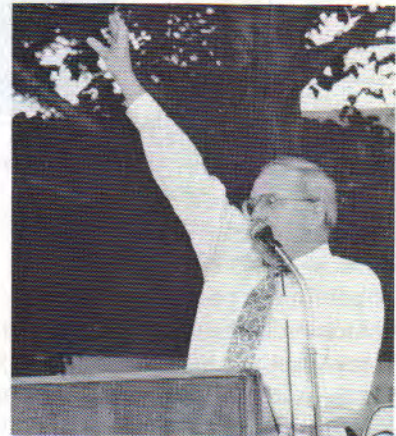

Brother Richard Appointed President to Lead CBS

Domenic Puglisi Named New Principal in School's New Governance Model

Brother Mark Murphy, F.S.C., Provincial Superior of the West Coast Province of the Christian Brothers Order, has announced the appointment of Brother Richard Camara, F.S.C., as the first President of Christian Brothers High School, effective July 1, 1991. Brother Richard has served as Principal of CBS since 1981. His involvement with the school spans more than three decades. Immediately after his graduation from Saint Mary's College in 1958, he was assigned to Christian Brothers High, then located at 21st and Broadway, to begin his teaching career. He remained at CBS until 1964, when the school was relocated to Sacramento Boulevard. Brother Richard returned to CBS in 1978 as Dean of Students and teacher, and he has been Principal for the past 10 years.

Mr. Domenic Puglisi has been appointed by Brother Richard as the new Principal. A long-time associate of the Christian Brothers, Mr. Puglisi served as the school's Assistant Principal last year. He also has been Dean of Students at CBS and was Principal of Holy Cross in West Sacramento for two years. Mr. Puglisi will be Christian Brothers' first lay Principal.

As President, Brother Richard will function as the Chief Executive Officer of Christian Brothers—the person bearing overall responsibility for the school's mission, tradition, economic development, and position in the community. As Principal, Mr. Puglisi will assume responsibility for managing the school's daily operation and directing faculty, students, and school programs.

The new leadership roles at CBS are a result of a comprehensive assessment of the Province's schools and other commitments in California, Oregon, and Mexico, with particular attention to the future planning and personnel needs of each institution. Based on the Order's

assessment of Christian Brothers in Sacramento and the recommendation of the Board of Regents, the Province has approved establishment of a President's office at CBS as a means of fulfilling the goals and future direction of the school.

According to Brother Richard, the new governance model is both necessary and timely. "Christian Brothers has entered a major new era in its long history here in Sacramento," stated Brother, "and it's vital that we have the right people in their leadership positions. The Principal has to be free to manage the day-to-day operations; it's extremely demanding—more than a full-time job, especially with our conversion to co-education and expanded enrollment. I have great confidence in Domenic Puglisi, who has demonstrated qualities of leadership in the tradition of the Brothers."

"At the same time," added Brother Richard, "the school's future has to be provided for. My assignment is to take the lead in projecting our vision for CBS—to work closely with the Board of Regents in seeing that we're financially secure, that we have effective major gift and capital programs, and that we market ourselves properly and expand community support and resources. Christian Brothers has an ambitious and challenging agenda as the decade of the Nine-

ties begins. As President, I will be concentrating on these areas of development. I'm rather proud that our Provincial Administration has chosen Christian Brothers in which to establish this new form of leadership."

A third critical part of CBS's new leadership structure involves the appointment of Mr. Jeffrey Knezovich as Director of Finance. Mr. Knezovich, who is a CPA with extensive background in banking, has been on the staff for the past two years and is a CBS alumnus. Mr. Knezovich will function as Chief Financial Officer, providing direction and expertise in budgetary matters, business transactions, and financial planning, and prescribing fiscal policies that allow the school to achieve its educational goals.

Brother Richard has appointed Brother Joseph Desimone, F.S.C. as Assistant to the President. Brother Joseph returns to Christian Brothers after a five-year absence, during which he served as Assistant Principal of San Joaquin Memorial High School in Fresno. This last year Brother Joseph was assigned to Saint Mary's College in Winona, Minnesota, performing major development work for the Brother's college.

Also working closely with the President will be Mr. Tom Davis, CBS's newly appointed Director of Development. Mr. Davis has served on the Board of Regents for the last three years and brings to the position a wealth of knowledge and experience in marketing and systems analysis.

