## Dragons to Outweigh Gael Team

Irish Backs Rate Edge on Experience in Big Scrap

Interest has soared so that the largest crowd in this game's history may turn out at the stadium tomorrow night to watch Christian Brothers school take a determined crack at 20 years of Sacramento High school superiority.

We don't think the light Gaels can turn the trick—they haven't the line to move the big Fergusons, McKerrases, Richardsons and Nelsons that stud the Dragon front all.

But Jimmy Flynn's backs, who are more mature and experienced than those of Lourance Janssen at the high school, are likely to throw many a scare into the Purple before the night's over.

### Bennett Gael Passer

Adrian Bennett is quite a passer, as well as Jim McPartland. The Gaels admit they haven't an "80-yard punter," although that's what one of their players told Janssen, but they have some boys who can get that ball, especially Charlie Schanz, a tackle from San Juan. The Brothers claim to have a defense worked out to stop Janssen's Warner reverses. They point to the success of St. Mary's team in stopping all Warner reverses in a row against them, and they say they can emulate their Moraga rivals.

### Dragons Shift

Sacramento High will blossom with a shift Friday for the first time since Janssen took over the coaching reins. It's just a simple title affair, says the Purple coach, and is primarily designed to keep its own linesmen on the alert—although he hopes, too, the opposing team may be caught asleep maybe once during the night.

Ferguson and McKerras, near-200-pound tackles, haven't been moving so lightly in recent scrimmages. They've gained so much weight in the last year they've been slowed down. Janssen hopes they are not too slow Friday.

### High Backfield Intact

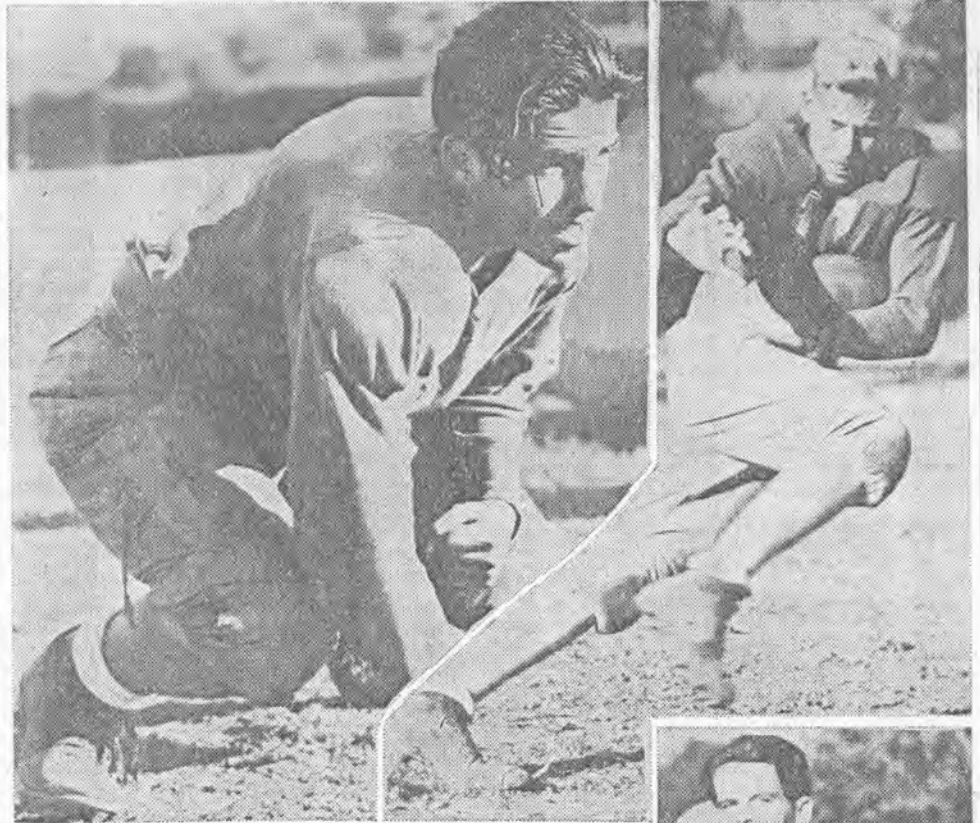
There are no lineup changes from those previously announced at the high school. Bob Roof at back and Joe Verdina at right half will rate the call, although George Jones and Lloyd Craig, respectively, may be in there when the opening whistle blows. Ralph Drean is certain to open at left half and Duke Garbagedian, the experienced, at quarter.

