A 94 YEAR TRADITION



For the past century, the Christian Brothers have labored successfully in California educational fields of elementary, secondary and collegiate teaching. Their beginnings were not ostentatious as the community of Sacramento some 93 years ago did observe. At that time, in July of 1876, Christian Brothers was founded as an out-growth of St. Rose's parish school, first called St. Patrick's by the pastor, Rev. Father Seanlan. Eventually, when the Christian Brothers of San Francisco accepted a new three-story building at the corner of 12th and K Streets, the school assumed the name of Christian Brothers College.

Here, the tradition of "CBC" flourished, impressing upon Sacramento its educational benefit and prominence. Although it never achieved a degree granting status, it was Sacramento's first school to offer college courses. In due time, however, Christian Brothers pursued the interests of a secondary school. By November 5, 1924, the State of California, by incorporation, restricted Christian Brothers to a high school in its new Mission styled buildings on 21st and Broadway Streets. Attracting students to its boarding department, the school here enhanced its reputation for academic excellence and athletic prowess in the Sacramento area. Finally, the pressure of need and change re-situated this worthy school on Sacramento Blvd., its present campus, where a thriving, renewed Christian Brothers continues its educational influence and success.

JESUIT SCHOOL HISTORY

It was the late Bishop Armstrong who first had the idea to invite the Jesuits to open a school in the Sacramento diocese, but it was with the encouragement and help of his two successors, Bishops McGucken and Bell that the idea became a reality. In late summer of 1961, Fr. Joseph Keane, S.J. was appointed the director of development, in charge of raising the money for the new school, and once this had been accomplished, of beginning the construction of the new facilities.

After two years, Jesuit High opened its doors to an incoming class of 93 freshmen at the Carmichael site. Only the classroom and administration buildings were completed by the September 17, 1963 opening date; the faculty was even living in rented quarters two miles away from the school. Little by little, the new school grew as new classrooms were added, the faculty residence was completed, and landscaping had converted a former hops field into an attractive high school campus.

Each year the school added another class of students until 1967 when Jesuit had its first graduating class. As we became a four-year high school, we began to develop our athletic program so that we could provide all aspects of a total high school formation. The symbol for the part that athletics contributes to the student life at Jesuit is the Gymnasium which was completed in June 1968 and was ready for use when the school year 1968-69 opened.

This year Jesuit is in its seventh year, helping to serve the needs of secondary school education for the Catholics of the Sacramento area. Under the leadership of Fr. Warren Schoeppe, S.J., who has replaced Fr. Joseph Costa, S. J. as President of the school, and Fr. Edward Callanan, S.J., Principal of the school, the faculty and students of Jesuit High hope to continue the tradition of service to the community which the pioneer years of the early 60's have established.

WELCOME

THE WORST PLACE for anybody with sensitive ears would be at a Christian Brothers-Jesuit football conflict, particularly the first one. These schools positively have two of the noisiest cheering sections for their size.

Those who have braved other athletic cards at the schools know this. They have learned to arm themselves with some cotton balls, ear muffs or anything else to safeguard against a "decibel gap."

IN CASE SOME forget, just remember Jesuit at last spring's Camellia City Tournament of Champions basketball tournament, which the Big Red won but not before their supporters rocked the cramped American River College gym with a mighty roar of eardrum-shattering proportions.

Without losing too much perspective it would seem the clash between the Brothers and Jesuit will be more than a gridiron match. It will be a challenge between two rooting sections. They are the masters at rattling the stands and "bailing" opposing sides for recognized superiority.

Both sides have plenty to cheer about in the first meeting of what promises to be a long rivalry between an institution nearing the century mark and one with only four years of tradition behind it.

JESUIT IN ITS short tenure has produced a series of miracles hard to explain. For example, the Big Red won the Golden Empire League football crown last year after finishing second behind Cordova. Cordova was forced to forfeit the title for having a roster which included two ineligible players.

Next, Jesuit's basketball crew, with little more than a skyscraping center and a prayer here and there, destroyed other foes in winning the GEL title, the CCTOC and the No. 1 ranking in Superior California.

CHRISTIAN BROTHERS has an alumni glossary which reads like a "Who's Who?" in the sports world, big business and Sacramento civic circles.

Such illustrious alums as Johnny McNamara, Oakland A's baseball manager; former major league players Joe Marty, Wally Westlake and Charles Schanz come from Brothers. Then there are former Sacramento Police Chief Joe Rooney; real estate titan Ray Cordano; ex-Public Utilities bigwig Pete Mitchell; and Superior Court Judges William Gallagher and Joseph Bobich. The list is endless.

