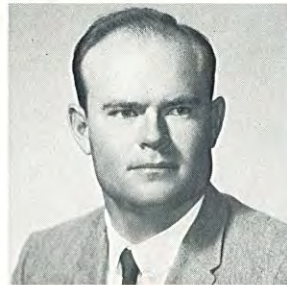

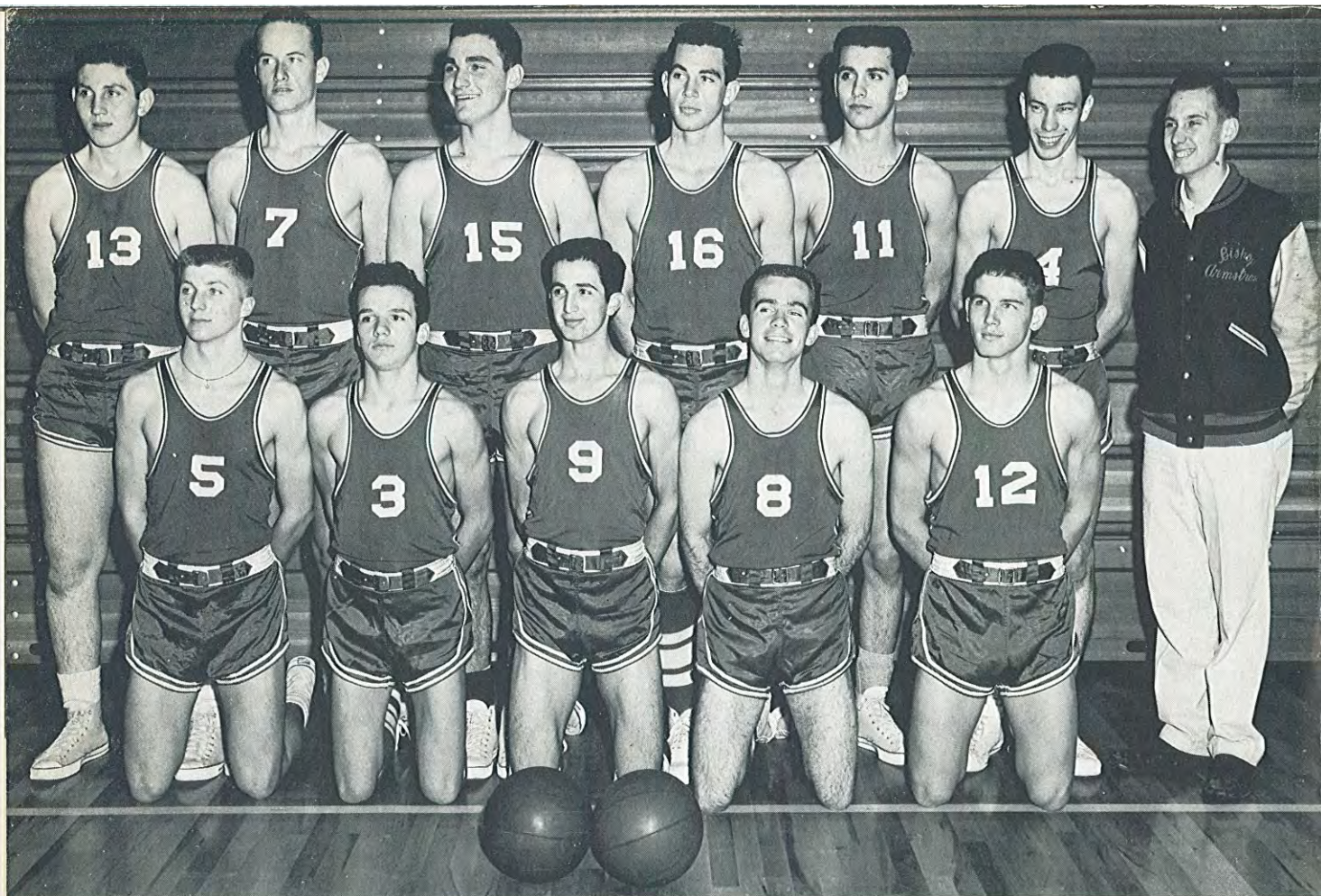

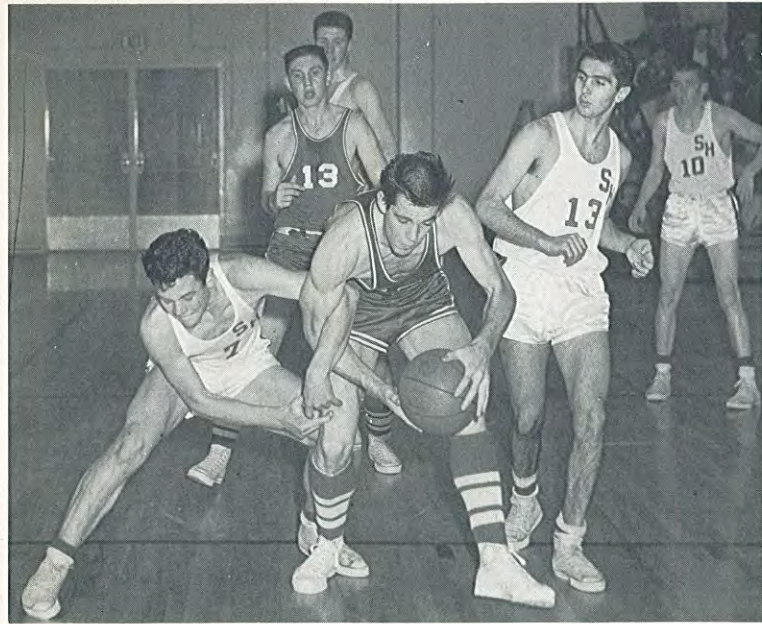

