard. "The history of CBS has been such a notable investment in the community that I see on the horizon a greater involvement and challenge for Christian Brothers in the field of education. The new century is close at hand, presenting to us the opportunity to grow and develop. Our diocese in this city has benefitted by the work of the Brothers and the future is even more promising as we face it with optimism and continued commitment to the people and the church."

One, *The Connection* editorial board is aiming at not only expanding and improving the product (through increased coverage, pages, and number of publications), but at making the publication self-sufficient through income from advertising. Secondly, the costs of producing this magazine are rising and we need to gain outside income to offset the increases. Two issues ago, when we went to our new format, production costs were actually under the budget allotted the January issue. But with more pages

## CBS CLASS OF '89 ANNOUNCES INTENTIONS

Continuing a tradition at Christian Brothers High School of expanding on its college-prep education, the Senior Class of 1989 has announced its post-graduate intentions. And, as it has been in the past, there is an impressive list of colleges to be found in the plans of the seniors.

Of the 134 seniors graduating from Christian Brothers this spring, over a third are planning on immediately attending four-years schools. Twelve of those students will move on to one of three University of California schools (Davis, Berkeley, and Los Angeles), 35 will attend State Colleges (Sacramento and San Luis Obispo among many), and 15 will matriculate in private schools (St. Mary's, University of San Francisco, Stanford, Santa Clara, Loyola-Marymount, and Redlands).

Just under half of the graduates will attend a two-year school prior to moving on to a four-year school, with Sacramento City, American River, and Cosumnes being the top choices. Approximately half of those students have already indicated that they will attend Sacramento State after finishing their two year program. Twelve have said they will go a U.C. in two years.

Only two will begin working immediately, and only two are undecided.

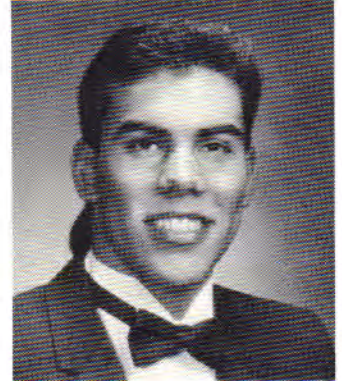
## NAMES, FACES, AND ACHIEVEMENTS AT CBS

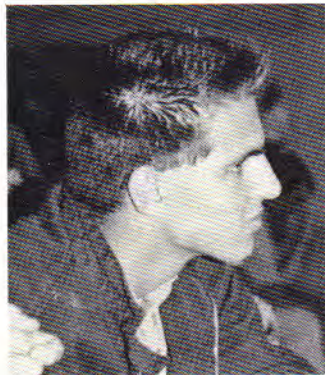

Dear Brothers,

Happy Feast Day! As I prepared for Mass this morning, I thought of my beloved Alama Mater and all of you wonderful Brothers whom I respected and loved dearly all these years. I spent one of my most significant years at the Broadway and 21st school, from where I graduated in 1951. It was an extremely fulfilling and decisive year of my life. I had a working scholarship—cleaning the classrooms, the gym, and the lavatories every afternoon. I had the opportunity of attending daily Masses. I was knocked down the first day of school when I tried to show some Chinese Kung Fu against a Hawaiian roommate who was very good at boxing. I also remember learning how to waltz as I was invited to attend a dancing party at the neighboring girls high school. That year I earned my first half dollar mowing lawns for a whole morning in the neighborhood.

Brother Bertram was the principal, and Brother Matthias was the disciplinarian. Brother Philips was my chemistry teacher, and he inspired me to go on to major in chemistry at Seton Hall University, New Jersey. All the Brothers were very, very good to me. As I think back, it's a mystery why I didn't become a Christian Brother!

After college, I entered Maryknoll and was ordained in 1961; studied a year at Georgetown Linguistics department, got my MS, and

was assigned to Taiwan in 1962.

