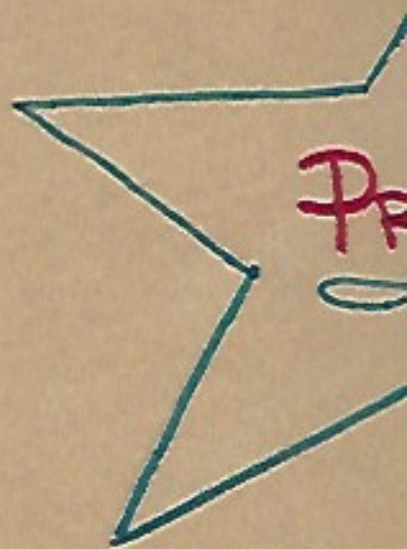

DRILL TEAM CLASS RULES

1. Gym suits and tennis shoes are required and will be worn daily. You will be fully dressed or counted as not being dressed at all. No street shoes will be allowed.
2. You are required to go to all required functions scheduled.
3. When scheduled in a routine and you cannot make it, one week notice will be required except in illness. In case of illness, parents will notify the advisor one day before performance or required activities.
4. No smoking in uniform in public.
5. Practices are for all girls. If you are not in the drill you will attend practice anyway.
6. Each girl will be responsible for her own conduct in class and at functions where Drill Team represents their school.
7. The Drill Team By-Laws will be respected and practiced.
8. All girls will be responsible for making and maintaining their uniform. Uniforms will be worn only on Drill Team occasions. Each girl is responsible to be in the uniform specified before arriving to each function.
9. Ways & Means projects are a must for Drill Team. All money raised helps to provide the necessary funds for Drill Team to function. Each girl is responsible for the required amount. Girls who do not sell the full amount will be responsible to pay for the balance.
10. Announcements will be posted at the end of each period. It is the responsibility of each girl to read the announcements.

11. Routines shall not be used for any other purpose other than Drill Team functions unless under approval of the advisor.
12. You must be within the gym doors when the bell rings or you will be marked tardy.
13. You are responsible to get dressed and be in position for role call as soon as possible (majority rule)