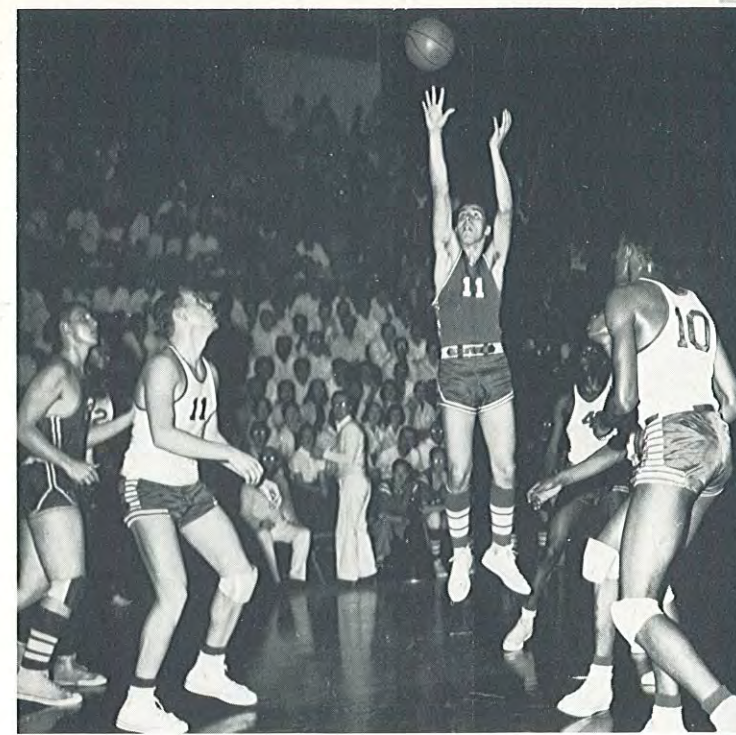

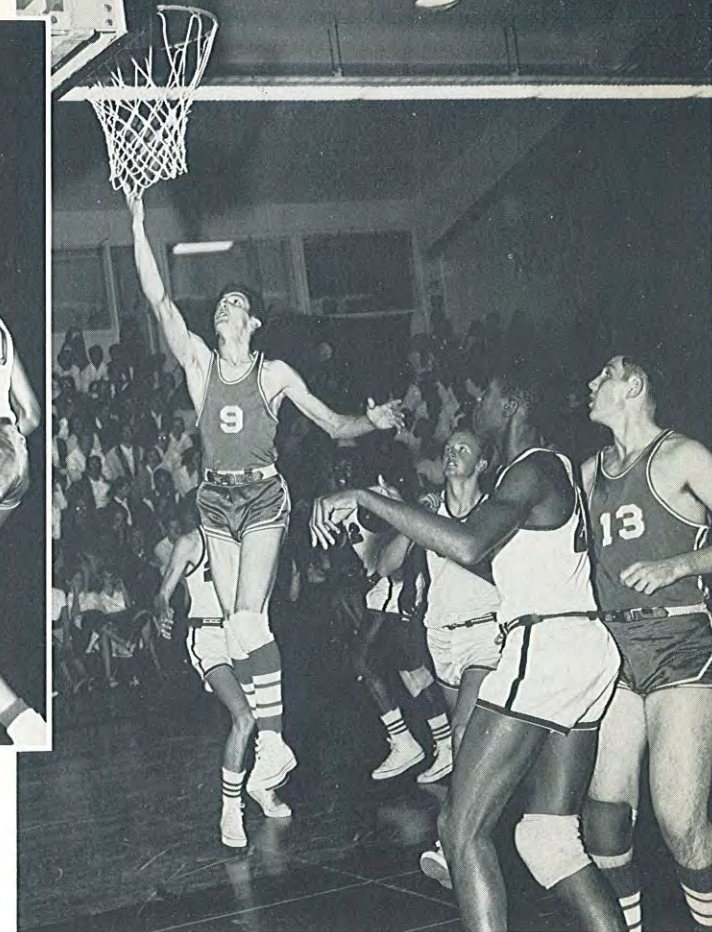

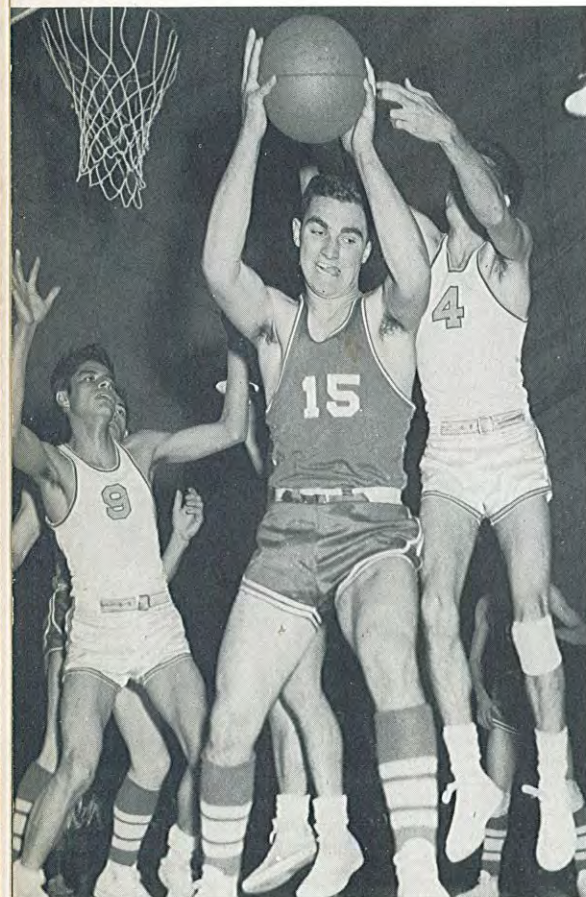

