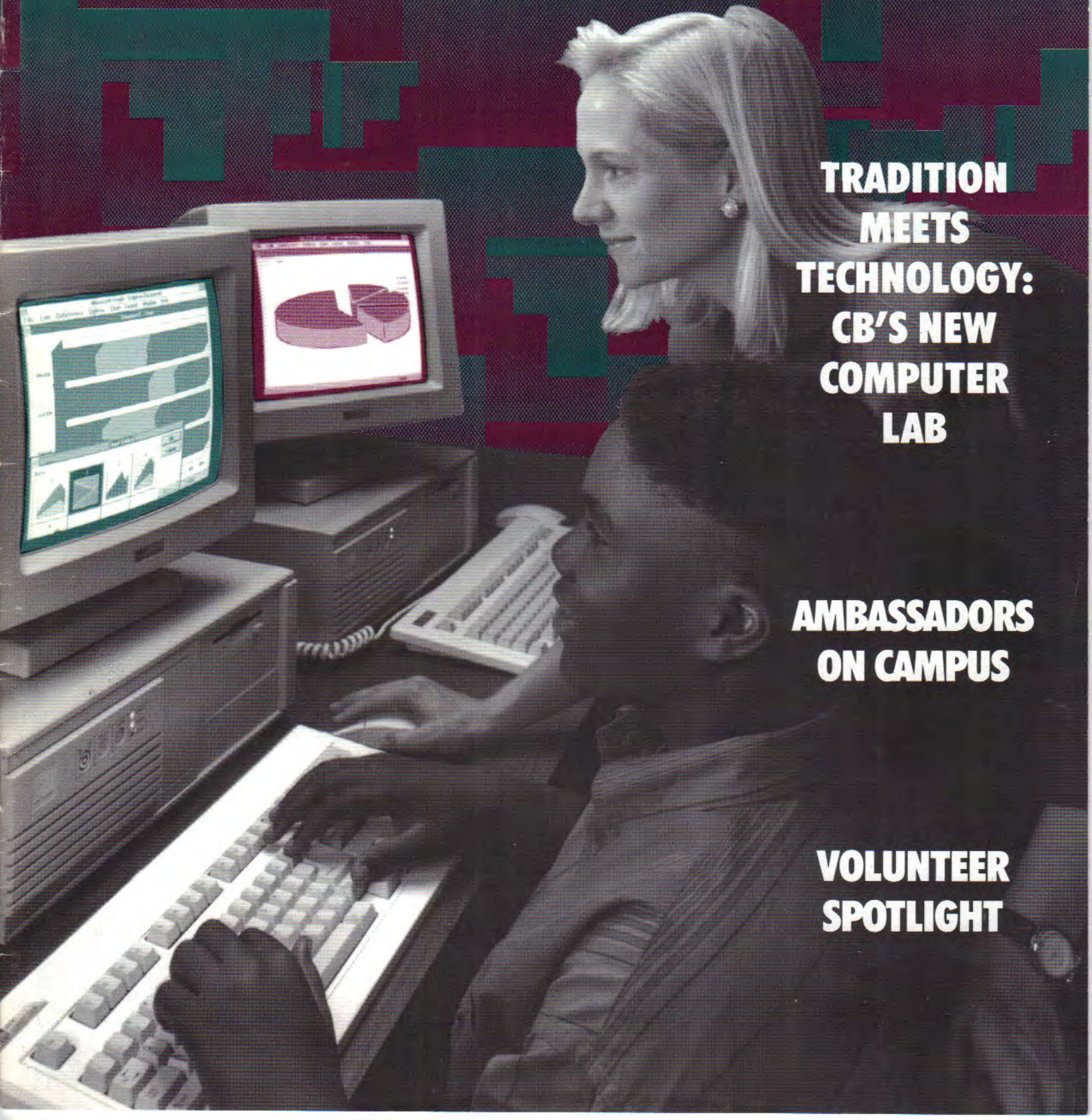

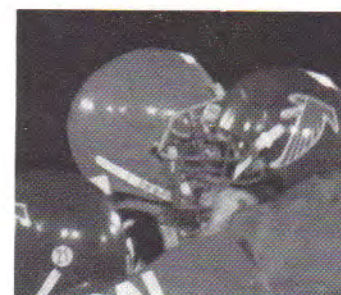

Hi-tech Approach to Learning

Computerized Classroom Funded by Gift Bequest, Corporate Donation

The combination of a gift bequest from a Christian Brothers alum and a corporate donation from an innovative bay area computer company have made possible a brand new state-of-the-art computer lab on the CB campus this year. Funds for the project came from the estate of Donald Futterer (class of '29) while Oakland-based California Computer Options provided equipment at cost, plus donated all the software, training, and installation for the computerized classroom. Both sources deserve recognition for their generosity and commitment to Christian Brothers.