"I'm extremely pleased with the quality of leadership we'll have at Christian Brothers next year," stated Brother Richard. "Actually, we've been working on the transition for several months. I have complete confidence in our administration—both the model and the individuals. Not only are they capable, dedicated administrators, they understand the mission of the Brothers and what CBS is all about. As President, I

Recognizing the People of CBS

Jarrett Mason, a junior at Christian Brothers High School, has been awarded a full scholarship to the 1991 Telluride Association Summer Program at St. John's, Santa Fe, Seeing, Speaking, and Thinking. This year Telluride is co-sponsoring two programs with Cornell University, and one each with St. John's College in Santa Fe, NM, and Williams College. These six-week-long educational programs involve college-level seminars for gifted and highly motivated high school juniors.

Admission to the TASP is highly selective. This year's 60 participants were chosen from over 800 applications from all parts of the U.S. The Telluride Summer Programs are announced annually through the Educational Testing Service's PSAT. The Association also receives recommendations of potential applicants from school personnel...

Senior **Larry Lee** is one of 65 college-bound minority high school students who won \$750 scholarships from the American Society of Newspaper Editors Foundation. Applications were mailed to 24,000 high schools nationally, which yielded a record 508 applicants. Ninety-eight alone, came from California. Eleven judges read through the essays and transcripts to select the winners. Larry, who will at-

tend either Howard University or San Jose State, may have had an advantage over many of the applicants: he has spent many long hours working for his parents' black newspaper, The Observer...

Senior **Chris Ellingson** and sophomore **Sean Van Staveren** recently had their artwork on display in the Crocker Art Museum...Senior **Chad Lenzi** was awarded a \$1,000 scholarship to attend the California Art Institute in San Francisco...**Tracy Mendoza**, a junior, has been selected as one of the 27 semi-finalists in KOVR 13 Jefferson Awards. The award is given to people who perform outstanding acts of public service, but who receive little recognition for their efforts. There were over 150 applicants this year; the five winners will go on to national competition in Washington, D.C....

Christian Brothers was again invited to send a team to the annual Cal Poly math contest in San Luis Obispo. Twelve students, accompanied by **Mrs. Lee Wurschmidt** and **Mr. Rolf Schumann** from the math department, were entered in the various contests which were held on Saturday, April 13.

The senior written contest is open to three seniors; CBS was represented by **Jason Bacher**, **Marc Onishi**, and

Scott Onishi. The representative in the Trimathlon contest was junior **Bracken Mannion**. The remainder of the team was entered in the audience participation contest where each person has only two minutes to solve very difficult problems before the answers and possible solution methods are flashed onto the screen. Entered in this portion of the contest were **Nevin Cheung**, **Mike Collette**, **Justin DeLeon-Horton**, **Marla Gomez**, **Mike Heublein**, **Sandra Madrigal**, **Tuan Nguyen**, and **Richard Sanchez**.

Everyone will be waiting for the published results of the Trimathlon and senior examination, which were available this summer...

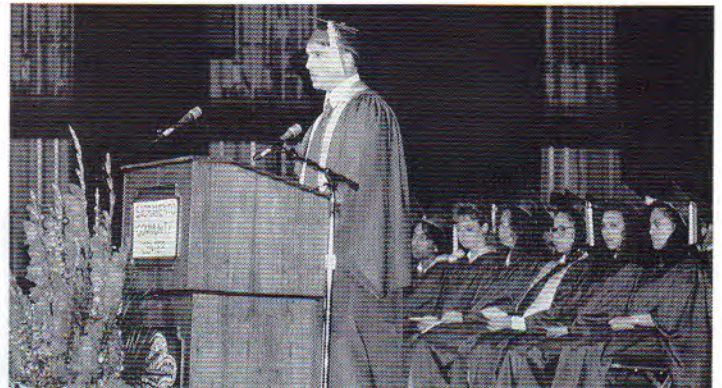

After 20 Years, Class of '71 is Still Cooking

Twenty years ago, when Doug Silva and Nathan Stanley (Class of '71) graduated from Christian Brothers, neither had an inkling that eventually they would be good friends or chefs at their own restaurants.