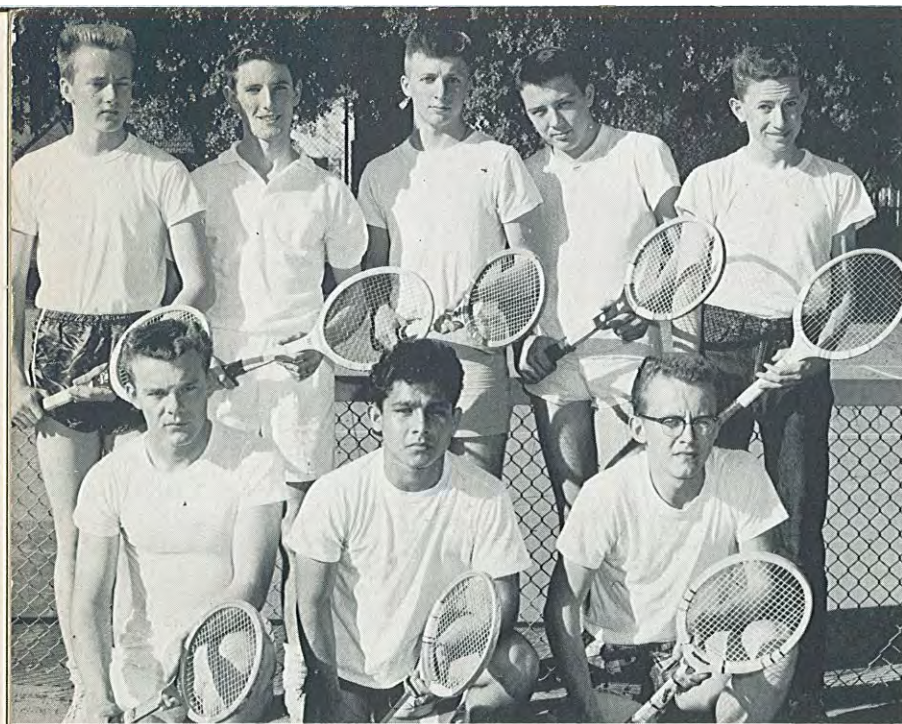

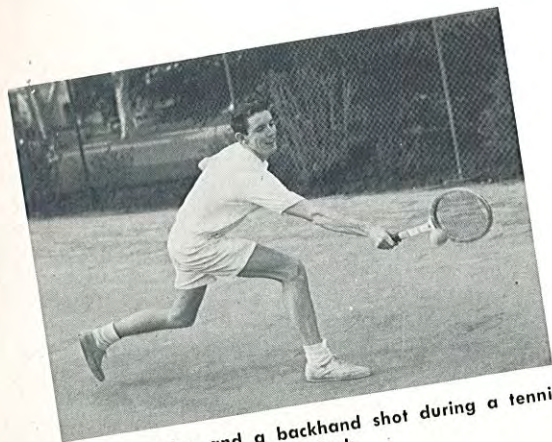

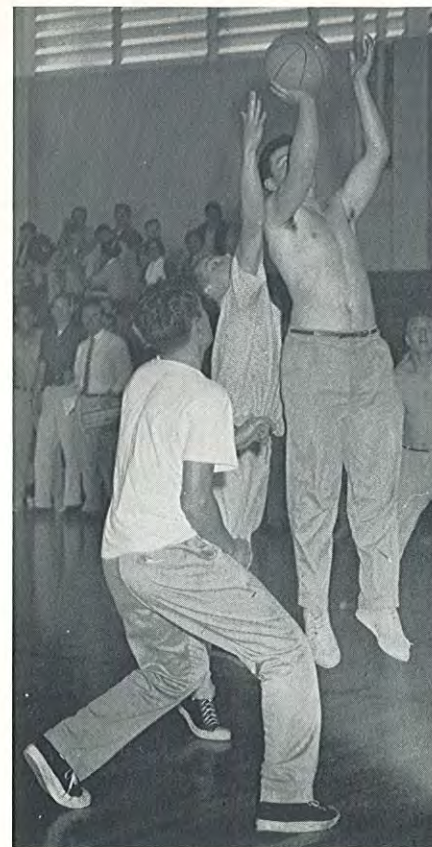