Recognizing that today computers are used in virtually all aspects of our society, the faculty and administration at Christian Brothers realized the school needed to provide students

with more opportunities to use computers in their studies. While computer classes are currently offered at Christian Brothers, the new computer lab provides for the expansion of computer use into all subject areas of the school's curriculum. For example, teachers of any subject can use the lab for their students to complete class assignments or to administer class tests. Students can also use the lab to do homework assignments or to do special projects. The lab contains 33 personal computers networked into a mainframe system which is administered by the instructor.

Since such an investment in computers is very expensive and outside the bounds of the school's current operating budget, Brother Joseph Desimone, President, determined that this project would be an excellent way to make use of part of the funds from the bequest that Mr. Futterer left to the school in 1989.

Donald Futterer was a life-time resident of Sacramento who enjoyed a long and distinguished career as a public accountant.

He graduated from Christian Brothers High School in 1929 and remained an ardent supporter of the school throughout his life. Upon his death, the school learned that Mr. Futterer had left Christian Brothers a gift of over \$100,000 to be used in the best way the school saw fit. "We are fortunate to have alumni like Mr. Futterer who remember Christian Brothers in their wills," explains Brother Joseph. "More and more we are finding that gift bequests from alumni are making substantial contributions to the future of the school."

Having determined how to fund the project, Brother Joseph began looking for help in securing the necessary equipment needed for the computer lab. California Computer Options seemed like a natural choice. The company, owned by Mr. Rand Morimoto, has worked closely with educational institutions and non-profits in the bay area and throughout the country. Started by a group of students from UC Berkeley seven years ago, today California Computer Options has grown to a 7.5 million dollar corporation with over 40 employees. Brother Joseph became familiar with the company when he met Rand Morimoto in his MBA program at St. Mary's College. It didn't take long for Brother Joseph to approach his fellow classmate about helping Christian Brothers purchase the equipment needed to make the computer lab a reality. "Our students today deserve the very best, in both instruction and in equipment like computers," explains Brother Joseph. Brother Joseph knew that Rand Mori-

moto shared in this vision and that he would be receptive to a request for help. "Rand was very excited to learn what we are doing with computers at Christian Brothers," recalls Brother Joseph. "He didn't hesitate for a moment before getting involved."

"We were eager to be a part of this project at Christian Brothers," explains Mr. Morimoto. "We believe in the concept of providing college-bound kids with access to computers so that they can go on to achieve success. Computer skills can keep a young person off the streets and on the right path. I know computers kept me out of trouble in my younger days," he continues.

Mr. Morimoto secured the equipment needed for the lab at great savings to the school. He arranged direct donations for the computer software and provided the school with all installation and technical services at no charge. "Because of our position in the (computer) industry, we were able to get software at no cost and only paid actual cost for the equipment," Mr. Morimoto explained. All totaled, Mr. Morimoto and his company saved Christian Brothers over \$45,000!

School principal Domenic Puglisi has been conducting in-service computer training for the entire teaching faculty so that the lab can be utilized to its fullest potential. "Our goal is to have a computer literate faculty that understands the potential use of computers in all academic areas so that we can integrate the use of computers across the curriculum."

Your Planned Gift Today Will Ensure the Future of CB Tomorrow

Among the many giving opportunities friends of Christian Brothers have to choose from, perhaps the least understood—yet most beneficial to the future of the school—is planned giving.

The term planned giving is generally used to describe a gift made from a donor's accumulated assets as part of an overall estate plan. Under such circumstances, the principal of the gift would not be available to Christian Brothers until the gift matures, either with the death of the contributor or surviving beneficiary or at the end of a specific period of time.

