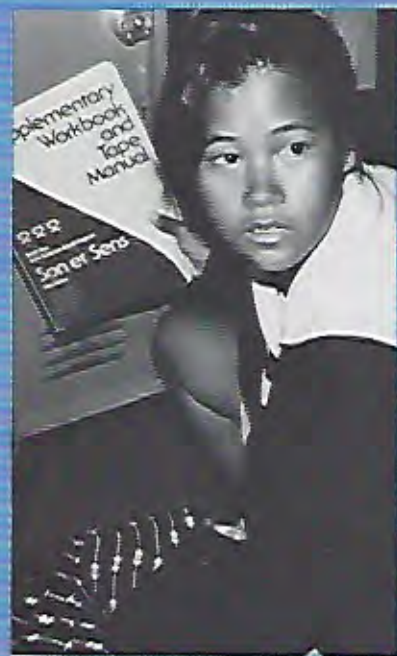

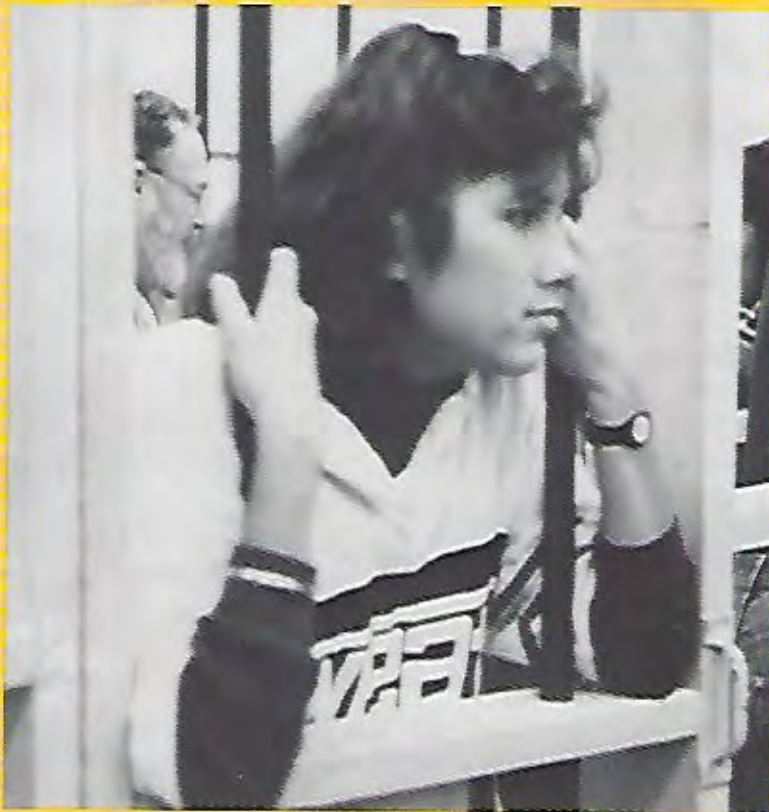

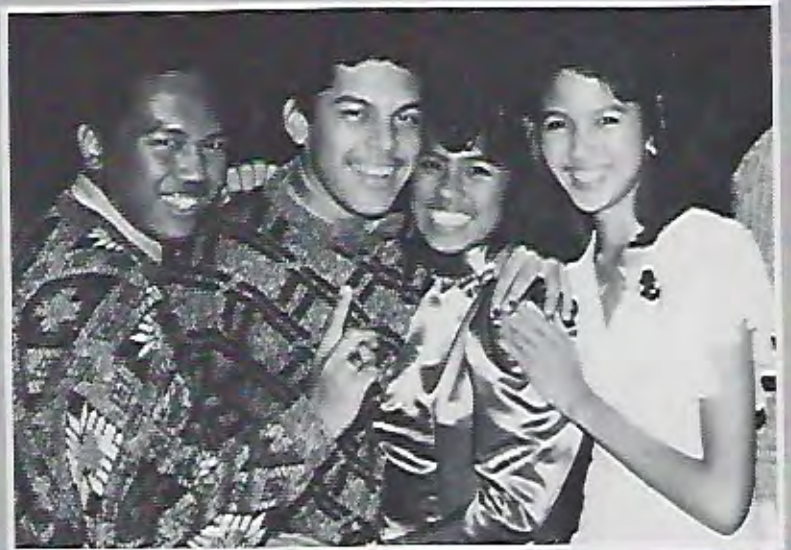

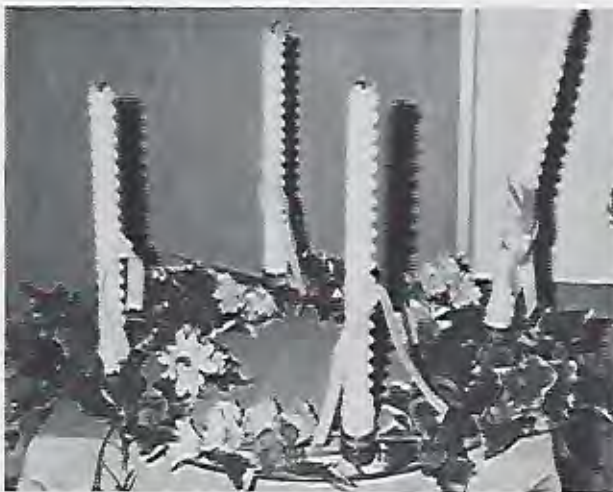