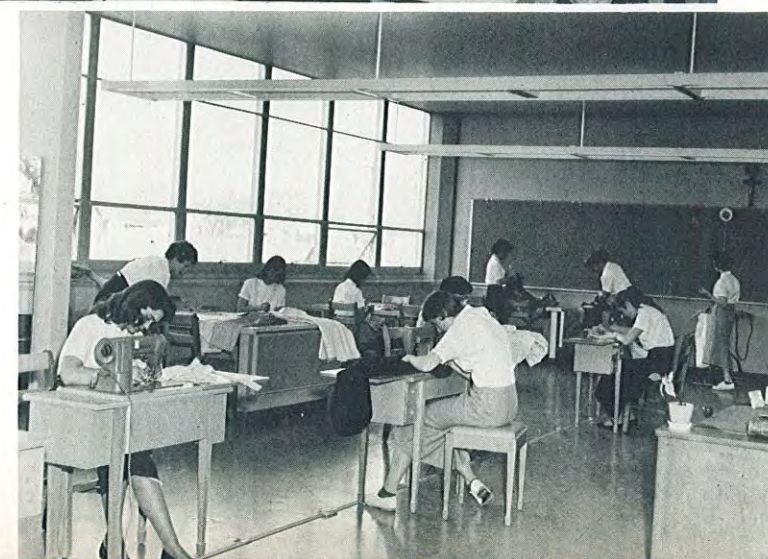
Typing, although not an academic course, is one that is put into practice by all those who take it.



