Several minute details were completed Friday as workers laid down four-by-eight-foot planks along the sidelines for cerebral palsy patients who will be on hand for the 1 p.m. kickoff and the Fulton Avenue Optimists and Sacramento Spirits volunteered their services for the big post-game party at Country Club Centre Sunday night.

Gates will open at 10 a.m. Sunday, when some 30,000 persons — if every ticket sold is used — will begin streaming into the stands and competing for the first-come-first-served seats.

Actually, the newly refurbished stadium may hold closer to 24,000 than the 25,000 billing. There were 3,000 temporary seats installed this week, but even if everybody shows up, game director Jim Jorgensen figures he can accommodate everyone. "We're doing our very best," he said Friday. Toward this end, bands participating in pre-game and halftime activities will be placed in special seating around the field.

Because of some criticism in the handling of tickets which found the game a sellout the first day, Jorgensen said "we'd accept suggestions on how to distribute them." Saints and Sinners, which kicked off the sale, sold more than 900 the first night and ran out of tickets.

"Our coaches did a terrific job of preparing us. Oh, I still weigh 160. That's what I weighed through Pierce High at Arbuttle and at Sac State. But now I'm 25, and it takes a little longer to recover."

Rangel's Outstanding Player Trophy was his third, having won it in '75 and '76. Actually, the first year it was for MVP. He's a graduate of Bella Vista High School, Sierra College and SSU.

Dave Hotell, head coach of the winners, allowed as "it's a good way to go out. I told them at our pre-game breakfast that this would be my last year."

Hotell, athletic director and football coach at Sacramento High School, has been with the SPD since the Pig

orbacks' running back, Mike Schuurin, didn't win some kind of an award — MVP or Outstanding Player. However, he'll try again next year because his wife-to-be, Stephanie Stathos, told him it would be all right.

"We'll be married May 20," said Mike, breaking the announcement ahead of time.

It must be reported that the oldest player of all the Pig Bowlers — Razorback Lou Patur, 54 — definitely will not retire. He'll be back for No. five.

Indeed, why should the poor man's George Blonda quit? His two PATs Sunday gave him five-for-five in Pig Bowls, and he's one-for-two on field goals — a 37-yarder.

Back to the Bacon Bombers, and it should be mentioned that there were 16 new starters.

"That's quite a few," noted Hotell. "Guys like Martinez, Lister, Daniels, Tony Ramirez, Bobbie Robinson — he played under me at Sac High — and the others. Who'd have known those guys would be around."