Jack Coughlin, first-string Brothers tackle, was being treated for an eye infection yesterday and may not start. Charlie Schanz will take his place if he doesn't, with Eddie Schultz the other tackle.

### Dragons Outweigh Irish

The high line will outweigh the Gaels about five pounds to a man, Dragon forwards averaging 182 to the Brothers' 177. In the backfield the starting Purple lineup averages 160 pounds to Christian Brothers'

## Dragons Strong on Blocking, Condition for First Battle

By way of introducing our Fearless Journalism department to the football-loving populace of Sacramento today we hereby go on record with our extra special pick for this week-end's contest.

It's Sacramento high to beat Christian Brothers.

It would be easy enough to substantiate this pick by the Goback method, a procedure consisting of going back into the files and seeing what Christian Brothers did last year against the high school, what players the high school lost and what players the Brothers lost at graduation, how the coaches slept during the summer, and how the players who are left reacted to "The Music Goes Round and Round."

### Our New Plan

But this season you can have the Goback system. We're going to try the Howitlooks plan. And stick with it—at least until kick-off.

Under our Howitlooks plan we like George Relles' outfit to lick

Coach George Relles announced his starting lineup for tomorrow's game as follows last night: Ends, Yamada and Cushow; tackles, McMillan and Guthrie; guards, Winters and Luchessi; center, Wisner; halfbacks, Bottino and Bowa; quarter, Templemann; fullback, Marshall.

Jimmy Flynn's outfit tomorrow night at the stadium, because this is Howitlooks to us:

Relles was such a great blocker in college he should have gone into the hat-cleaning business. He didn't, though, and some 30 or 40 Sacramento high school kids have profited in the last three weeks by learning how to block.

### Nothing Fancy

There may be nothing fancy about the high school attack tomorrow—unless you can call a flat pass over the center of the line, tossed by Paul Bowa and Fred Marshall, fancy—but there will be something awfully fundamental about their offense.

All right, the Dragons can block. They will also be in top physical condition, considering that the game's the opener.

Trace the game progress of last year's high contests and you'll find the Dragons started out like a house afire every game, but slowed down about the middle of the second quarter as if the house really were afire and they'd just got out in time.

### Tougher This Year

That, according to Lourance Janssen, last year's head coach, was because of poor physical condition, resulting from lack of week-day scrimmage, impossible to stage because of a practice field with no turf on it.

This year's practice field has plenty of turf—and turf makes tough, or some pun like that.

Well, having proved it to our own satisfaction that the high school will be good enough (if not to yours, Bill Hallanan, Cliff Russell, Bernie Scollan, Ray Coughlin, et cetera) we'll have to show why Jimmy Flynn's outfit will not be.

### Flynn's Line Good

Flynn will field a fine, big veteran set of forwards. George Gillette, end; Vic Martinelli, tackle; Dave Simmons, Guard, and Bill Palm, center, all played a major part in the 6-0 upset win over the high school last year. And they're back, bigger and smarter.

But the Brothers won't have the offense. Even Flynn will tell you his offense is out for Marquette university's football squad at Chicago—Namely, one Jim McPartland. McPartland was to have been the big gun in the Brothers attack, but his Pop had to go midwest and left Jimmy holding the bag.

