
Dear Class of '85, Fellow Students, Faculty and special friends,

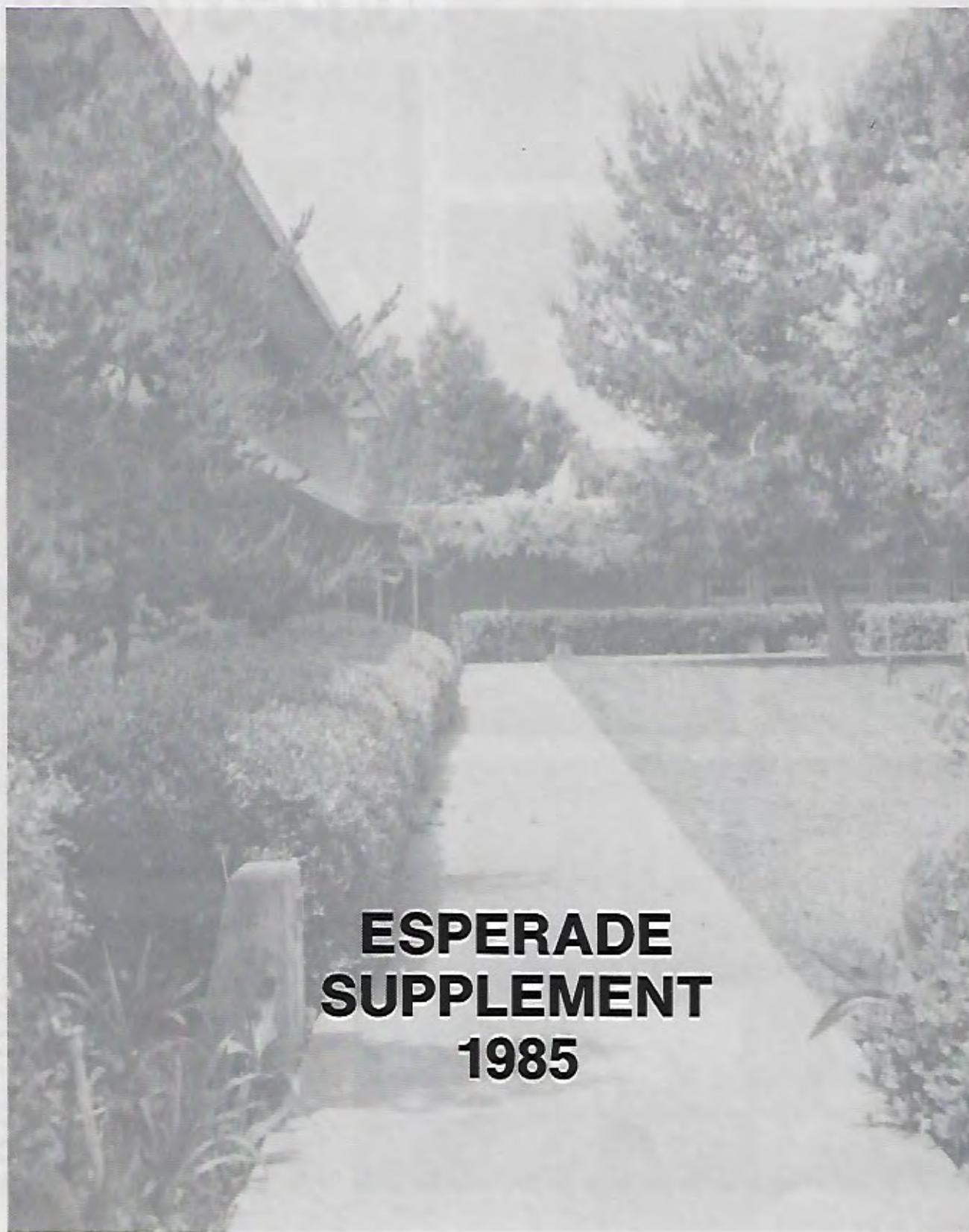