Planned giving provides a way for those committed to Christian Brothers to give substantial gifts to the school without impacting their current standard of living. In fact, planned giving can pro-

vide income as well as tax advantages. The income can be for a lifetime or for a fixed number of years. In most cases, at the maturity of the gift Christian Brothers would receive the charitable remainder or principal. Such large gifts can then be used to make major improvements for the school. The school's new computer lab (which was made possible by a planned gift from Donald Futterer), is an example of the impact planned giving can have on the education students receive at Christian Brothers.

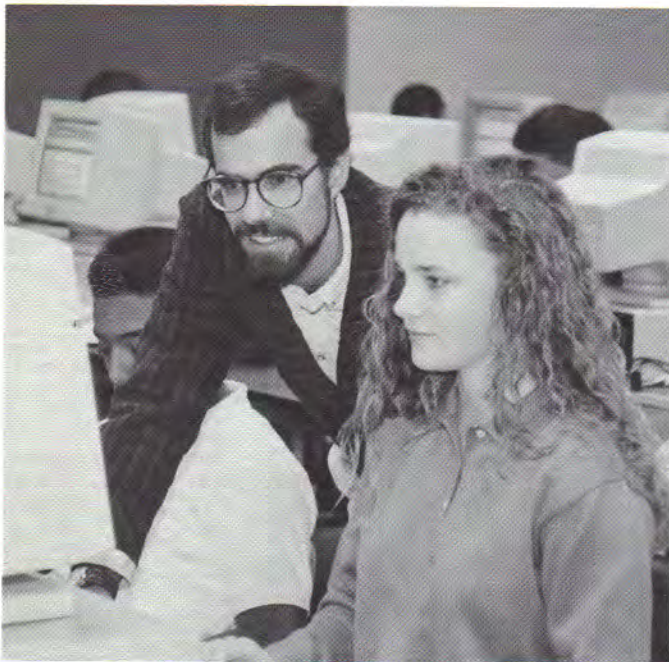
There are a variety of planned giving methods for friends of Christian Brothers to consider:

Bequests. A provision in a person's will that sets aside a sum of money or portion of the estate for distribution to Christian Brothers. It can be a small

amount or large, and can be given without restrictions—such as in the case of Donald Futterer's gift to the school—or it can be designated for a specific purpose such as tuition assistance for students at Christian Brothers.

Charitable Remainder Unitrust. A contract with Christian Brothers whereby a contributor transfers money, stock certificates, personal or real property to the school which then pays the contributor income for life or for a fixed period of time. Income is received annually and will vary from year to year depending on market fluctuations. At the end of the contract period, the principal gift becomes the property of Christian Brothers.

Both teachers and students have expressed their enthusiasm for the new computer lab. "Today you have to know how to use a com-

puter to survive in college and out in the work force," comments Brian Clemons, a freshman at Christian Brothers. "I am amazed by the applications the computer lab has in our daily instruction," adds Marnie Sunderbruch who teaches freshman literature and composition and is Chair of the English Department at Christian Brothers.

Although the gift from Mr. Futterer and the generous help from Mr. Morimoto have enabled Christian Brothers to establish the computer lab, Mr. Morimoto is quick to remind the school that continued support is necessary to ensure the lab is used to

its fullest potential. "Now that they have the tools to learn, the students will continue to need support for the purchase of specific soft-

ware that will maximize the benefit that a facility like this provides to students." Morimoto cited math and language tutorials as obvious examples of software that will be needed for students to make the most of the new lab in the future.

Projects like the new computer lab could not be undertaken were it not for the generous donations of alumni like Donald Futterer and corporate supporters like California Computer Options. Together, these gifts can insure the future of Christian Brothers. While Mr. Futterer probably never imagined that his gift to Christian Brothers would make possible a state-of-the-art computerized classroom, he would no doubt be pleased to know that this high-tech approach to learning is benefitting so many students today.



Work Hard, Play Hard

Volunteers are the Backbone of Christian Brothers

When friends and patrons of Christian Brothers attend the annual Wine Tasting Extravaganza, play in the annual Golf Classic, or satisfy their hunger at a CB crab feed, they may not be aware of all the hard work that our volunteers put in to make these events possible. Volunteers are the backbone of Christian Brothers' fundraising efforts. Already this school year, CB alums and parent volunteers have contributed their time and talents to a number of events that were overwhelming successes. For those who don't know the faces behind the scenes of these events, meet Chris Ledesma, Carol Kenobbie, Kevin Valine, Shirley Vicari, Jay Riley, Monte and Sharon Endicott and Gomez Delgado—just a few of the many dedicated people working for the students at Christian Brothers.

