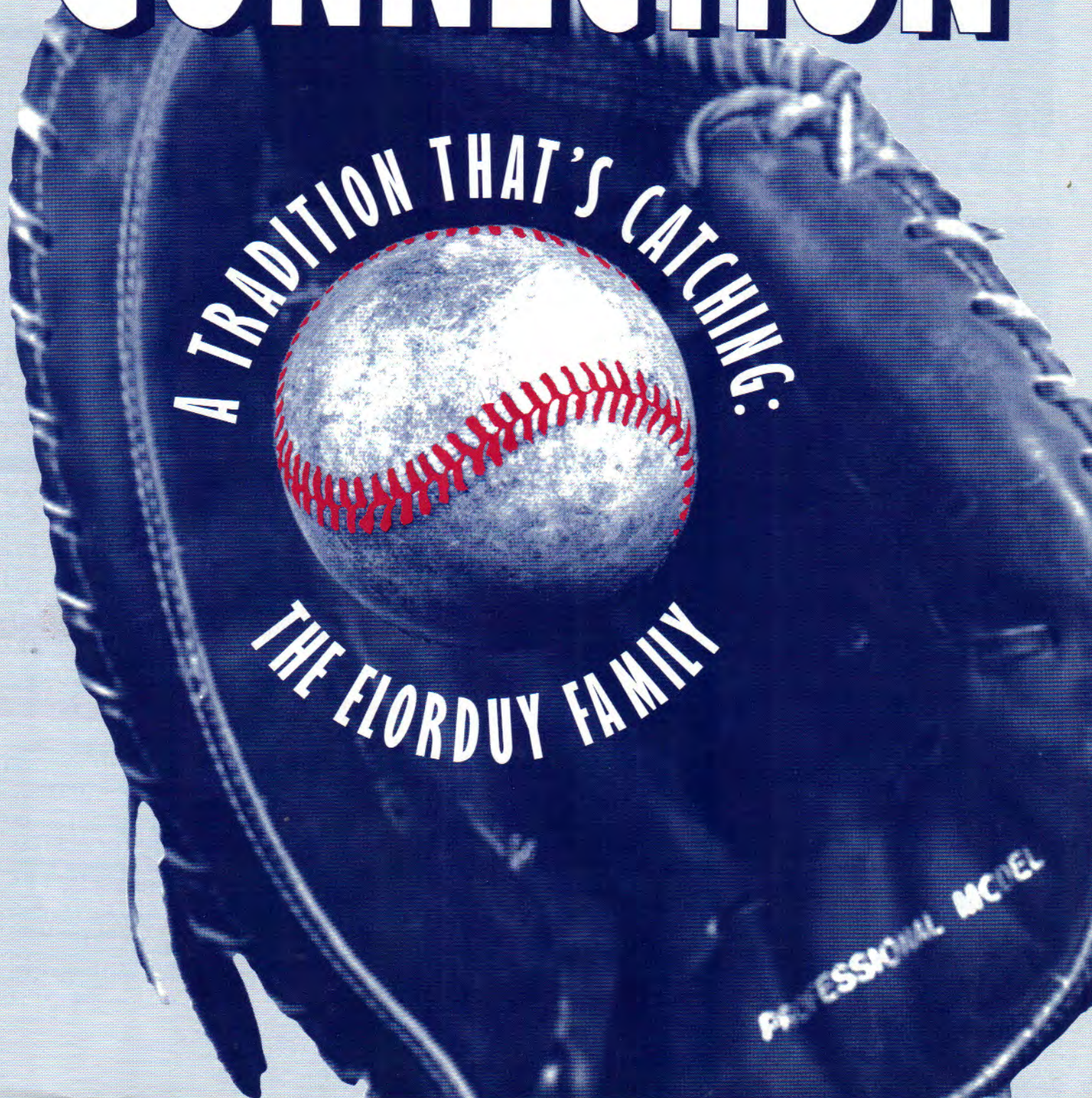

# Oh, Lordy! The Elorduy Tradition At CB Is Catching!

## One Family's Dedication To CB Has Left A Legacy That Shows No Sign Of Ending

IF THE ELORDUY CONNECTION TO CHRISTIAN BROTHERS High School were put in biblical terms, there would be a lot of "begats." Except, of course, the family saga doesn't quite go back to Old Testament times but only to the heyday of the LaSalle Club.

Those were the days of Joe Kirrene Sr., Don Fox, Al Westlake, Hinie Finkelstein and Cy Puliz, among others. And among those "others" was the Elorduy family's patriarch, Michael. Later Michael and wife Carmen were to become active in Boosters' activities as the parents of Michael Jr., '60, and Richard, '63.

The Elorduy brothers began what has become a catching dynasty in Falcon baseball lore. Michael, under the tutelage of Dick Sperbeck, was an all-city selection before going

on to play two years at Sacramento City College and two more at Fresno State University. Richard, coached by Ron Limeberger and Dick Sperbeck went on from behind-the-plate duties at CB to another four years catching for Sac City College and CSUS.

While the mask, chest protector and shin guards of a catcher are widely known in the baseball fraternity as "the tools of ignorance," that's strictly a misnomer when it comes to the Elorduy brothers, both of whom have risen high in the ranks of the Sacramento County Probation Department.

But all that's just for starters because the Elorduys are a multigenerational family even if their baseball proclivities are based on a single position.

Michael and his wife, the former Nancy Peterson, '61, and member of the Board of Regents, 90-91, have a son Peter, '86, who caught for CB and also was coached by Limeberger, be-

fore going on to play the same position for Saint Mary's College.

Meanwhile Richard and his spouse, the former Maryann Zupan, '64 – and a current member of the Alumni Board – have three sons, all baseball players and all catchers.

