## La Salle Hall of Fame to honor 12

Former SCC baseball stars highlight the group's 50th anniversary celebration.

The Christian Brothers High School La Salle Club Hall of Fame will induct 12 new baseball members at the school April 23.

The 50th annual class includes Dave Borges, a pitcher for CBS who played two years of minor-league baseball after being drafted by the Chicago Cubs.

Sacramento City College's dominance during the late 1940s and early 1950s also will be recognized.

Nick Capachi played shortstop on Sac City's 1953 state championship team, and Jerry Kaeser was the shortstop on the 1951 team, hitting the game-winning home run to win the championship in the decisive game of the series. He also was the tournament's MVP. He went on to coach baseball at Rio Americano High for 27 years, and the school's baseball field is named after him.

Bob Hanlon played on the Panthers' title team in 1948, batting .379. He also played basketball and is in the SCC Hall of Fame.

Larry Kelley worked for Sacramento's city recreation department. He was a 1955 All-City player before moving on to SCC, where he was an all-conference selection and the team's leading hitter and center fielder. Other players who will be honored include Mel Dalrymple, a pitcher in the minor leagues for three years, and Hank deLotty Jr., who made his mark as an umpire, working more than 2,000 games at the Babe Ruth, high school, American League levels.

Paul Kereazis played varsity baseball at McClatchy, two years as a center fielder, and signed with the Sacramento Solons out of high school.

John Stanich lettered in track, basketball and baseball at Sacramento High and Sac City before playing at UCLA.

Walt Swedman was an All-City catcher at Sac High who played minor-league baseball for four sea-

Ray Webster, from Marysville, played for the Solons before his contract was sold to the Cleveland Indians. The shortstop also played for the Boston Red Sox and participated in 47 major-league games.

Russ Grove is another player who had experience with the Solons.