4:00: OK, I can't look great; I'll just look good. Dad says I look like a princess, but you know how dads are!

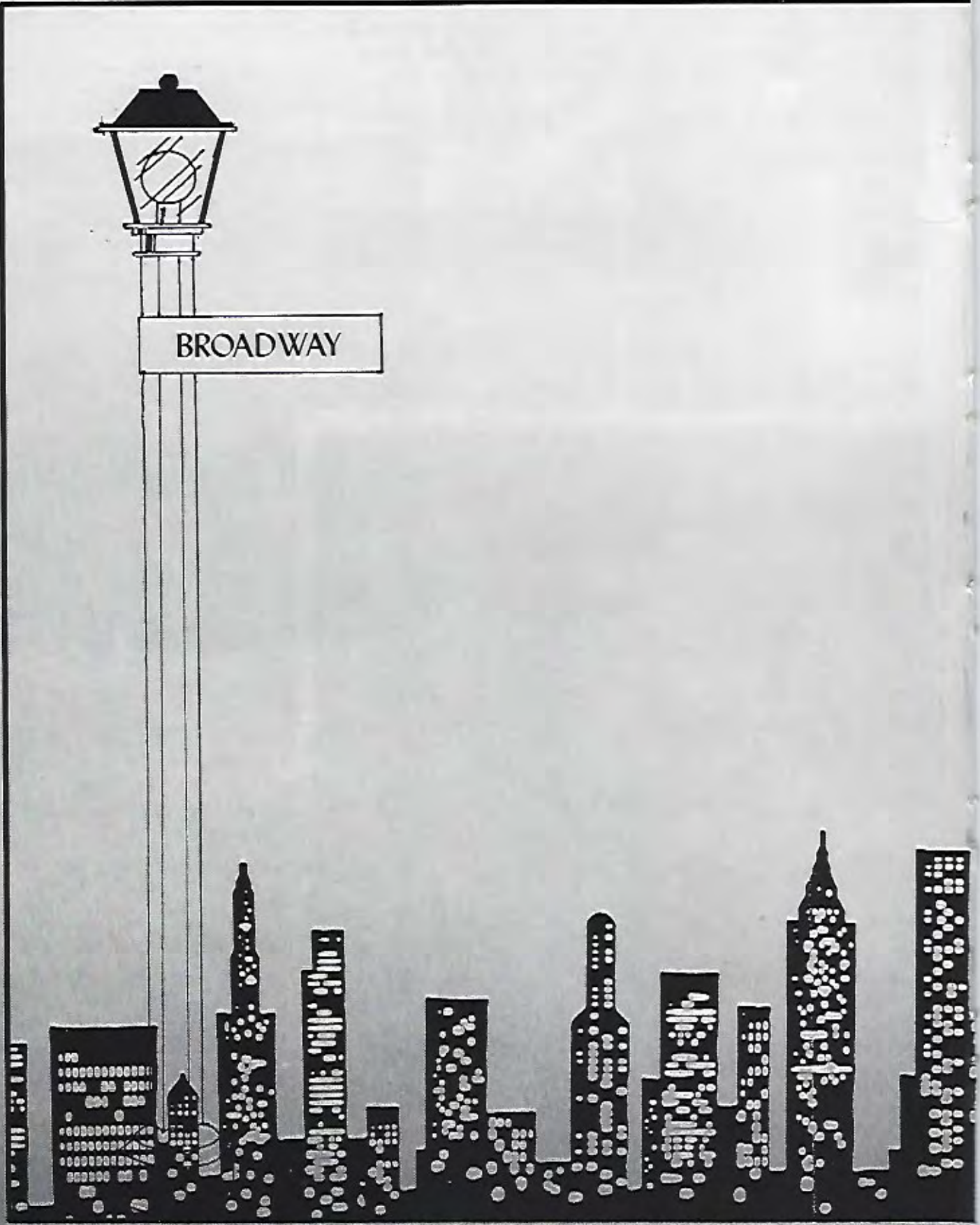
4:30: How am I supposed to eat ribs and chicken like a lady?

