# Service to the Poor:

## Part of the Educational Experience

**A**lthough the holiday season is a time when many of us feel a calling to reach out and help others in need, at Christian Brothers service to the poor is a year-round activity which is an integral part of our students' educational experience.

This special concern for helping those in need is based on the tradition of education established by St. John Baptist de La Salle over 200 years ago. As Brother Ricardo, CB Campus Minister, explains, "Part of the LaSallian aspect of the school is responding to the needs of the poor. This was an important part of our founding. For example, in the first Christian Brothers schools, students who were able to bring food to school were expected to share with those students who were too poor to provide for themselves."

This philosophy continues at Christian Brothers today where students are encouraged to develop a concern for social justice, and taught to live and cope in a world that is marked by significant social change. For Brother Ricardo and the rest of the faculty at CB, the community service aspect of a student's experience at Christian Brothers is just as important as the lessons learned in the classroom. "If students graduate from Christian Brothers without realizing this important LaSallian hallmark, then somehow we have failed," he concludes.

Brother Ricardo need not worry whether this important message is getting through to students at Christian Brothers. From serving the poor in Tijuana, Mexico to helping children in the Oak Park neighborhood with their studies, CB students are volunteering their time and talents and learning some valuable life lessons along the way.

Perhaps the project that has the most far reaching impact on the poor

is Christian Brother's Ven-a-Ver (Come & See) service retreat to Tijuana, Mexico. Students who make this trip spend a week providing direct service to the poor at Centro LaSalle, the Christian Brothers' free school for people of all ages. CB students live in one of the classrooms in the school, prepare their own meals and prayer services, and during the day provide services at sites including an orphanage and a local garbage dump where many of the poor live. In the evening students spend time processing their experiences that day, praying, and writing down their impressions in journals.

Six students including Annette Sierras, Michelle Chamberlain, Sonia Martinez, Lino Delgadillo, Joaquin McPeek, and Gebran Leesha along with teachers Joan Haan and Kevin Haag recently completed the Ven-a-Ver experience. They all agree that their week in Tijuana is one they will not soon forget. "This experience has made me realize how really fortunate we all are to live in this country. I

won't take anything for granted anymore," reflects Annette Sierras. "Ven-a-Ver has made me a more humble person," adds Joaquin McPeek. "I'm grateful for the opportunity to learn first-hand about how others live." Students are selected to go on the retreat based on their personnel interest and on recommendations from teachers. The next retreat is scheduled for February 1994.

Closer to home, CB students also help the poor and needy in Sacramento. For the past several years, students have volunteered their time at Wellspring Women's Center, a breakfast and counseling program for poor women and children in the Oak Park neighborhood. Every week during the school year, CB students prepare and serve breakfast at Wellspring on Wednesday and Friday mornings before heading to class. Manae Ross, who has been serving at Wellspring for the last two years says that she has gotten a great deal of satisfaction from her volunteer

experience at the center. "You feel better about yourself when you're helping other people," she explains. "We can talk about these issues in the classroom, but unless our students experience something like Wellspring first hand, it doesn't hit home," explains Holly Peterson, the faculty coordinator of the program. Brother Ricardo agrees. That's why he recently took a group of students on a field trip to the Tenderloin district of San Francisco, known for its high concentration of the homeless and destitute. "We showed our students the realities of these people's lives, and then toured St. Anthony's Foundation and showed them the efforts being made to address the needs of these people."

Besides helping to provide the basic necessities of life to the needy, CB students also help Oak Park neighborhood children by providing tutoring services and hosting events

designed to help enrich their school experience. At nearby Oak Ridge Elementary School, Christian Brothers students tutor children after school as well as help coach a soccer team. Christian Brothers also hosts an annual Christmas Party for the Oak Ridge students, conducting a toy drive ahead of time so that every child receives a present when Santa visits the party held in the CB gymnasium.

CB students have also developed a special relationship with another close neighbor, St. Hope Academy. St. Hope provides a place for young people in the Oak Park neighborhood to go after school to help bring structure to their daily lives when they are out of school. Several Christian Brothers students volunteer their time to tutor younger children who attend St. Hope. Among them is **Angela Basquez** who says she looks forward to her time at St. Hope every day. "I love the kids, and I feel like I am really making a difference in their

lives," Angela explains. "I want them to succeed."

These ongoing programs are only a small sample of the many social service projects CB students are involved in. In fact, every home room class at Christian Brothers has adopted an agency or project to support for the school year. Some of the organizations benefiting from CB student support are Habitat for Humanity (an organization which builds affordable housing for low income families), Centro Guadalupe (a Hispanic American social service agency), the PAL Program (a county big brother/sister program), and Neighborhood Housing Services (an agency which revitalizes homes in Oak Park). "Each time our students take on one of these projects they are reminded that we all have a responsibility to help those who don't have the essentials," explains Brother Ricardo. This community service component is an important part of the total CB experience."