### Green Halfbacks

Leo Bennett is a veteran at fullback, but both starting halfbacks are green, playing their first football. They are Ted Gardner and Pat Pappan. Quarterback is also new, Ralph Gillette. Last year the Brothers beat the high school on Adrian Bennett's passing and Bobby Williams' running—both are gone.

It ought to be a close one, nothing more than 6-0 or 13-0 in favor of the high school, under the Howitlooks plan. But if we weaken and revert to our Goback system Flynn could possibly pull one out.

## Gael Team Confident for Opener

### Dragon Lineup Lists Light Backs in Stadium Tilt

The closest Sacramento High-Christian Brothers battle since 1932, when the Dragons just beat out the Gaels on the strength of Bob Coe's 65-yard dash, 6-0, is foreseen for the stadium Friday night.

And the foreseer is none other than Lourance Janssen, main high coach, who says that although his line will probably outweigh the Brothers' wall, he has no one in the backfield to spring loose as last year, when Cliff Perry, Julio Pane and company swamped the Irish, 32-6.

### Gael Tales

"I understand they are confident that this is the year they're going to beat us," said Janssen last night. "They tell me about a punter who boots 'em 80 yards. I don't know his name. I know they have one of the toughest guards in the city in Simmons, 165 pounds, who transferred from the high school, and a couple of fast backs in the Bennett brothers.

"And they have an end, Bob Gillett, who is big, rangy, and can catch passes."

Not in Janssen's memory have the Brothers taken the high school, and that goes back 10 years, to 1925. The closest game was the 6-0 affair in 1932, when the Gaels had a great team headed by Frank Nugent at center and Ed Jackson, a remarkable kicker.

### High Lineup Given

And in between paragraphs of repeating "what they tell me about the Brothers taken the high school, to report the following starting lineup for the Dragons Friday, with weights.

### Those to Play

Others most likely to get in the game are: Ed Anzore, George Yamada, and Cliff Fishback, ends; Don Lewis, Ellis McMillan, and George Orite, tackles; Bernard Hall, John Ban, and Robert Luccheschi, guards, and Harry Haseleu, center.

Lloyd Craig, 155, will probably see action at right half and Paul Mussalini, 131, and Larry Senna, 140, at left half. Mervin Riggs, 150, may get in at quarter with George Lyons, 175, alternating at full with Roof.

The high backfield, as one can see, is very light. That's why they put Garabedian, a tackle, back there at quarter.