4:50: What if Dad can't dance? What if I break my neck doing the Twist?

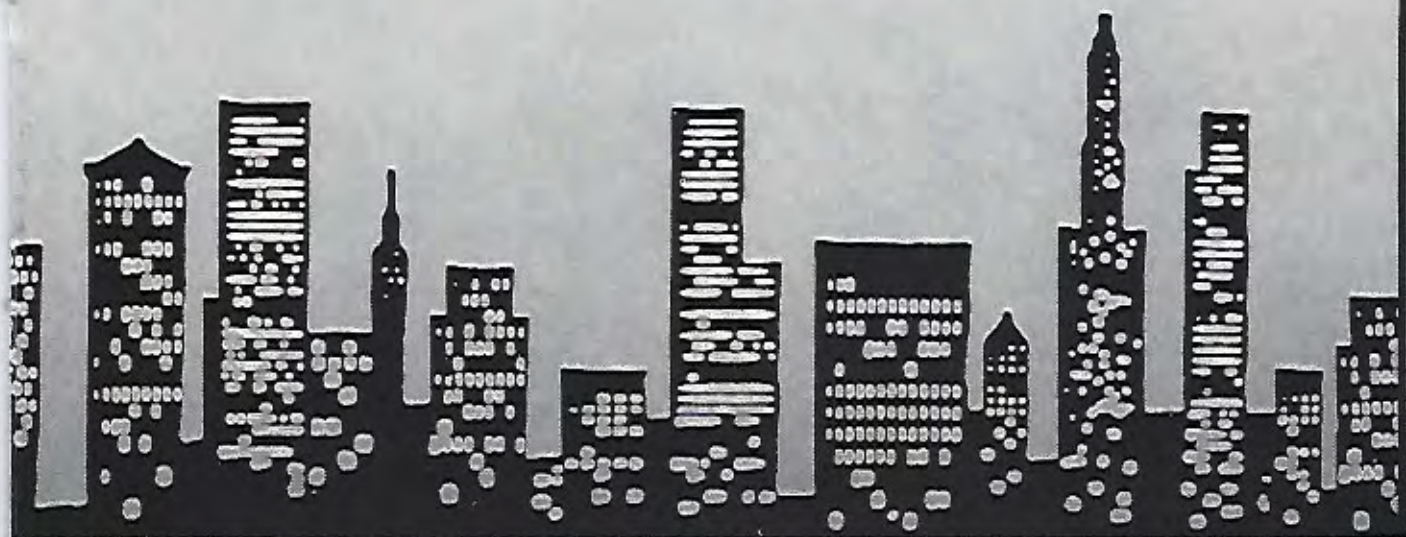
6:00: Here we go. *Please, God*, let some of my friends be