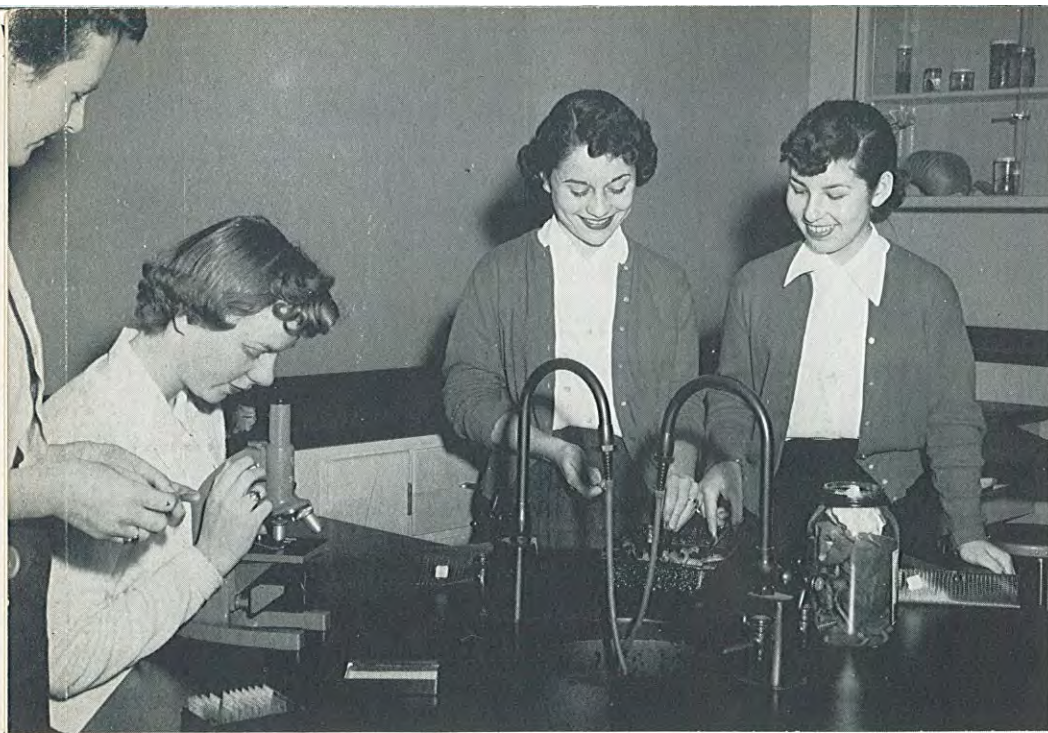

On March 24, 1957, Cardinal McIntyre, Archbishop of Los Angeles, came to Bishop Armstrong High School to dedicate our school to God and His Church. A crowd of some 3000 interested parents and friends gathered in the central court of the school, before the statue of the Blessed Virgin, to witness the blessing and dedication. Present were the Mayor of Sacramento, many other personages from the fields of government and education in the city; Church dignitaries included Bishop Dwyer of Reno, Bishop McGucken of Sacramento, as well as other high-ranking churchmen of the diocese. Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament followed the dedication ceremonies, with an open-house for visitors afterward. A banquet for visiting clergy and Brothers was held in the school cafeteria in the evening.