JESUIT AND BROTHERS lineups are loaded with players opposing coaches would like not to remember. Jesuit has one of the area's top rushers in craggy halfback Joe Manglaracina, who gained 696 yards running for a 5.1 average carry in the Big Red's first seven games. Manglaracina also stays one step ahead of his name.

On the Brothers' side are all-city quarterback candidate Rick Cabral, who dazzled opposing secondaries with 694 yards on 47 completions, seven of which went for touchdowns, in the Falcons' first seven games. Cabral also is an excellent runner. His favorite receiver is flankerback Joe Gutierrez, who has taken 18 tosses for 241 yards and three touchdowns, also in seven games.

These are only a few of the names bound to be heard before the initial Brothers-Jesuit clash ends. You can bet on that. Just listen to those cheering sections . . .

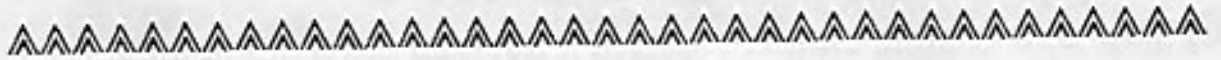

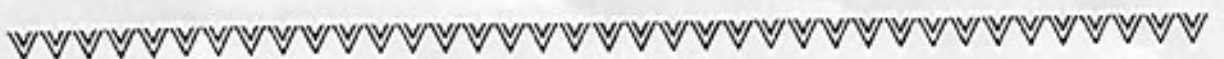

The Jesuit Varsity Football team completed its 4th season with a 7-1-1 seasonal tally and a 3-1-1 league record. The team set several records as they won 9 games straight in the 1968 and 1969 seasons and allowed only 69 points to our opponents.

The Marauders had one of the finest defenses in the city and held the opposition to 130 yards average per game. The defense was led by the "Big Three": Marshall Alameida, Tim Warren, and Ron Czarnecki. Ron O'Connor, Barry Taugher, and Tom LaZansky were top linebackers, while George Everett led the defensive backfield.

The offense was led by Senior halfback Joe Mangiaracina who was one of the city's leading rushers—with a 5 yard rushing average. The Marauders are a young team made up primarily of juniors. We will lose five of the offensive-defensive unit with graduation in June.

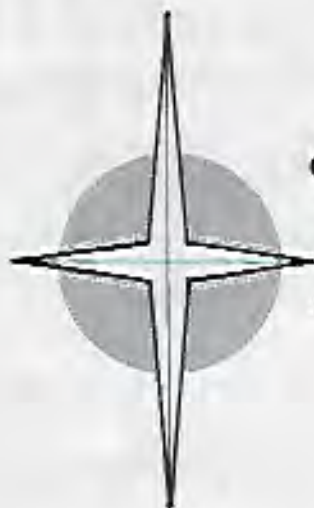

The alumni are in the Sacramento area by the thousands, holding positions of dignity and distinction in careers and diverse services to the community. Over the years, dating back to 1878, they have distinguished the Christian Brothers School as a benevolent influence which now continues to prevail on its modern 30-acre campus. This association has a justified pride in Christian Brothers at 12th and K, at 21st and Broadway, and finally on Sacramento Boulevard where today's youth display the same tradition and spirit of CBS.

At present the Alumni Association is under the leadership of Robert Roche '44, Thomas O'Neill '47, Daniel Lorenz '55, Ronald Limeberger '53, and Michael Koewler '53. Brother Edward Welch is the present moderator. This group has timely renewed the Alumni Association, and in the traditional way, "old grads" are supporting relationship between Jesuit and Christian Brothers.



JESUIT BOOSTERS CLUB

The Jesuit Boosters' Club provides the necessary assistance to a successful school operation which students and faculty cannot provide. Originally founded to help raise needed funds for the athletic program which the school could not provide in its growing years, the Boosters have expanded their area of operations so that their help is not restricted to the athletic program alone. Under the leadership of President Dave Macaulay, and past presidents John Hannagan, Art Banchemo, and Bob Wilson, the Boosters have become an integral part of the operations at Jesuit High.

The membership is made up principally from the fathers of students, present and past, of Jesuit High, plus graduates of Jesuit schools who live in the area and are interested in promoting the cause of Jesuit secondary education. Their contributions to Jesuit extend beyond the athletic program—where some of their efforts can be seen in the fencing for the field, machinery for the maintenance of the fields and athletic equipment—into the academic aspect too, as is seen in the use of funds for classroom desks, new library books and assistance with the scholarship program. In addition to this, various social events are sponsored throughout the year.

The unsung heroes of the Boosters are those especially who contribute of their time, energy and material aid as individuals, and who are only infrequently given recognition of their efforts. To them, and to all the Boosters, the school owes a debt of thanks for the many services rendered. The school could not provide what it does for the education of our young men were it not for their services.