GAME RULES

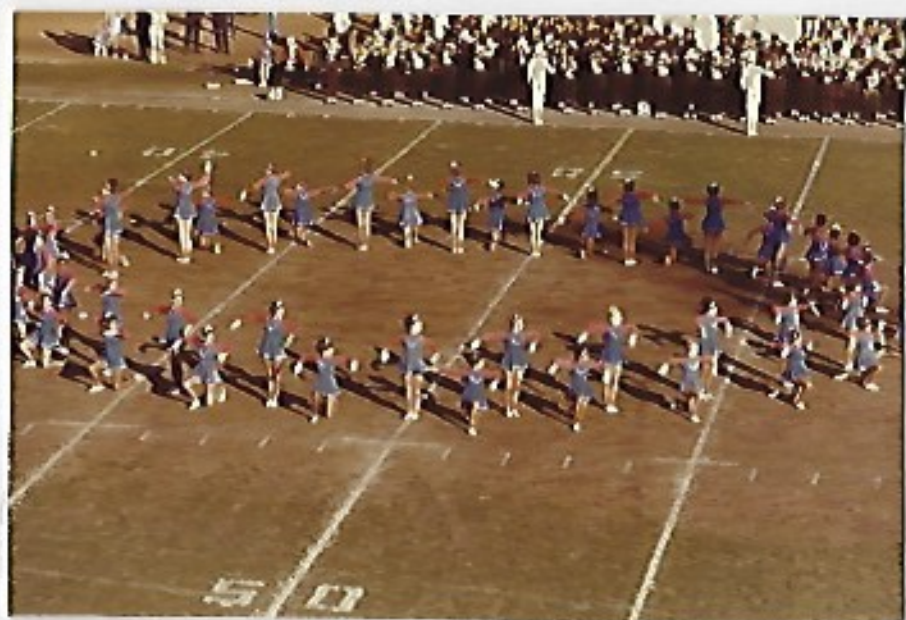
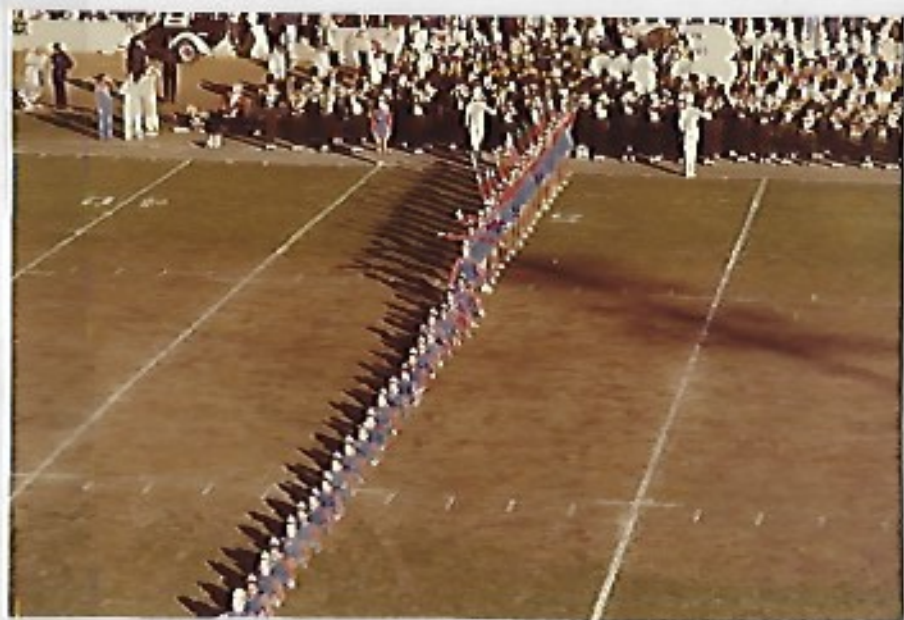
1. Every member of the team shall be at the game BY 7:00 p.m. and IN the stands at that time.

4. Each member is responsible to come to the game fully and properly dressed or the points for being dressed shall not be earned.
5. Each girl is responsible to check in with the dress committee chairman.
6. A seating chart shall be made up for each game. The girls shall sit in a block formation with friends around the outside.
7. The president will be responsible, unless otherwise designated, for the tunnel at the J.V. and Varsity games
8. Anyone violating the times agreed upon to be in the stands will be deked a point for each violation.

