

## Christian Brothers H.S. names president

Lorcan Barnes has been appointed by the board of trustees to serve as president and CEO of Christian Brothers High School in Sacramento beginning July 1.

Barnes succeeds Mark Warren, who is leaving at the conclusion of the school year after serving as president for the past eight years.

Barnes is currently president and CEO of Chaminade-Julienne Catholic High School in Dayton, Ohio, where he has served for the past eight years.

During his tenure at Chaminade-Julienne, Barnes' accomplishments included leading a successful \$12.9 million capital campaign and increasing school enrollment nine percent in five years at a time when other private school populations declined.

Barnes holds a bachelor's degree in sociology from Loyola Marymount University in Los Angeles and a master's degree in business administration from Woodbury University in Burbank.

Prior to his tenure at Chaminade-Julienne, he was a teacher and assistant to the president at Loyola High School in Los Angeles from 1991 to 1996.

Barnes, his wife, Patti, and their three sons are moving to Sacramento in June.
