

NEWS RELEASE

SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS

WALTER (THE DUSTER) MAILES — Background:

Former major and minor league pitcher. Saw the "first light of day" at San Quentin (outside the walls), California.

Pro-career is as follows:

Started with Seattle in Northwestern League —1914

1915-16-17 -- Brooklyn (National League)

1917-18 -- Army World War I -- PFC

1920 -- Sacramento and Cleveland.

World Series — 1920

Pitched 3rd game of World Series (relief pitcher)
5th Game of World Series -- Won 1-0

In the 3rd game pitched 7-2/3 innings without being scored on; in the 5th game pitched 16-2/3 innings without being scored upon (the total of both games).

This was the third best record in World Series competition.

Mailes retired from active playing in 1936 and entered the field of public relations with the San Francisco Seals and has continued in that field ever since. When the Giants came to San Francisco, Mailes was made assistant to Mr. Garry Schumacher, the director of public relations and now heads the speaker's bureau.

He has been active for a good many years in boys work and has traveled over the state in behalf of Little League and Pony League baseball.

Mailes also served in World War I with the Army and World War II (Recruiting Service with the United States Marines).