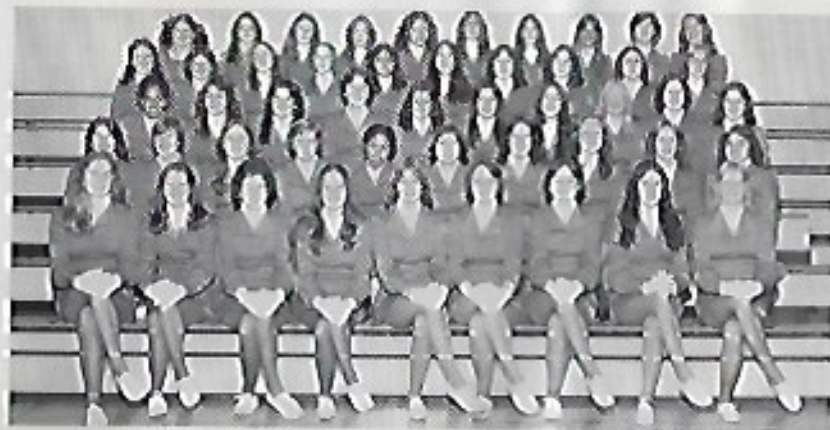
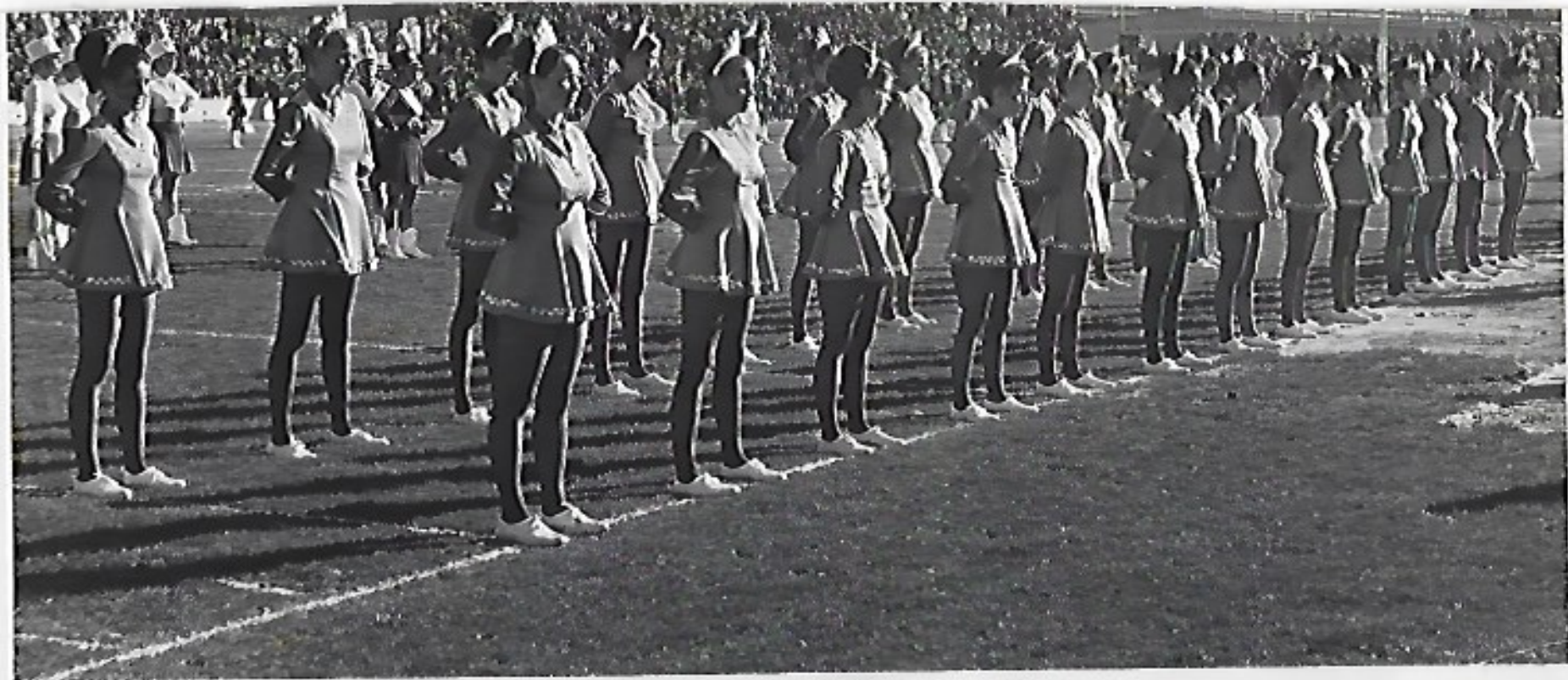
SPECIAL INVITATION