## Don Gillott Guides CB through Year of Transition

**D**r. Donald Gillott, Administrator of Christian Brothers for the 1993 - 94 school year, is quick to remind anyone who addresses him as president that administrator is the correct title. As chief executive officer of the school, you might conclude that Don's title is only a matter of detail. But Don believes the distinction between administrator and president is important. "I see my role as laying the ground work for the president who comes after me," Don explains. "I'm very much a facilitator during this important transitional period for the school." Don is referring to the transition from a board of regents, which has been an advisory body to the school president, to a board of trustees with policy making authority, on January 1, 1994. He has been working closely with the new board in preparation for the transition.

Don has over 28 years of experience in the field of education and is known throughout Sacramento and the surrounding region for his dedication and diligent work on behalf of minority students in the fields of mathematics and engineering. As Dean of the School of Engineering and Computer Science at California State University, Sacramento from 1976 to 1993, he established the capital area's Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement Program (MESA) which today serves 3,500 students from the 2nd through the 12th grades. As a result of his efforts, the percentage of women and ethnic minorities in the School of Engineering and Computer

Science has risen from 5% in 1976 to nearly 20% today.

Besides his expertise in education, Don also has experience in fund development for educational institutions. He led the development effort which raised over \$5.5 million for state-of-the-art laboratory equipment for a new \$13 million facility for the School of Engineering and Computer Science at CSUS before resigning as Dean of the School earlier this year.

Don continues to teach at CSUS while serving as Administrator of Christian Brothers on a part-time basis. While at CB, Don is helping to define the respective roles of former board of regents members as well as guide the new board of trustees as it begins the task of governing CB. "I have been very impressed with the strong sense of community among volunteers as well as staff and faculty," commented Don when asked about his experience with CB so far. "I truly feel privileged to be a part of this organization, and am honored to contribute to what I believe will be an exciting future for Christian Brothers."

## CB TAKES YOUR PLEDGE TO THE BANK

Pledging your financial support to Christian Brothers is a great way to benefit the school throughout the year. For example, a pledge of \$120 at payments of just \$10 a month amounts to a very significant gift which may not be possible if you were asked to make it in one lump payment. For this reason, pledges are very popular with CB parents and alumni alike who want to make a significant contribution to the school over the course of the year.

When a donor makes a pledge to CB's annual parent or alumni appeal campaign, the school takes the commitment seriously and establishes program budgets based on this promise of support. If the pledge is not paid, or if payments on the pledge are late, the shortfall has an immediate impact on program budgets at CB. "You might say we take your pledge to the bank," explains Tim Whalen, Director of Support Groups and Communications for CB. "We assume that those dollars pledged will eventually come in and we create budgets based on those figures. It's a disappointment to us all when a pledge is not paid."

It's still too early to know what the delinquent pledge rate will be for both the parent and alumni appeal campaigns this year, but Development Department personnel are optimistic that they can improve the situation. "Our solicitors are more experienced this year, and we plan to follow-up delinquent pledges with letters and phone calls," explains Tim Whalen. "Once people understand how much we count on their pledge, we are confident most will fulfill their commitment."

# Lessons Learned in School Last a Lifetime

**S**martly dressed in business attire and sitting in her office in the Senator Hotel in downtown Sacramento, just a stone's throw away from the State Capitol, Laurie Ramirez hardly seems like the kind of person who is concerned about the disadvantaged and hungry in our community. But this 1958 Bishop Armstrong grad demonstrates through her actions that the lessons learned as a student, including community service and helping those in need, last a lifetime. She has volunteered her time and talents to a number of worthy causes throughout Sacramento while at the same time devoting considerable energy to her family and to her career in state government relations for Wells Fargo Bank, where she has been employed for the last 16 years.

One of Laurie's favorite volunteer activities is serving homebound elderly and disabled persons dinner on Thanksgiving Day. Several years ago, Laurie responded to a request for help from a local Sacramento woman, Gloria Abernathy, who had taken it upon herself to prepare and deliver

dinners to elderly, disabled and homebound people who would otherwise go hungry on Thanksgiving Day. Her experience that year got her

hooked. "That was the best Thanksgiving I ever had," explains Laurie. "I get so much more from doing this than I give," she continues. "It truly brings people from every walk of life together in a meaningful way."

Last year, when at the last moment Gloria Abernathy told Laurie she didn't have a facility to prepare the meals which volunteers were to deliver, Laurie, who is currently on CB's Alumni Association Board of Directors, immediately thought of Christian Brothers. "I knew this was exactly the kind of thing Christian Brothers stood for and that the school would be anxious to help. After all, this is our LaSallian philosophy put into action." As Laurie expected, Cafeteria Manager Bud Graham was immediately enthusiastic about the project. Graham graciously opened his kitchen to Abernathy and her volunteers and then he and his crew worked side by side with the volunteers to make the program a huge success. Gloria and her crew were back again this year and many needy people received a Thanks-



giving dinner prepared in the Christian Brothers Cafeteria kitchen.

Laurie has been one of the Alumni Association's most active board members since she began her term on the board in 1990. She has been instrumental in most of the Association's major events and activities including the Wine Tasting Extravaganza, Golf Classic, Career Day, Alumni Dinner, and Annual Appeal Campaign. This year Laurie was elected Vice President for Membership and is working with a committee to formulate and implement a class representative program for the Association. "I really believe in the educational experience CB offers," explains Laurie, whose son Michael is a 1983 graduate. "I am happy to help the staff and faculty continue their fine work."
