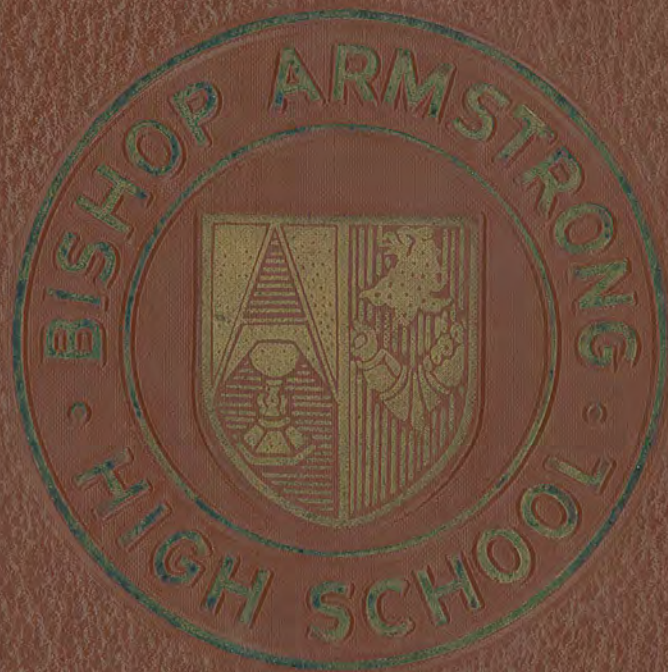

It is to the memory of this far-sighted Pontiff, whose death we all have mourned, that we humbly dedicate the 1959 *Crest*.