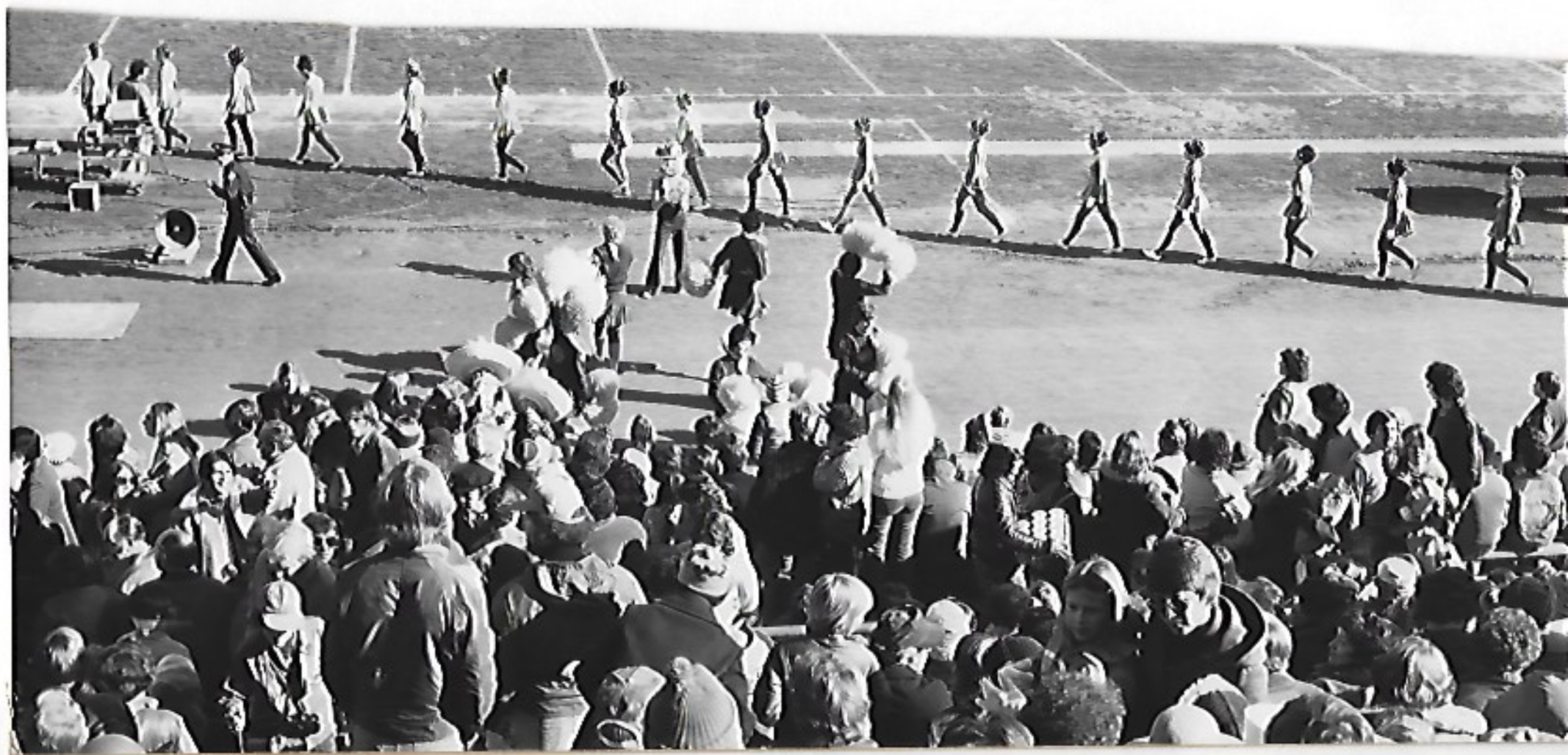

Commercial Notes

Penney's, Sears Ready Modesto Center Stores

The J. C. Penney Co. and Sears, Roebuck and Co. will open department stores Wednesday in the new Vintage Faire shopping center in Modesto, joining Weinstock's and Gottschalk's there.

About 60 smaller shops also will open Wednesday in the regional center at Pellendale Avenue and Highway 99 which ultimately will contain about 133 shops in addition to the major department stores.

Penney said the 173,000-square-foot Modesto unit will be the largest of 10 stores it will open in the U.S. during March. It also has an opening scheduled this month in Antioch, Contra Costa County.

EFT Shelved

Glendale Federal Savings and Smith's Food King Supermarkets have agreed to end an experimental electronic funds transfer (EFT) system begun in 1975.

"The program proved successful in many respects but did not generate sufficient savings balances to support its continued cost," said R. D. Edwards, Glendale Federal board chairman.

Computer terminals in 20 Smith's Southern California markets enabled Glendale Federal customers to deposit or withdraw funds or authorize direct transfer of money from their savings accounts to pay for groceries.