Christian Brothers started the new school year off in style thanks to the efforts of Chris Ledesma (class of '85), Chair of the Wine Tasting Extravaganza held on September 11, 1992. Chris, who is also the Secretary of the Alumni Association Board of Directors, is the son of Augie and Pat Ledesma and the younger brother of Augie, Jr., Marty and Greg, all of whom are CB graduates. Chris's family has a long tradition of involvement with Christian Brothers so it is not surprising that he volunteered to chair one of the Alumni Association's biggest fundraisers. Chris explains his reason for

chairing the Wine Tasting as a personal one. "I think it's important that we get younger alums like myself back to the school, and the Wine Tasting is an excellent vehicle for that," Chris explains. Chris is the Government Offices Coordinator with Business Media Services, a news monitoring and research firm based in Sacramento. He used his professional media experience to get extensive coverage of this year's event on radio, television and in print and was largely responsible for making the Wine Tasting event a huge success. "I'm ready to do it again next year," Chris said enthusiastically. "Although it's a lot of hard work, the rewards are well worth it. The Wine Tasting is a great chance to see former classmates as well as raise money for the students at Christian Brothers."

Chris got a lot of help planning the Wine Tasting event from fellow alum Carol Kenobbie (class of '63 BA). Carol is a veteran Wine Tasting organizer herself, having helped plan last year's event as well. She is the Vice President of the Alumni Association and, along with husband Larry, is one of the Association's biggest supporters.

While Chris and Carol were busy planning the Wine Tasting, Kevin Valine (class of '73), Shirley Vacari (class of '58 BA) and other members of the Alumni Association were con-

centrating their efforts on the annual Alumni Golf Classic held on September 28, 1992 at Silverado Country Club in Napa.

Kevin, who is also President of the Alumni Association, chaired the event for the second year in a row. While his duties as Vice President of McGee and Theilen, (an independent insurance brokerage), are often demanding, Kevin somehow still found time to carry out his responsibilities as Alumni Association President and as Chair of the Golf Classic. Kevin has been involved with the Alumni Association for the past four years and has contributed countless hours to the various activities of the Association. A former Christian Brother himself, he and wife Susan now send their daughter, Jennifer, to Christian Brothers. As a alum and a parent Kevin understands the vital role fundraisers like the golf tournament play in providing our students with a quality education. "I want students to have the same kind of educational experience I had at CB," Kevin explains. "That's why we (the Alumni Association) have taken on events like the golf tournament—to help the Brothers in their educational mission."

Kevin received a lot of help this year from the members of the Golf Classic committee. Among them is Shirley Vicari (class of '58 BA) who was instrumental in organizing the four-

somes for the tournament. Shirley, whose son Jim is a CB graduate, is Office Manager for the California State University Telecommunications Services and has spent her entire career working in the telecommunications industry. When she isn't busy managing the telecommunications office at CSUS, Shirley dedicates much of her time to Christian Brothers. With the support of her husband Tom, and children Jennifer and Jim, she served on the Alumni Association Board of Directors for six years before going off the board this year to allow others the opportunity to serve. "It's important to get new blood in any organization," explains Shirley. But even though Shirley has gone off the Alumni Board, she remains active in the Association and dedicated to the annual golf tournament. "It was so much fun," she explains, "and next year's is going to be bigger and better than ever."

Of course, no Alumni event takes place without Jay Riley (honorary Class of '60) helping behind the scenes. Jay, who manages a statewide transit funding program for the State of California, was instrumental in both the wine tasting and in the golf tournament. He has been involved with most of the school's support groups at one time or another. He was active in the PSO while his son Kevin was a student at CB, and was president of the Boosters as well. "It's the dedication of the teachers and the quality of the education students receive at Christian Brothers that keep me involved with the school," explains Jay. With his personal dedication to CB, it's easy to see why Jay was the first honorary

alum elected to the Alumni Association's board of directors.