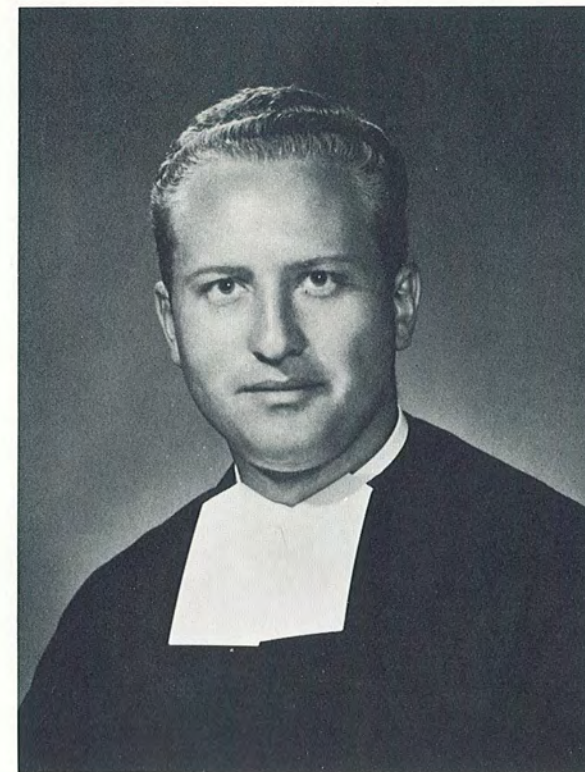

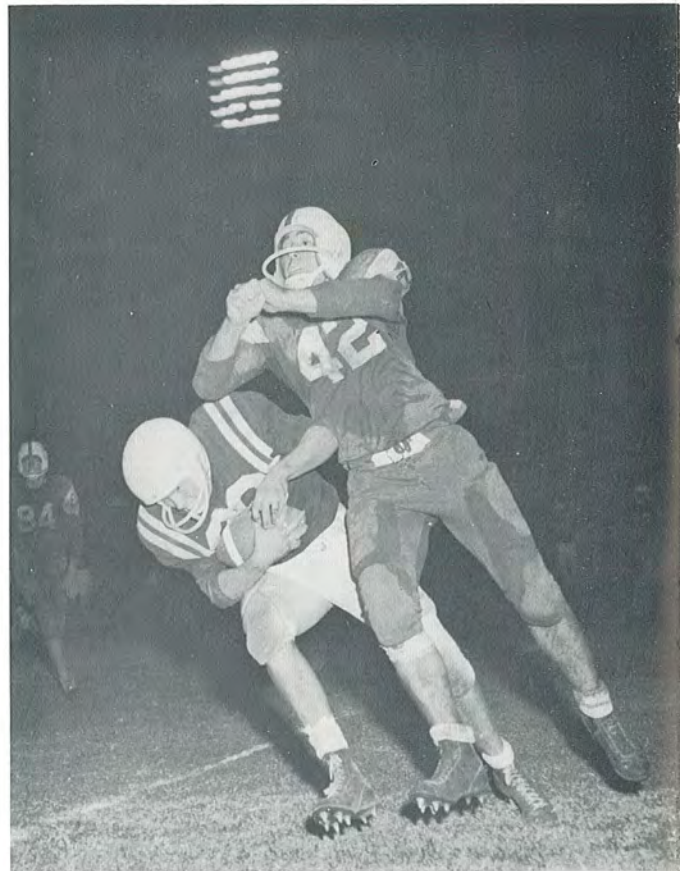

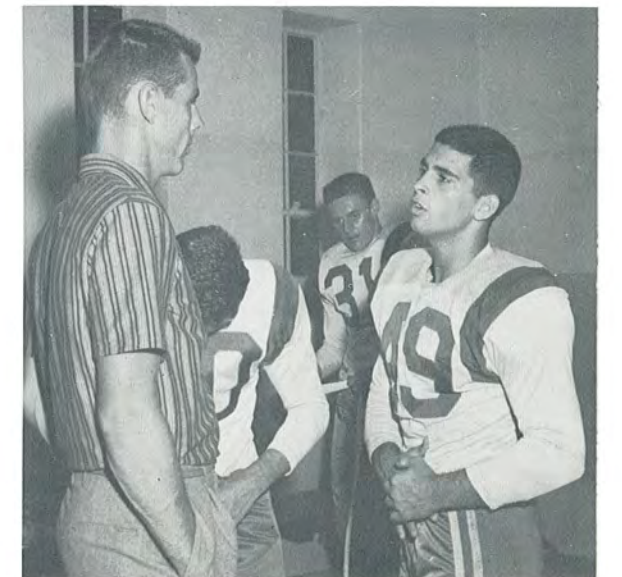