"Mock Trial and Moot Court were heavy challenges that were met head-on by our wonderful Manogue students." This was the reaction of advisor, Mr. Michael Desmond, after the Mock Trial team placed fifth out of 23 competing schools at the 9th Annual Law-Related Education Conference at the Sacramento Court House on February 6, 1988. In this year's case, *People v. Friendly*, Tracy Soto portrayed the defendant who was accused of receiving withholding, and

concealing stolen property, and of battery upon a police officer. Our prosecution team worked to build a case that proved the defendant was guilty. While they were disappointed that they missed the finals by only two points, the team felt that they gained much experience, thanks to the coaching of the lawyer, Mr. Tom Mahoney, and the determination of Mr. Desmond.

Repeater*, a case about the constitutionality of the exclusionary rule in which illegally seized evidence is suppressed, and the South case which concerned the illegality of giving funds to a rebel group in a mythical Central American country. With the help of two competent attorney coaches, Jennifer Kaufmann and David Miller, the team confidently faced teams from Rio Americano, Mira Loma, and Casa Robles in three rounds of competition. "Though our team did not make it to the semi-finals, we had a lot of fun and were challenged intellectually in a new way," said Julie Cubanski. Each team was scored by three judges.

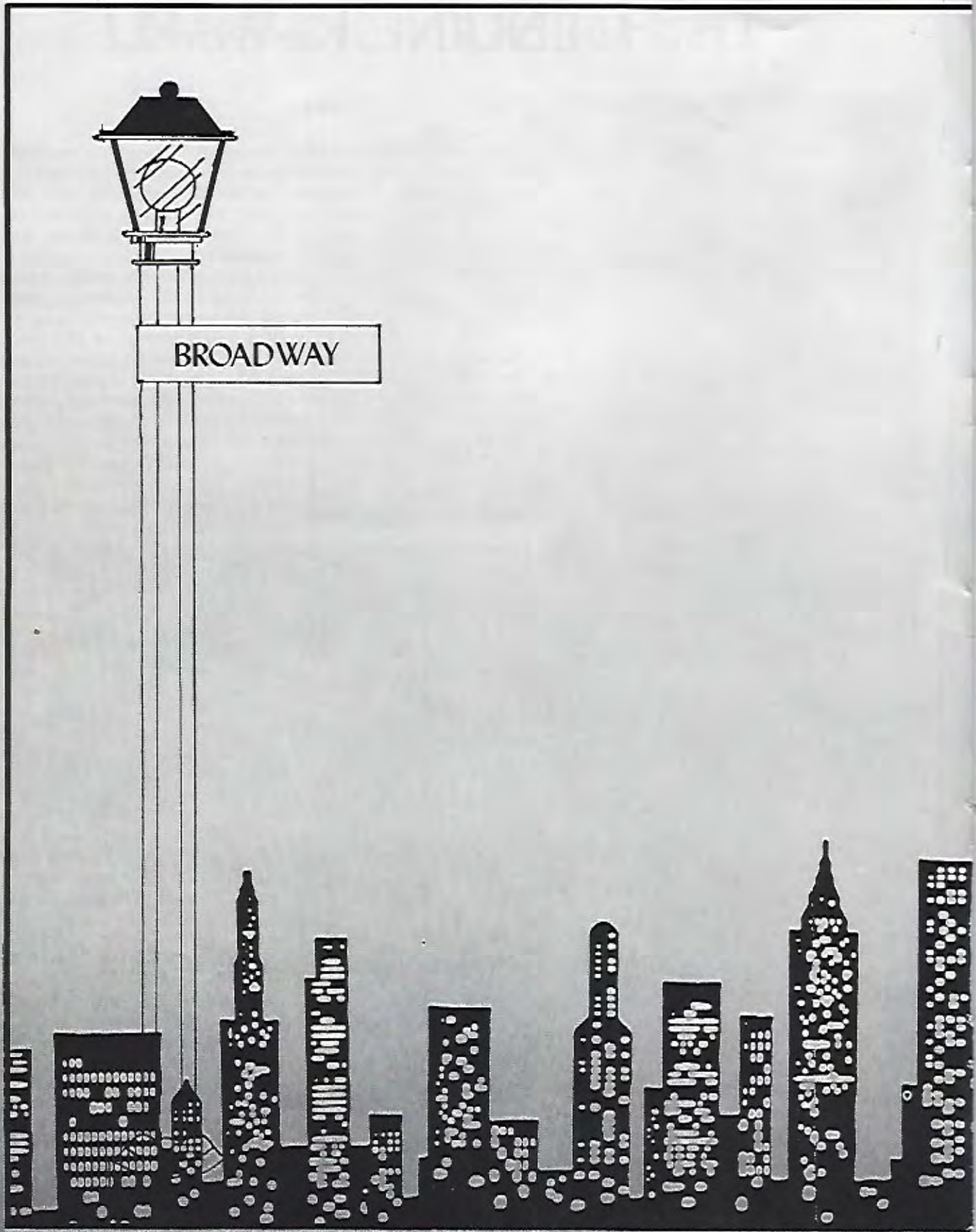

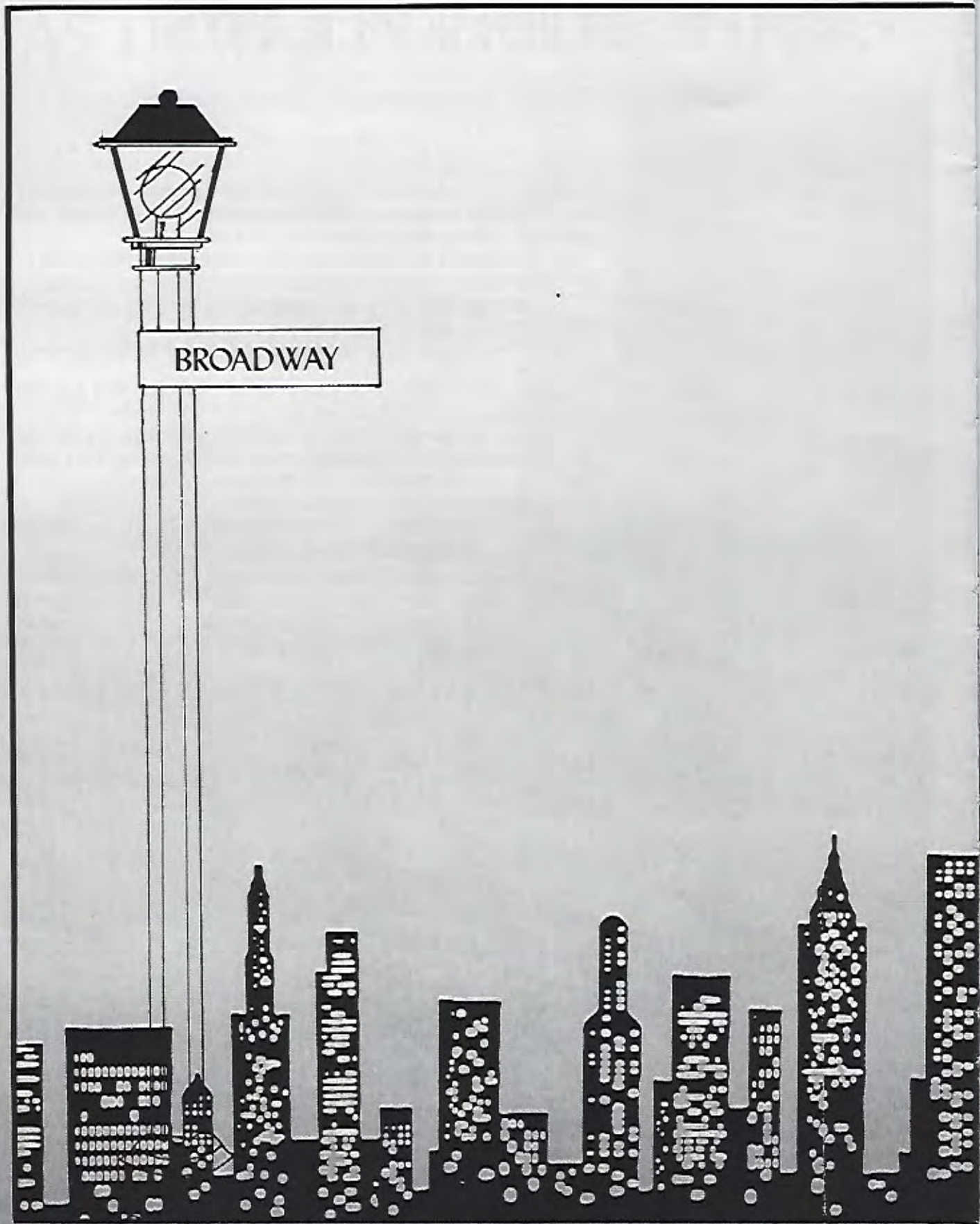

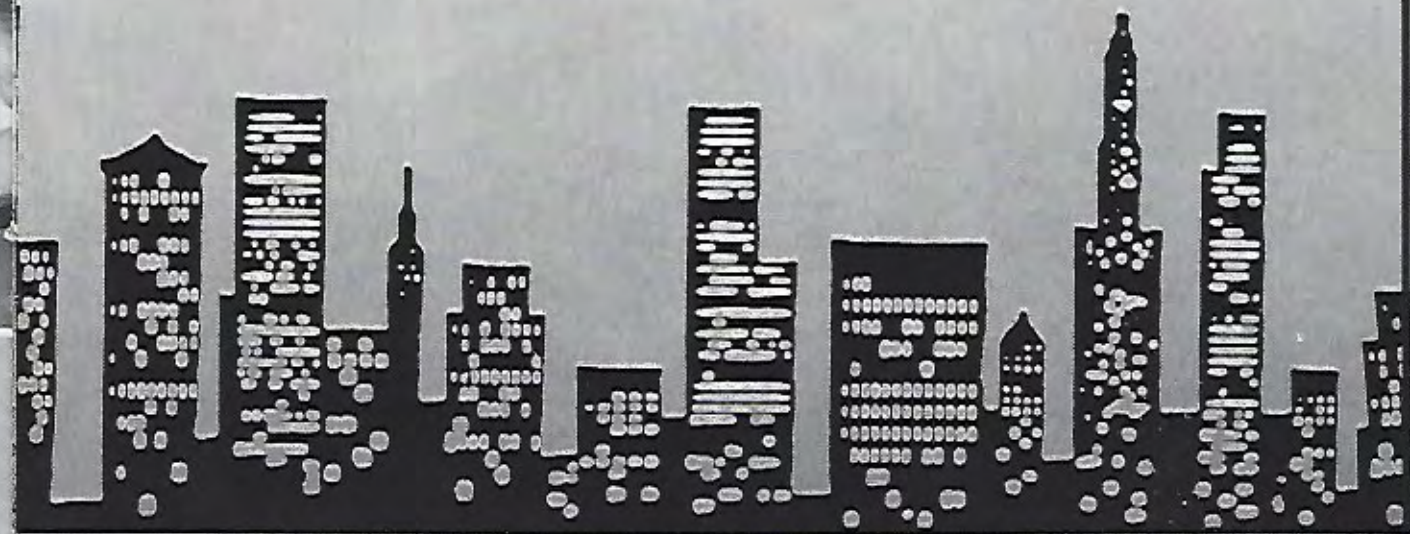

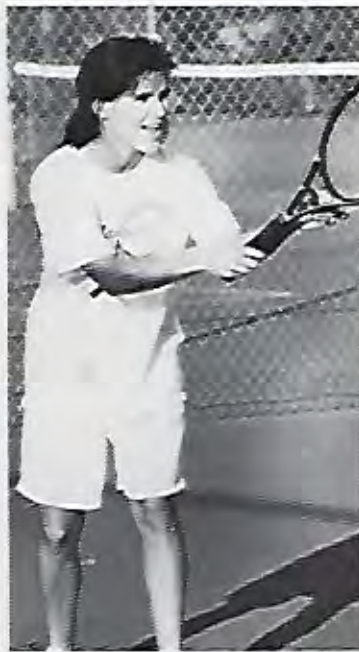

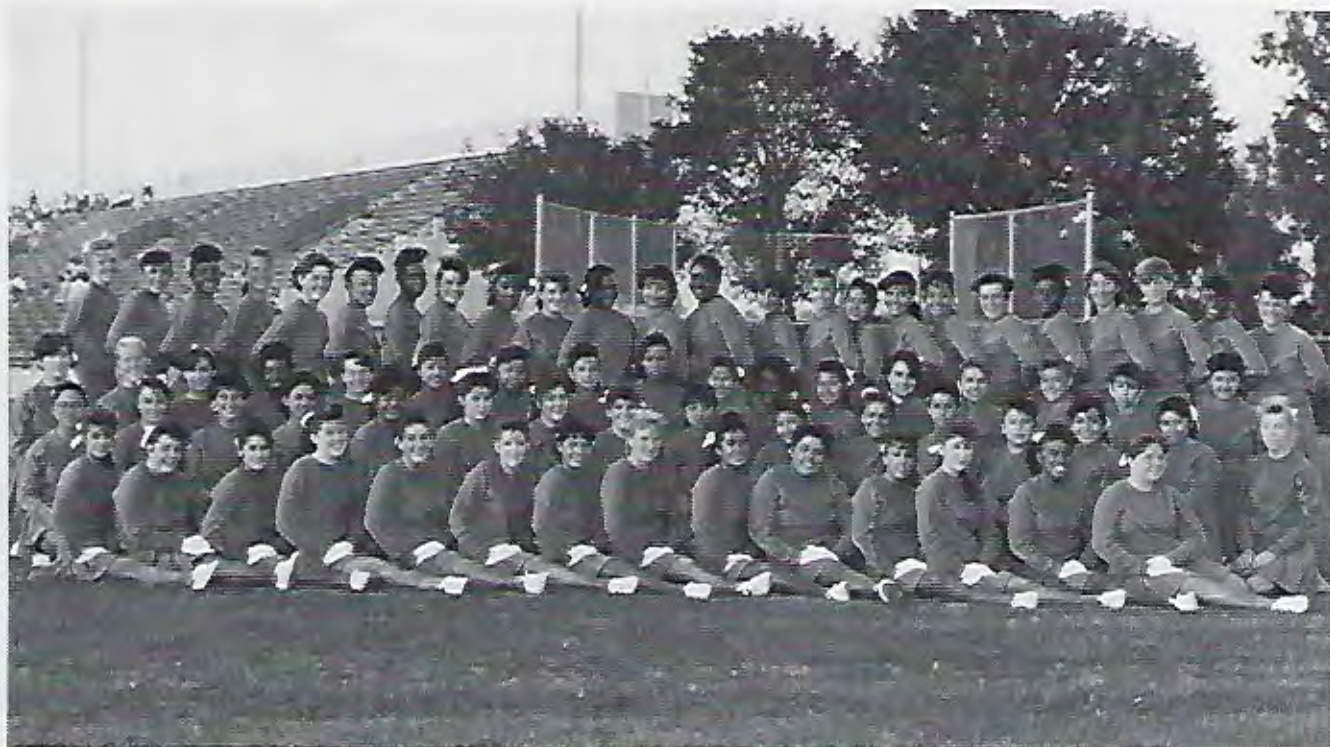