Other savings and loans and supermarkets are conducting similar experiments in the Sacramento area.

Bank Promotions

Bank of America reported the recent promotions of William J. Stein and Ronald S. De Mello to assistant vice president rank in its North Sacramento branch. Stein joined B of A in 1948, De Mello in 1956. Each has served in various Sacramento area branches.

BY LAWS FOR DRILL TEAM ASSOCIATION

The suggested by-laws for Bishop Manogue Drill Team outline the essential structure and specify regulations to govern the affairs of the association.

Article 1. Name: The Name of the association is the Bishop Manogue Drill Team.

Article 2. The objects: To develop moral, and to unite team work effort, for every student in the highest advantages in physical, mental and physical education.

Article 3. Basic Policies:

A. Dress will be chosen by advisers. Each girl will be responsible to make her own uniform. It can be sold if or when she leaves. Uniform is to be worn only when required by the advisers.

B. Practice will be held when necessary. Practices are for all girls. If you are not in the drill you will attend practice anyway.

Article 4. Membership and Dues: Dues will be \$.50 a semester payable September and February.

Article 5. Officers and their Elections:

A. The officers of this association will be: President, Vice President, Secretary, Financial Secretary, Treasurer and Historian.

B. Nomination will be made by open ballot. The girls names for each office will then be put to a vote.

1. Nomination for President and Vice President shall be restricted to girls who have been active members of the Drill Team for two (2) consecutive semesters.

2. Each candidate must receive 51% on the first ballot or a run off will be taken between the top two(2) candidates.

C. Elections shall be held in June and January.

D. Officers shall serve a term of 1 semester. No officers shall be eligible to the same office more than two (2) consecutive terms. Officers shall assume office on July 1 and February 1.

Article 6. Duties of the Officers:

A. The President shall preside at all the meetings of the association and assist the advisor when designated.

B. The Vice President shall act as aid to the President and in the absence of the President perform the duties of the President. Shee shall also be in charge of the telephone committee.

C. The Secretary shall keep an accurate record of teh proceedings of all meetings. She shall also conduct all necessary correspondence.

D. The Financial Secretary shall be head of ways and means committee and shall set up committees for ways and means projects.

E. The Treasurer shall collect and keep a permanent record of dues collection and will notify anyone who has not paid.

F. The Historian shall assemble and preserve a record of the activities and achievements of the association.

Article 7. All checks will be validated by one advisor.

Article 8. All money borrowed shall be approved by the advisor and will be paid before the semester ends or will be turned into the office for payment.

Article 9. Committees: Dress committee Chairman will be appointed by the advisor.

PARADE RULES

- 1 PARADE STARTS AT 8:00PM SHARP. Units not in position may be eliminated
- 2 ASSEMBLY TIME: 7:15 PM.
- 3 SPACING: 50 FEET BETWEEN UNITS. No counter movements or stopping.
- 4 NO STOPPING AT THE REVIEWING STAND!!!
- 5 DO NOT THROW ARTICLES TO THE SPECTATOR ALONG THE PARADE ROUTE
- 6 DISPLAY YOUR PARADE NUMBER ON THE LEFT FRONT OF YOUR ENTRY
- 7 REVIEWING STAND AND JUDGES WILL BE ON JAY STREET BETWEEN 9th AND 10th
- 8 120 STEPS PER MINUTE. (full steps)
- 9 PARADE MARSHALS AND OFFICIAL MUST BE OBEYED AT ALL TIMES
- 10 PARADE COMMITTEE RESERVES THE RIGHT TO ELIMINATE ENTRIES NOT WITHIN THE DIGNITY OF THE PARADE, AT ANYTIME.
- 11 WHEN YOU REACH THE DISPERSAL AREA AT 17th AND JAY STREETS, PLEASE, KEEP MOVING TO CLEAR THE AREA FOR FOLLOWING ENTRIES
- 12 AWARDS, WILL PRESENTED AT THE CONCLUSION OF THE PARADE IN THE CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS. 9th AND EYE STREETS
