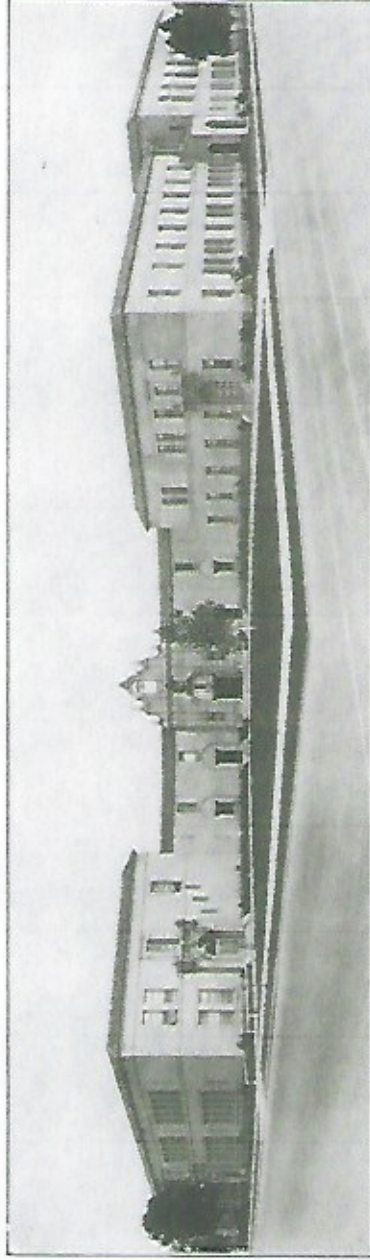

Now this splendid Sacramento institution observes its Golden Jubilee and turns for help in its Golden Jubilee Expansion Program to the residents of the great area which it has served for a half century. It proposes enlisting their help with subscriptions—

MONEY WILL BE SPENT HERE IN NEW CONSTRUCTION

Every penny of money raised in the City of Sacramento for the Christian Brothers School under its Golden Jubilee Expansion Program will be spent in Sacramento.

Acting upon counsel of alumni and friends, the Christian Brothers School proposes to raise a sum of \$60,000 by popular subscriptions. This sum which forms the minimum estimate will be divided as follows:

- Construction of a new auditorium - gymnasium, embodying study halls, lunch rooms, play rooms, music room, library, dressing rooms, and a gymnasium\$45,000
- Construction of a swimming pool, showers, lockers, equipment, etc. 15,000

Total.....\$60,000

These added facilities will enable the school to transform rooms now used as study halls into dormitory and class room area. This release of space will provide facilities for fifty or more boarding students. The improvements generally will enable the school to increase its enrollment from some 300 to 600 students.

Educators everywhere emphasize the importance of a balanced system of education which develops the youth physically as well as mentally. The new gymnasium will meet this need in the only day and boarding school for boys in the Sacramento Valley.