As Silva remembers it, "We didn't hang around together in school. Nathan was the bookworm and I was the jock." In the spring of their senior year, Stanley was elected student body president, while Silva was selected Most Valuable Player on the varsity basketball team. At the time, neither showed an inclination to cooking with zesty sauces or running a restaurant.

Today, Stanley and Silva are well-established chefs in Sacramento—and good friends. Stanley is part-owner of Americo's Italian restaurant on 20th and Capitol Streets. Silva and his wife Barbara own Silva's Sheldon Inn, a country restaurant in the town of Sheldon, southeast of Sacramento.

Ironically, both graduated from California colleges with degrees in psychology; a career path not exactly destined for an industrial kitchen. How they ended there, almost simultaneously, is interesting.

In 1977, Stanley was laboring on a master's thesis at Sacramento State, while working during the day at SMUD. A friend suggested Nathan should apply for a cook's position at the newly-opened Americo's. He quit school, left the utility company and began cooking at Americo's.

After nearly four years, Stanley decided to attend the Culinary Academy in San Francisco. He later worked in the City at such spots as Ernie's and Emilio's to gain experience. "I tried to get a condensed view of the culinary world," he recalls.

In 1984, while Americo's was undergoing a major transition, the owners invited Stanley to return and head up the kitchen staff. It was his first head chef position. Two years later he bought a 25 percent interest in the corner cafe.

Silva began cooking almost 15 years ago by starting a small catering

business with his wife Barbara, herself a cook. Back then they dreamed of eventually owning a small, quaint restaurant converted from a charming house. After a year they realized they needed more experience and both earnestly pursued cooking as a profession. In the next 10 years, Silva would work at eight different kitchens, gaining that experience.

Doug and Barbara cooked at the Fish Emporium, owned by fellow CBS grad Tom Nitopi, when it was first located on J Street. For two years Silva was employed by Scoma's of Larkspur Landing in the Bay area. Then he attended the Culinary Academy about the same time Stanley was there. By this time the two were close friends.

Silva cooked at several notable restaurants, including Ernie's (where he literally got a job through the back door). Eventually he was hired to design the kitchen and head the staff at Biba, owned by Biba Caggiano, the locally renowned Sacramento cooking author.

After Biba had been opened about a year, Doug was told of an old traveler's inn for sale in Sheldon. He and Barbara bought it and began renovating the old building in January, 1988. After three years, Silva's Sheldon Inn has earned an excellent reputation among Sacramento food critics and a loyal following.

The Sheldon Inn menu offers a broad diversity of meats, poultry and fish. It is a country home-style restaurant featuring freshly prepared American food. The restaurant is open for dinner Tuesday through Sunday and the owners serve a hearty, plentiful breakfast on Sunday. Silva says his Portuguese bean soup and lamb chops are well received; the homemade desserts—all made fresh on the premises—are a real winner.

By contrast, Americo's isn't noted for a particular entree, reports Stanley; all of the pasta dishes are excellent. However, the asparagus fettucine is a great draw in spring. "We have people who come in just for this seasonal special," he says. He also likes the Ossi

bucci and meatless canelloni.

Americo's has prospered for 14 years by carving out a niche among the many Italian restaurants in the Capital City. "Americo's falls somewhere in the middle ground," Stanley says while analyzing the competition. "We offer the kind of environment where you can go on a date, or bring the family." Entrees are moderately priced and all of the food is made of fresh ingredients.

In fact, both chefs insist on using only fresh ingredients in their foods. It's one of the underlying principles to their success.

While Americo's enjoys a prime location and established clientele, Silva's continually must promote. They organize winemaker dinners in conjunction with Northern California wineries, sponsor an annual golf tournament and distribute a quarterly newsletter to customers and restaurant reviewers. It works.

Although recreation time is scarce, Stanley and Silva continue to nurture a warm friendship. They may catch a Bay area baseball game or attend a musical performance with their wives. Talk inevitably turns to business, they say. "It's like having a support system, where you can exchange valuable information," says Doug.

"Our lives revolve around this business," says Nathan, who typically works 12 hours or more a day.

On his one day off each week Silva typically ends up at the restaurant, making repairs or sprucing the landscaping around the Inn. "The biggest challenge in operating this restaurant is maintaining a family relationship," Doug admits. "You have to work hard to keep a good perspective and avoid burnout. The reward comes when someone says, 'We really enjoyed it—we'll be back.' That's what makes it satisfying. Happy customers."