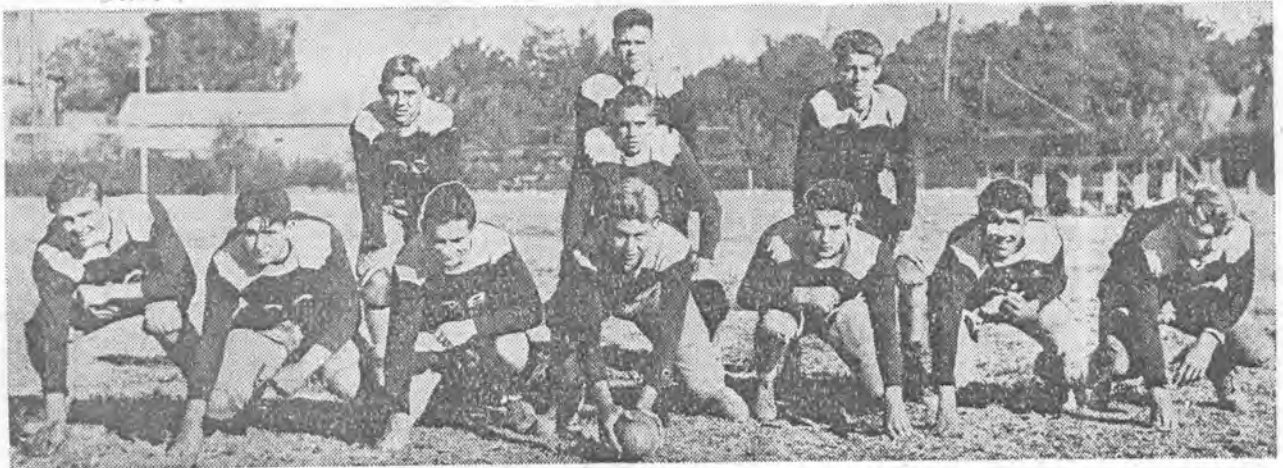

Lewis played a great game in the Brothers line, as did George Gillette, end; Vic Martinelli, tackle; Dave Simmons, guard; and Bill Palm, center. Charlie Shantz, tackle, came back and did some nice kicking, although Archerda pulled the evening's prize punt, a quick-kick of 54 yards.

Relles changed whole teams at a time and kept sending in fresh replacements all through the game, but the boys were outfought by a dogged Irish team that just wouldn't be beaten.

### Flynn Lauds Gillette

In an after-game statement Jimmy Flynn, who has now coached victories over the high school in the two years he has been at Christian Brothers, credited Ralph Gillette, his quarterback, with being the game hero.

"He did some beautiful blocking, getting their halfback nearly every time, and he called the plays right every time. Ted Gardner also came through wonderfully at halfback."

# Irish Score Twice In Second Half Of Game Between Local Rivals

## Sacramento High School Outplays Opposition During First Two Periods But Folds At Finish

The spectators at the football game between the Christian Brothers and the Sacramento High School at the local stadium last night would like to know what Coach Jim Flynn told his Irish between halves. Whatever the message was it fired up the Brothers and sent them to a 14 to 0 victory over the Dragons in the second half. A crowd of 3,001 paid to see the game.

### Dragons Start Strong

Sacramento outplayed the Brothers pitifully in the first two quarters. The Dragons made nine first downs to none for the Irish. The Purple and White gridders were pounding on touchdown's door all the time. Once Larry Takai, Japanese halfback, went over the goal-line, but the ball was brought back and the Dragons penalized for backfield in motion.

Flynn could hardly wait to get his boys off the field to talk to them. Flynn's Irish oratory in the dressing rooms is said to have made big tackles cry and little quarterbacks fighting mad. At any rate when the Brothers ran onto the field in the second half they were a different football team.

### Dragons Outplayed

The Brothers outplayed the Dragons as badly in the second half as the high school did during the first two quarters. The Irish made eight first downs to Sacramento's five and, what was much more important, made two touchdowns to the Dragons' none.

Leo Bennett and Ted Gardner did most of the manual labor in the first touchdown, but Ralph Gillette had the white collar job. He had to do the thinking for the team and he did a marvelous job. He barked the signals and mixed up the plays so well that after three first downs he called for Bob Lewis to go around the left side of the Dragons for more than twenty yards and a touchdown.

### Select Plays Well

It was the mixing up of plays that deceived the Dragons and allowed Lewis to run over the goal line without a hand being laid on him. Bennett bucked the ball across for the extra point. The Irish had driven sixty-two yards after receiving the kickoff.

The Brothers' second drive that resulted in their second touchdown came in the last period. Pete Archerda and Gardner carried the ball right down the field for four first downs after the Dragons had lost the pigskin on downs near the center of the field. Archerda carried the ball across from six yards out and Bennett again bucked across for the extra counter.

### Lose Ball On Downs

In the first quarter the Dragons drove to the Brothers' 3-yard line but lost the ball on downs. A penalty and a fumble ruined other threats by the high school in the second quarter. The Purple and Whites carried the ball to the 24-yard line in the third quarter and were dangerously close to the Brothers' goal line when the game ended.

The game was interesting and both teams showed much promise. The Dragons must get a touchdown punch, but their passing game with both Fred Marshall and Bob Libbee throwing the ball will be dangerous to the opposition. Glenn Dufour and Kelly Wisner, centers, and Bob Lucchesi, guard, were outstanding in the high school line. Paul Bowa got off one run of twenty-five yards.

Gillette blocked well for the Brothers and called signals like a master. Dave Simmons, guard, was a tower of strength in the Irish line.