The Alumni Association hasn't been the only support group busy this fall. Our Parent Service Organization sponsored its annual Crab Feed on October 24th and raised twice the amount projected. Monte and Sharon Endicott are largely responsible for the event's success. Despite the fact that Monte and Sharon opened a new business earlier this year (Endicott's Gourmet Coffees and Muffins)—

they somehow found the time to organize the Crab Feed. And with the assistance of veteran Crab Feed planner Gomez Delgado, put on a first rate dinner. 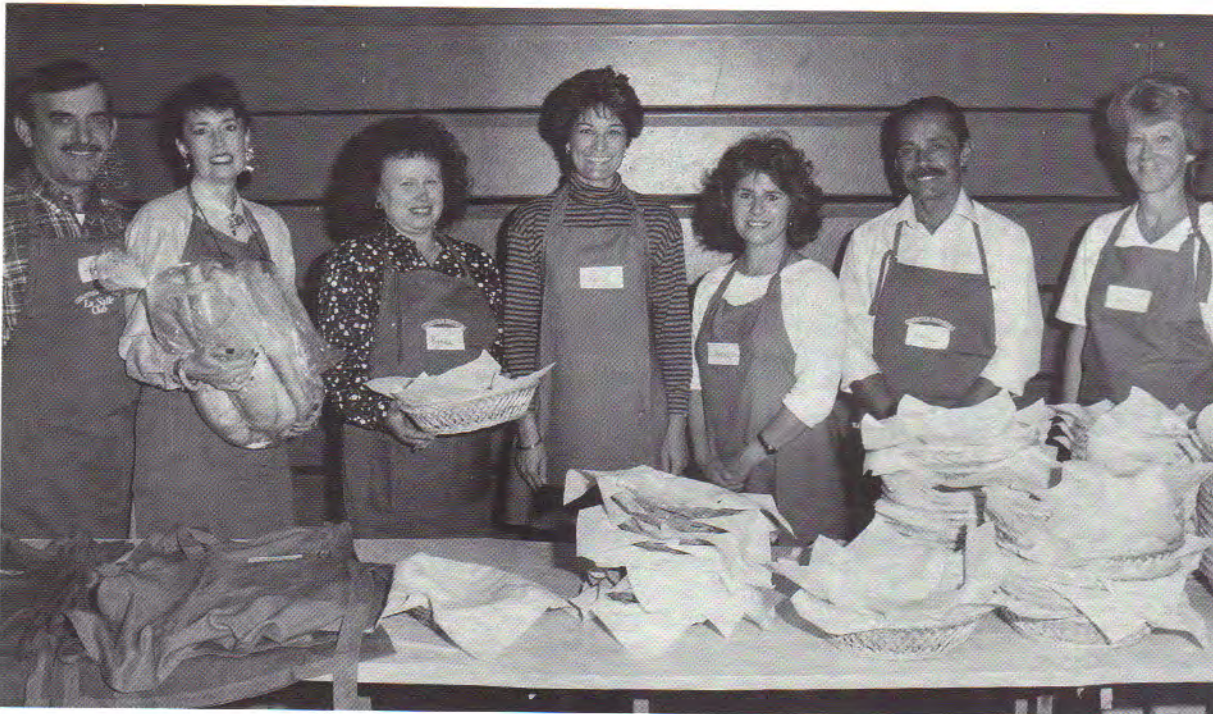

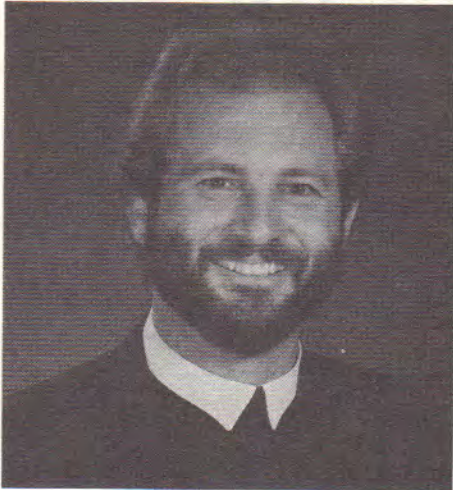

When Carol Kenobbie returned to Sacramento in 1986 after living for nine years in Cincinnati, Ohio, the native Sacramentan was ready to re-establish ties with old friends and get back to being involved with the community. "I love Sacramento," explains Carol. "You have to move away to appreciate what we have here."