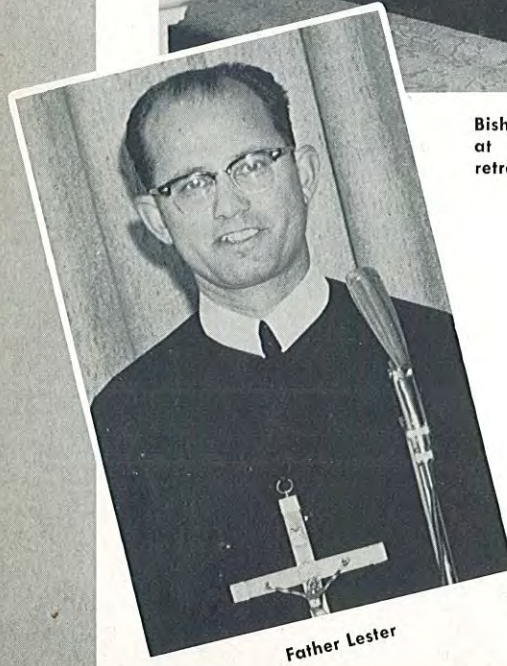

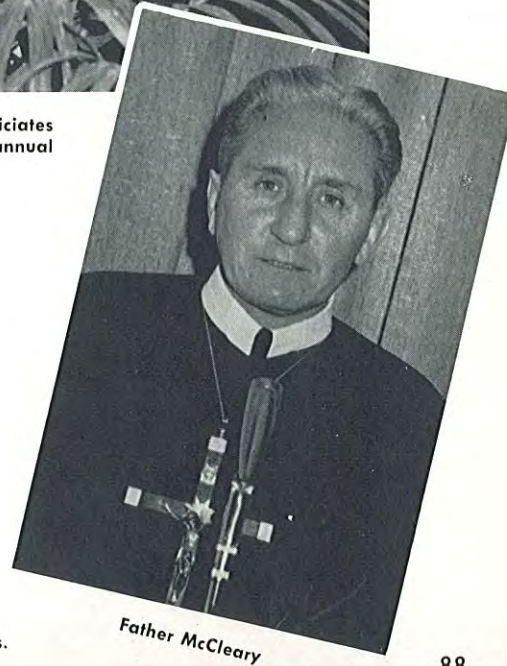