For twenty years I worked in the Taiwan mountain regions serving the tribal people. And I was always interested in the education of the poor people. I tried to provide all that I had learned from the Christian Brothers to the parish youths. Now there are ten seminarians preparing for priesthood from the mountain parish.

Presently I am serving in a city parish and still working as a Diocesan Coordinator for the high school students apostolate. And all this I trace back to that very special year at the Christian Brothers High School in Sacramento.

By the way, there at CBS I also learned how to drive and had my first car accident the day of my graduation. I often thought that the fact I was able to reach priesthood and become a missionary must be the result of those magnificent, dedicated Brothers' good prayers and good wishes. So I want to tell you how very grateful I am to those who taught me, guided me, supported me, encouraged me, and also to those who through the years have spent yourselves for the education of the poor such as myself. Thank you and thank God for the marvels of His Grace.

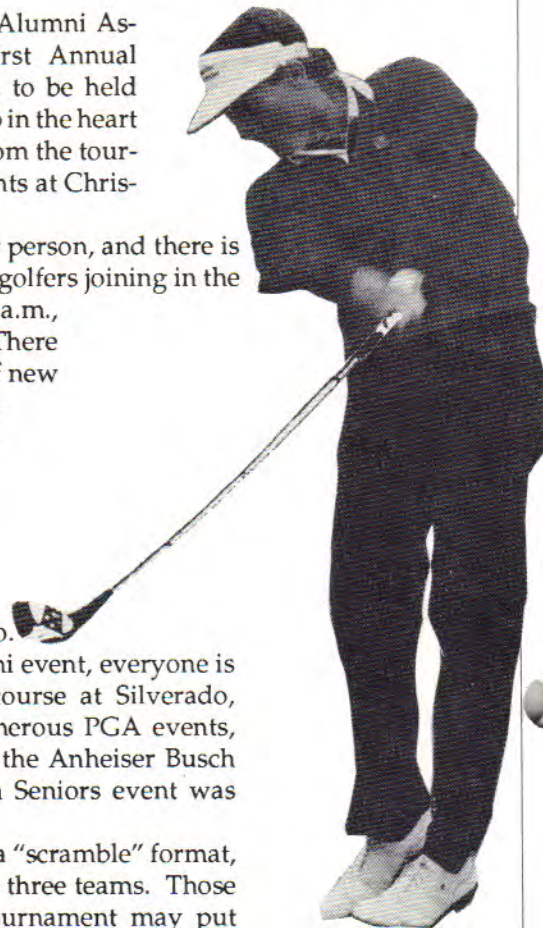

As I am sure you are aware, on May 15, 1989, the Christian Brothers entered into an agreement to sell Mont La Salle Vineyards - the Christian Brothers' Winery - to Heublein, Inc.


Since you are a close and valued friend of Christian Brothers High School and the Brothers, I would like to take the opportunity to provide you with some background information.

The decision to sell the winery was reached by the Christian Brothers' Provincial Council and their advisors, including Don Ritchey, former CEO of Lucky Stores, Inc.; Don Doyle, former CEO of Bay View Savings, Inc.; and Ross Anderson, former Group President of Federated Department Stores. The Mont La Salle Vineyards' board, composed of Ray O'Brien, Chairman of Consolidated Freightways; Fernando Gumucio, former President of Del Monte Foods; James Miscoll, Executive Vice President, Bank of America; and Dale Lynch, Past President of Safeway Stores, was also extensively involved.

Our intent is to provide a more stable source of income to help support the operation of the Province and our many educational works than could be projected from the highly volatile wine and spirits business. An endowment fund will now be created which will be similar to those which provide support for many colleges and universities. For the foreseeable future, the proceeds from the sale will not provide for any increased support from the Brothers for their educational works. Christian Brothers High School will continue to depend in large measure on the generosity of people such as yourself who recognize the contribution our school makes to the lives of young people.

I will keep you informed on this important matter as further information becomes available. We are grateful for your friendship; it is most important to the Brothers. Let us work together to keep Christian Brothers High School as a strong and effective educational institution.