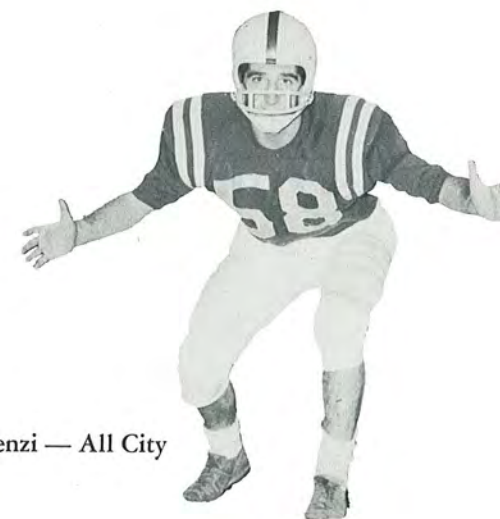

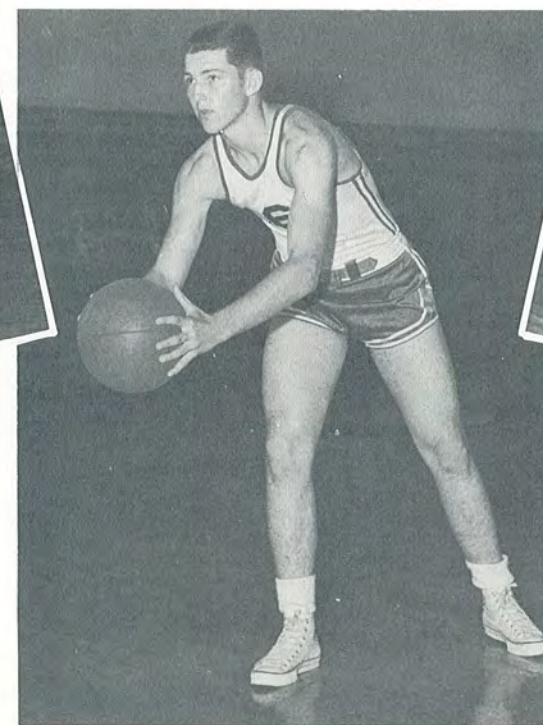

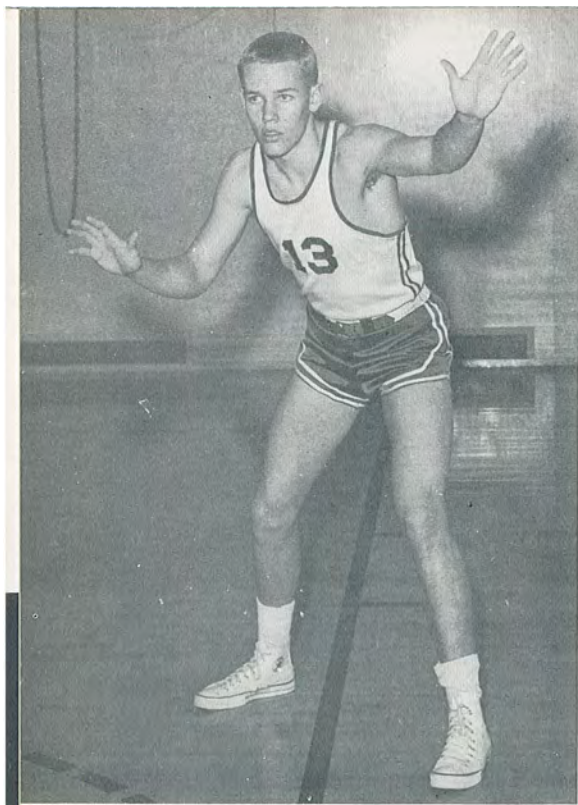