Some may recognize Carol by her maiden name, Carol Ochoae. She grew up in the Land Park area and attended kindergarten through eighth grade at Holy Spirit School before moving on to St. Joseph's Academy and then to Bishop Armstrong High School where she graduated in 1963. In the meantime, Carol and Larry began raising a family. Their son, Ken, and daughter, Tami, were destined to have a different childhood experience than their parents however, as Larry's job took them to Cincinnati in 1977. "The midwest was a great place to raise kids," says Carol, "but we were ready to return to Sacramento in 1986 when Larry was transferred back."

Upon arriving in Sacramento, Larry and Carol found themselves eager to re-establish ties with friends and former classmates from their school days. But Carol still felt like she had no grounding in the present because her high school no longer existed. Daughter Tami had enrolled in St. Francis and that school had made overtures to Bishop Armstrong graduates like Carol—but she never felt like she really belonged at St. Francis.

It wasn't until Carol came back to Christian Brothers that she found a connection to her past. "Once I set foot back on the campus I re-

alized this is where I should be," Carol recalls. Both she and Larry were asked to serve on the Alumni Association Board and neither hesitated for a moment. "Getting involved again with Christian Brothers has been fun," explains Carol. We've re-established friendships and helped make a difference for the students who have come after us."

Carol, who is Vice President of the Alumni Board this year, says that not only has her involvement on the Alumni Association Board been an enjoyable experience, but it has been a learning experience as well. "I've learned so much from Doug Demetre (past president of the Board) and Kevin Valine (current Board President) these past two years that I sometimes feel I get more out of volunteering than what I put in."

Charitable Remainder Annuity Trust. Similar to the Charitable Remainder Unitrust except that annual income received is always the same.

Charitable Lead Trust. The opposite concept of a charitable remainder unitrust or annuity trust in that income from the trust property is received by Christian Brothers for a specified number of years, but at the end of the stated period of time, the trust becomes the property of the individuals named by the donor, such as children, or it can revert back to the donor.

Charitable Gift Annuity. A contract between a contributor and Christian Brothers whereby the school promises to pay a specified amount of money each year in exchange for the gift property.

Football, Volleyball, Soccer, Tennis & Cross Country Tales

Christian Brothers sports fans will be happy to know that the Falcon's athletic program is again on the fast track toward success.

Christian Brothers began the 1992-93 school year on a winning note by defeating Jesuit High School in the 23rd Annual Holy Bowl game on September 18, 1992 at Hornet Stadium on the CSUS campus. As the favorite going into the contest, CB football systematically took apart the 'Big Red Machine' after a slow start in the first half of the game. Behind 16-0 at half time, CB rallied back to win the game 28-16. Piloted by the strong arm of senior quarterback, Kevin McKechnie, the Falcons picked apart the Jesuit defense and held back the offense en route to a resounding victory. After the Holy Bowl victory, Christian Brothers went on to post wins over Valley High School (coached by former CB coaches, Dave Hoskins and Mel Fontes), McClatchy and Johnson. In a close contest with Cordova, the Falcons rallied back from a 14-0 deficit acquired within the first two minutes of the game only to come up short 31-24. While McKechnie was the driving force behind the Falcons' success this season, other players such as seniors Zane Madrigal, Brian Piacentini, Jason Coloma, Justin Carney, Ryan Petta, Matt Bettencourt, juniors Mark Orr, David Desmond, Ramon Ruiz and Sean Scully, and Sophomore stand-out Mike Cholak gave the Christian Brothers the necessary offensive and defensive clout to move the Falcons toward a Metro League title and eventual berth in the Sac-Joquin Section Playoffs.

The Junior Varsity and Freshmen football teams saw continued improvement weekly throughout the season. While both teams lost to Jesuit in the Holy Bowl, the JV came on

strong for a 3-0 record in league play with two games to go in the season and the freshman were even at 1-1. "We expected our football team to set the tone for the school year and are confident that other sports will put CB in the lead as well," commented CB Athletic Director Danny Delgado.

Another team who's future looks bright is the CB women's tennis team. Before the forfeiture, the team was headed into the Sac-Joquin Section Playoffs with a 5-2-1 record. Led by seniors, Mark Poletti, Mario Moreno, Dennis Fox, Eric Larsen, Hugo Lima, Jorge Hernandez and goalie Paulo Ferreira, the Falcons had a solid second place standing and would have participated in post-season action. While the situation was disappointing for everyone, team members rose above their