Todd, '91, played four years under Limeberger and Gene Sackett for CB before enrolling at – and, naturally, catching for – CSUS. Danny wound up his high school career, has played under Sackett and Joe Gill, and did break that behind-the-plate mold just a bit. Per-

## CB Track: 5th Metro Title In A Row

If you are a short distance runner you will start off charging as a freight train down the tracks, using every part of your person to make you travel faster. If you are a distance runner you make sure not to blow out at the very start, but to conserve a little energy for the grueling battle ahead of you.

Sound like fun? Welcome to the sport of Track and Field where twice each week during the season this experience is shared by members of the CB track team.

## Women's Soccer At CB Moves Into A League Of Its Own

**M**AKE NO MISTAKE ABOUT IT: the women's sports program at CB is not about mediocrity and varsity soccer is proving the point. After posting records of 0-13 in 1991, 3-10-2 in 1992, and 10-9 in 1993, this year the Lady Falcons turned the Metro League upside-down with a 16-4-2 overall and a 9-4-1 league record: good enough for a third place finish in Metro behind St. Francis and El Camino.

Why such rapid progress? Senior forward Josalyn Robinson chalks it up to familiarity and experience. "A lot of these girls, especially freshmen, have been working together on other teams for years, so they already know each other coming in. (In 1991) it was a bunch of girls who wanted to play soccer, and not all of them had played before."

Junior sweeper Lesley Tatro charts the team's progress in terms of games – games played against the mighty St. Francis Troubadours, that is. In 1992, St. Francis manhandled CB, 12-00. On May 3 of this year, in the most emotionally charged match ever involving a CB women's team, St. Francis won by a meager score of 2-1. That one goal, scored by junior forward Angelique Kincannon, was the only goal against St. Francis this year in league play. Tatro summed it up nicely: "That goal against St. Francis – we're finally in the competition

Bob, retired executive from Tiechert Construction Co., was President of our Board of Regents as the transition to a Board of Trustees was completed.

**VICE CHAIR: BR. RONALD ROGGENBACK, F.S.C.** Brother Ronald is Director of Education for the De La Salle Institute and served as principal of CB from 1973-1979. After receiving his doctorate in theology from Boston College and serving a short stint at St. Mary's College, Br. Ronald has served on the district administration to the present.

#### MR. RONALD J. CARISSIMI

Ron ('51) is president of Carissimi, Rohrer & Assoc., AIA. Ron has served as president of the Board of Regents and the Parent Service Organization — as well as actively supporting the sports program. 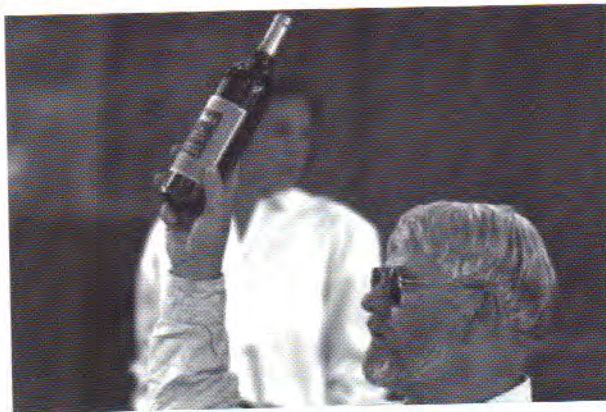

— it's great!"

The style of soccer that the team plays — aggressive, unfinessed, dynamic — is a necessity in Metro. The styles of St. Francis and El Camino are rough. It takes an amazing team to play tough and maintain sportsmanship, something that CB manages to pull off every time.

For head coach Joe Esfandiary and assistant (and JV head coach) Mike Ferrigno (each took over in 1992) kudos for this year's success go to the players for their undying commitment. "We went from a 14 player Varsity squad in '92 to JV and Varsity teams of 19 players each this year," said Ferrigno. "The availability of good athletes went up, along with their maturity. Now we have unity, sportsmanship, and the ability to survive injuries."

Esfandiary concurred. "My challenge coming in was to build fundamental skills: leadership and how to play as an individual as well as a team. Despite heavy losses early on ('92-'93), the girls developed a hunger, a desire for learning, and the players came back next year. Now we've got a JV team. I'm proud of both teams and hoping for the best."

Likewise, the players throw the credit the coaches' way. "The addition of Joe and Mike was the best thing for the team. They balance each other and work great as a coaching team," said Robinson.

She's right, especially when it comes to their sideline mannerisms. Esfandiary is abuzz during games. His staccato speech and Latin accent are always on, spitting out orders to players on the field. Ferrigno, on the other

hand, paces the sideline, his comments for more 'motivational' purposes.

Tatro adds: "These coaches turned the whole program around. Their attitude has always been 'fun first' — it's never been negative. They know what they're doing which kind helps."

Athletic Director Danny Delgado attributes turnaround to the advantages of a private school. After the '91 season a great coach was hired — and it was soon evident that an assistant coach would also be needed. "Due to the increased players in girls' soccer, we saw a need for a JV team this year; so the decision was made and one was quickly formed."

Assistant Athletic Director Jill Bennett looked at the whole picture. "This year every one of our girls' teams eligible for playoffs made it. Used to be, a game against CB's girls meant a blowout. Now, it means you play your starters."

The 'best' that Esfandiary spoke of, it seems, is the Metro League title, which is no joke. The Varsity team is young — twelve under-class women and six upperclass women; League rivals St. Francis and El Camino are graduating well over fifty percent of their respective squads.

The burning desire to beat these teams is evident in every player. Ask any of any of them and the response is like that of Angelique Kincannon: "We're gonna kill 'em." Or perhaps one like Lesley Tatro's: "I can't wait 'til we play El Camino and St. Francis next year — because they're gonna lose."

With this kind of team, who needs football?