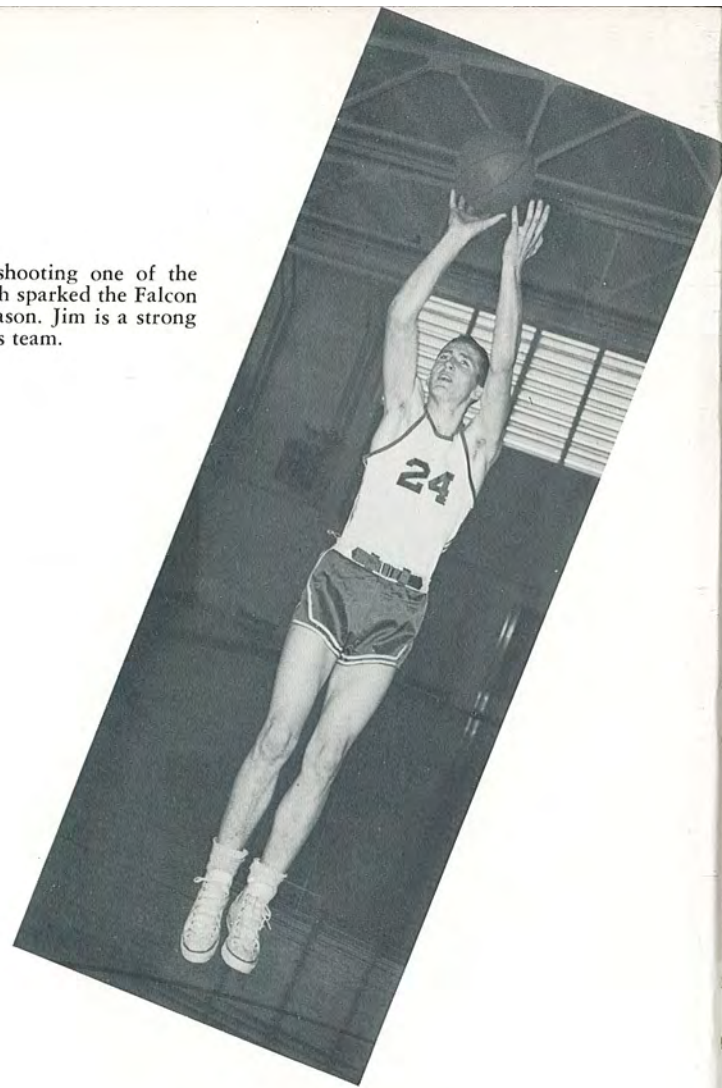

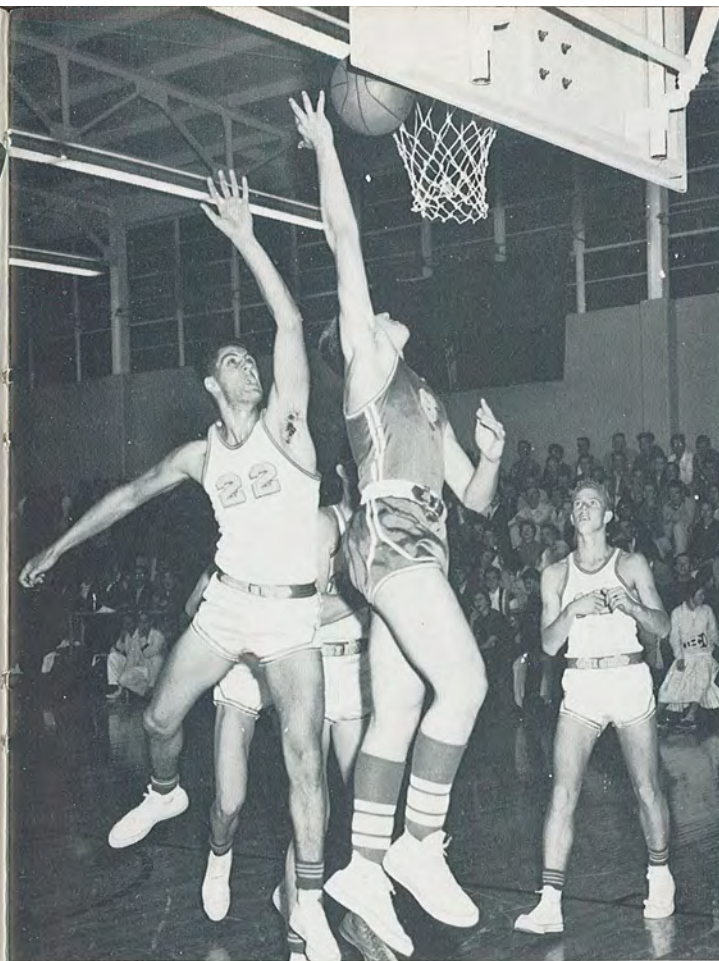

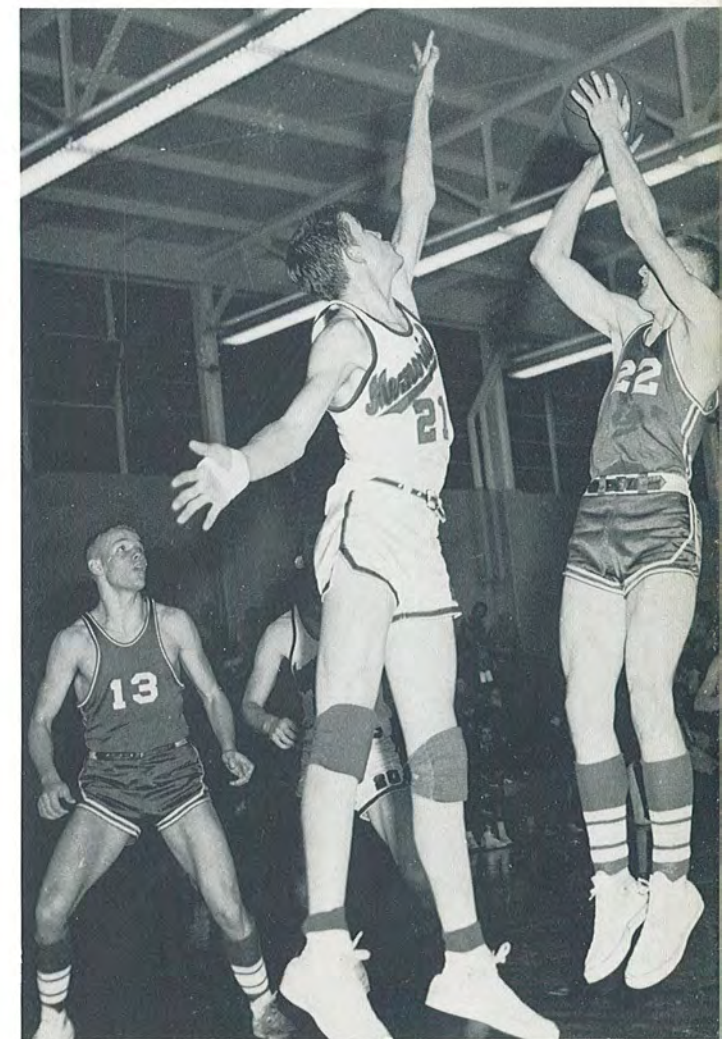