For Doug Silva and classmate Nathan Stanley, the future holds the promise of many more happy customers.

Golf Classic Returns on September 20

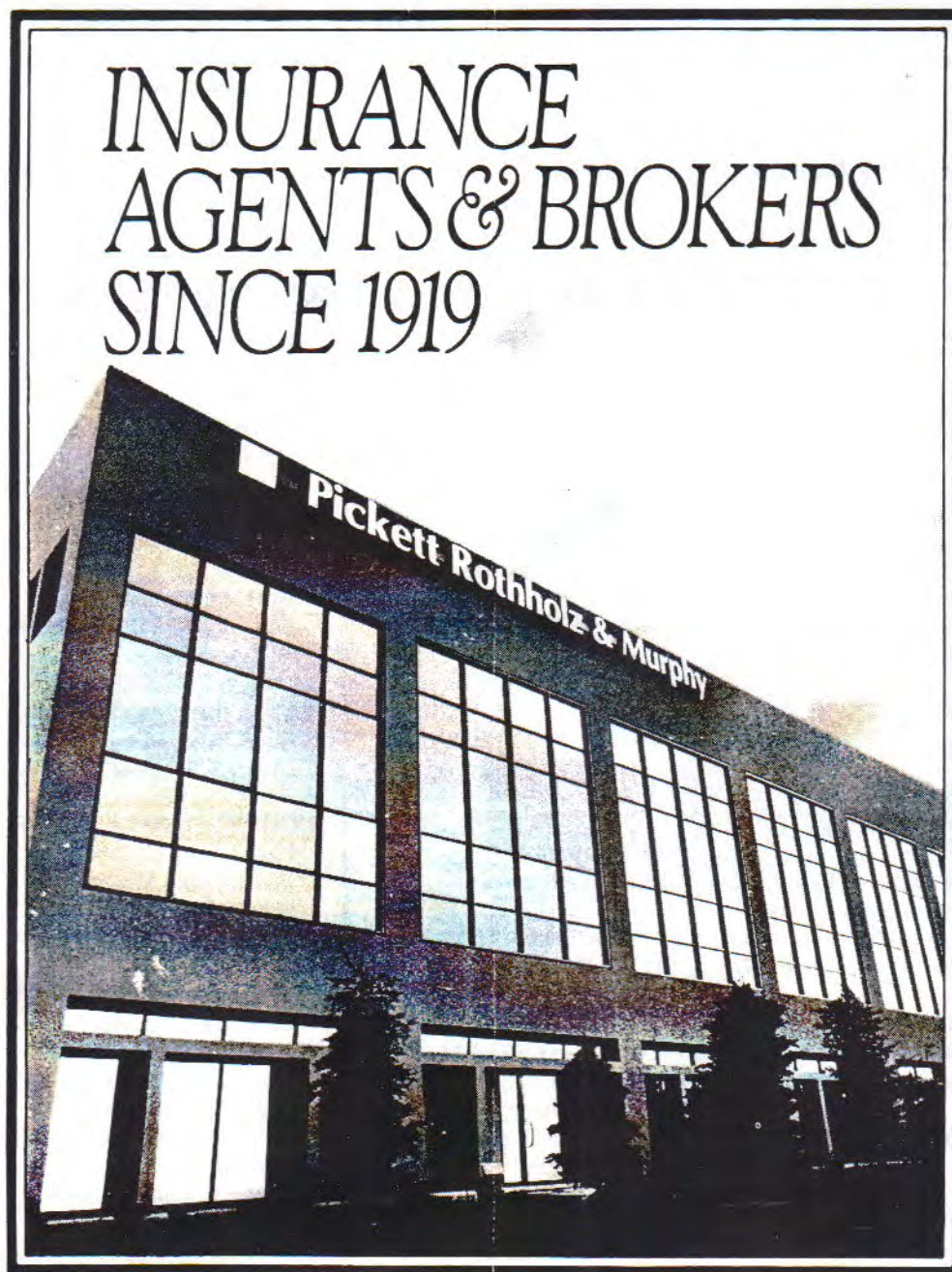