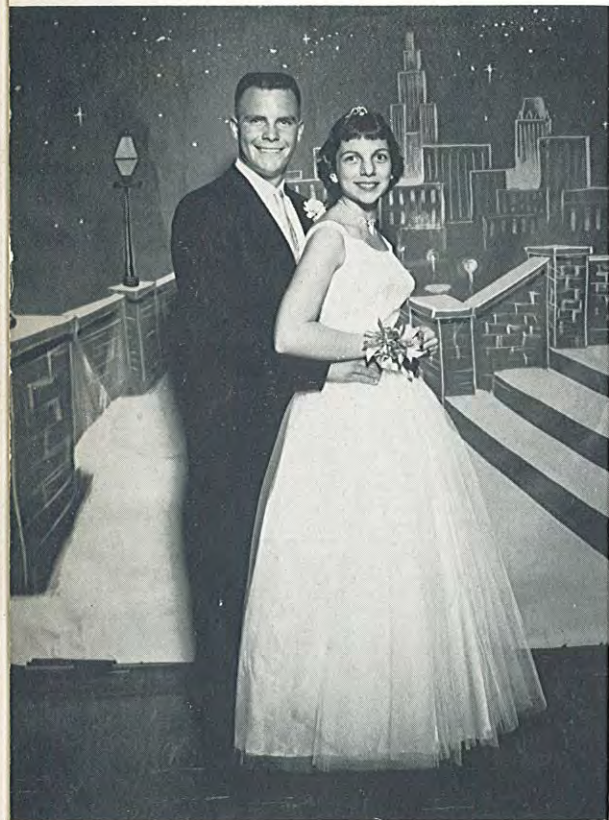

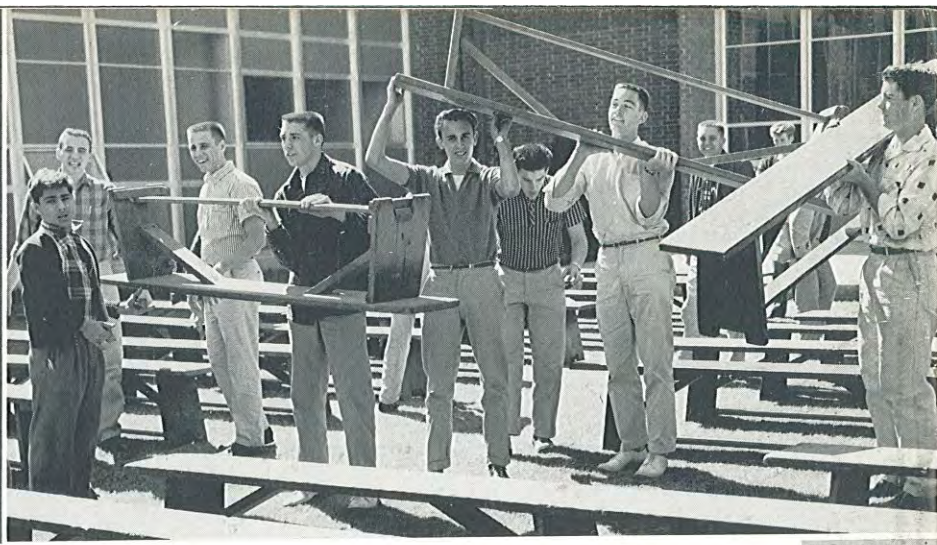

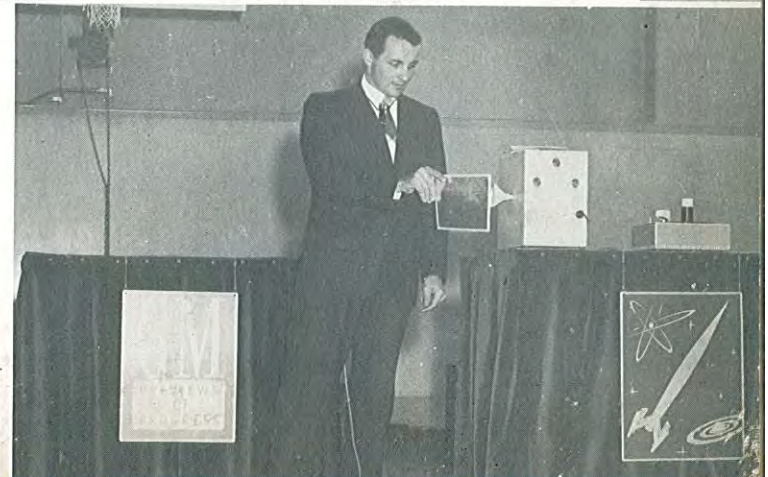