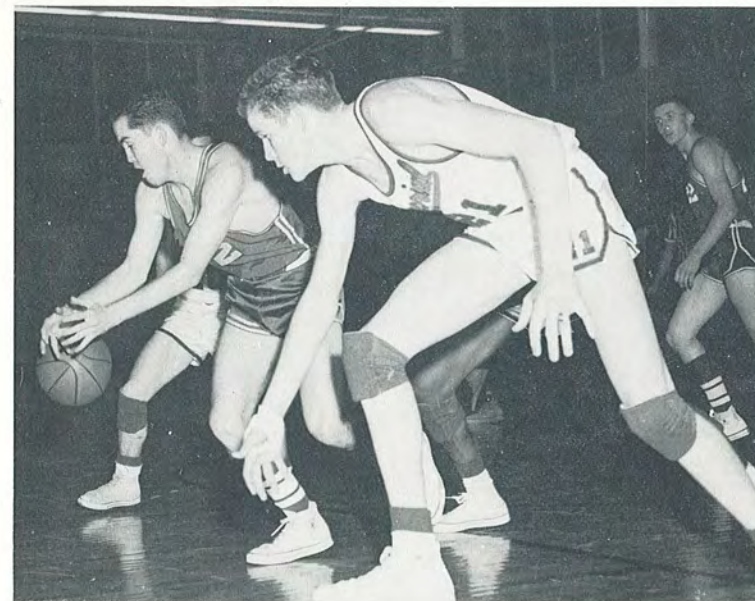

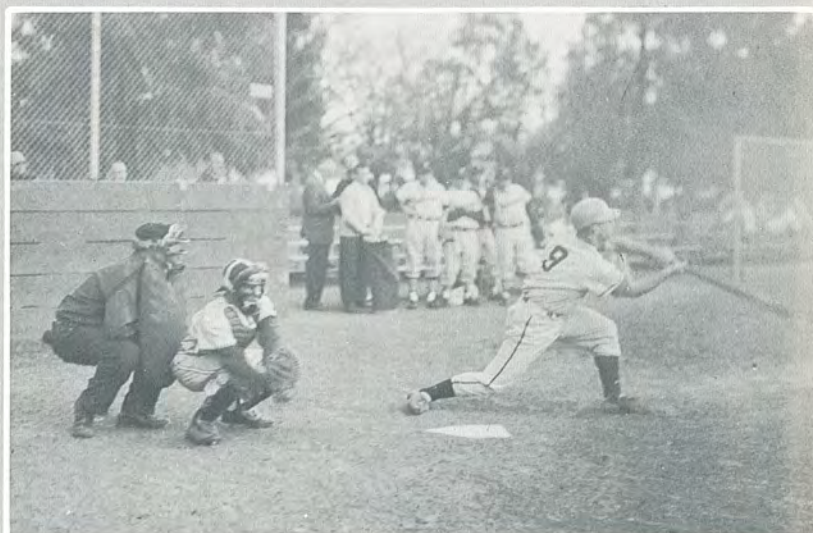

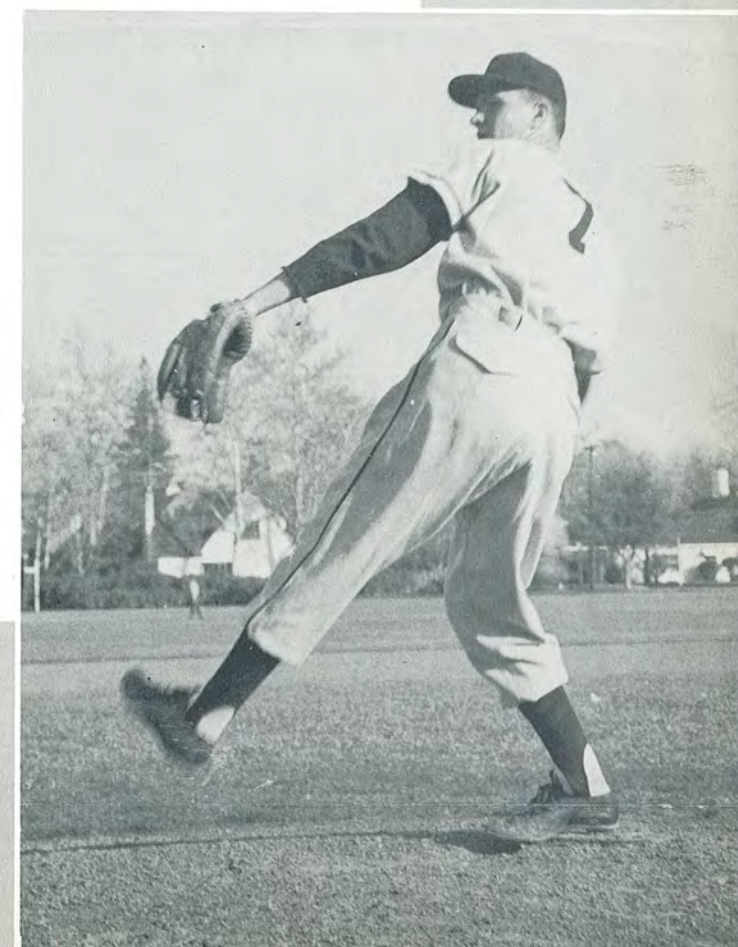