# Relles' Debut Draped in Defeat for Season's Start

## Small but Courageous Catholic Gridders Play on Real Show in Second Half to Win

Coming back in the last half with one of those typical Gaelic finishes after having been played off their feet in the first two quarters, Jimmy Flynn's Christian Brothers school football eleven humiliated big Sacramento high for the second successive year in the stadium last night, whipping them 14 to 0.

It was a baptismal defeat for George Relles, making his debut as coach at Sacramento high. With five yards to go on fourth down in the center of the field, high eleven tried to run an end make their yardage.

They were stopped by a line that hadn't been able to crack on ground all evening and Brother took possession. Pete Archerda ripped off four yards, Leo Bennet went four, Archerda 11 more, Gardner six, and so on, right down to the goal line for successive first downs, finally the touchdown, Archerda taking it over his right tackle for four yards.

### Irish Pull Perfect Play

Receiving the Sacramento high kickoff at the start of the second half, after the first had ended 0-0, the Brothers marched right down to a touchdown. Ted Gardner, the "green" halfback, alternated with the veterans Leo Bennett and Pete Archerda to run and plunge the ball for three straight first downs, to the 20-yard line.

Then, on a first down play, Flynn's men pulled one of those perfect plays to score the first touchdown—and really win the ball game. It was a double reverse and with both teams pulled far to one side of the field Bob Lewis, an end, suddenly emerged out of a backfield jumble and ran 20 yards around his own right end for the score.

### Plunge for Conversion

It was one of the most deceptive plays seen in the stadium in years. No one knew who had the ball until Lewis was about 10 yards from the goal, then high backs dashed for him, but the diving tackles caught him just as he was going across.

Leo Bennett plunged through center for the conversion.

Next Brothers' score was made in the fourth quarter, resulting

from a dumb Sacramento high play. With five yards to go on fourth down in the center of the field, high eleven tried to run an end make their yardage.

They were stopped by a line that hadn't been able to crack on ground all evening and Brother took possession.

They worked the ball to three-yard line and sent Larry Takai over with a touchdown. Referee Jerry Abbott pulled ball back, ruling a man was in motion.

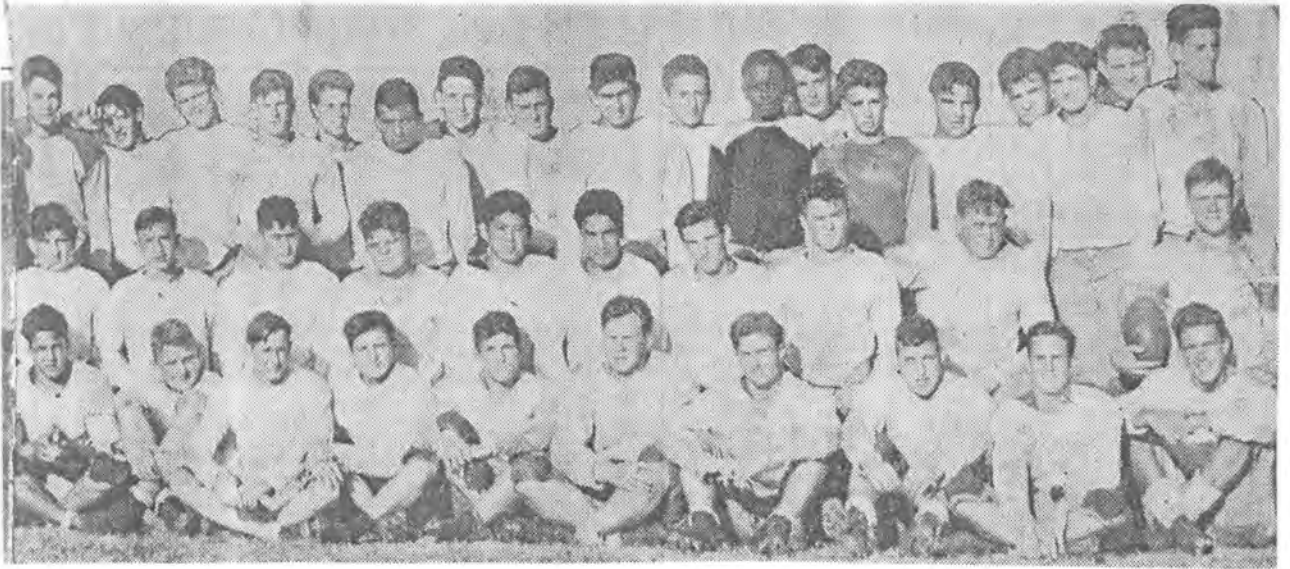

### Lewis Plays Fine Play

But the tide changed so abruptly in the second half one would have thought them the superior teams. And the Brothers showed their contempt for the aerial game by not throwing one toss all evening.

## Brothers Shift Game to Night

Unbeaten Irish Meet St. Mary's at Stadium Saturday

The Christian Brothers-St. Mary's High of Stockton game in the stadium Saturday was shifted to a night contest yesterday, it was announced by Coach Jimmy Flynn of the Brothers. It will start at 7:30 p. m.

Flynn also announced that he had started negotiations for a game with the undefeated Woodland High school team. Woodland meets Sacramento High next Wednesday, Armistice Day, but may be able to play the Brothers after that.

The local Irish came out of their 12-0 victory over St. Vincent's of Vallejo here Wednesday with only one minor injury, that of Pete Archerda, brilliant left halfback. He hurt his left knee, but is expected to start the St. Mary's game.

Harry Petois will open at fullback for the Brothers Saturday, with Leo Bennett, regular full, still not at his best due to injuries. Otherwise the lineup will be the same that has gone through the season unbeaten.

The Brothers line has not been scored through this year in the five games played. The touchdown made by Sutter Creek in the 7-7 tie was scored on a pass over the line.

Jimmy Flynn is readying a new backfield sensation at Christian Brothers. His name is Richard Trainer, and Flynn says he is one of the most natural backs he's ever coached.

Trainer played a while Tuesday against St. Vincent's and caught a pass, also ran fairly well, though he didn't get away. The top running back on the Brothers team now is Pete Archerda, and he looked pretty sweet Tuesday, but Flynn says Trainer has more natural stuff than Archerda, and will be a real ball player in a couple of years.

## Brothers Play Stockton Team Here Tonight

Local Irish to Defend Perfect Stadium Record in St. Mary's Game

Unbeaten, unscored upon in the stadium, Christian Brothers, outstanding prep eleven of the Sacramento season, meets St. Mary's high of Stockton in the stadium tonight, starting at 7:30 p. m.

It is the last regularly scheduled game of the Brothers' grid year, but if Coach Jimmy Flynn's men get over they will be receptive to Rose Bowl bids or anything else any section of the country can offer. Chiefly, they'll listen (earnestly) to propositions of a contest with undefeated Woodland high.

### No St. Mary's Stuff

Flynn hopes his men won't be playing tonight with one foot on the stadium greensward and one foot in the game that might be played with Woodland.

The Stockton visitors are reported as tough as most Stockton teams go, and there are several athletic aggregations about our fair city who can vouch for that toughness through the last decade. Carlos Sousa is the St. Mary's coach.

### Tied Last Year

Sousa's boys held last year's strong Christian Brothers team to a 6-6 draw at Stockton. This year St. Mary's defeated St. Vincent's of Vallejo just as decisively as the local Irish beat the gobs.

All of Flynn's first stringers start tonight except Leo Bennett, blocking fullback, who is out with a shoulder pointer. Harry Petois, who played well against St. Vincent's, will start in Bennett's post.

The C. B. S. line, which has not been scored through in its five games to date—although Sutter Creek passed over it for a touchdown—is out to maintain its defensive reputation.
