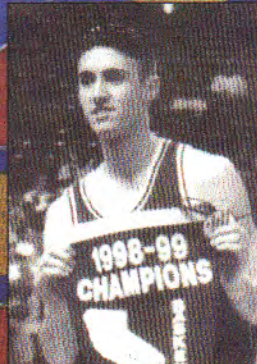


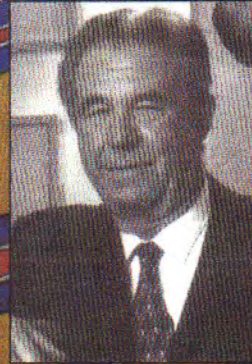

## *The Resurgence of Our Sports Program*

I cannot tell you the number of people out there who have approached me with comments like, "You have really turned that athletic program around." Or, "Brothers is returning to its glory days." Or, "It's good to see an emphasis back on athletics again." All of these expressions of good will indicate that our Brothers' family – the alumni, current parents, alumni parents, and friends — have taken note of a renaissance in our athletic program. At the time I write this article, every single team sport we field here at Brothers, both men's and women's teams, have made CIF playoffs this year. Football, men's soccer, men's and women's basketball, and women's volleyball have all gone on to post-season, playoff competition. What a remarkable accomplishment!

Success like this is not accidental. Some of it has to do with philosophy. For us, athletics is an extension of the classroom. Much of it has to do with having good athletes, and in Catholic schools, success tends to breed success. As the old saying goes, "You ain't seen nothing yet."

These kinds of records are due in great part to having dedicated, capable, and enthusiastic coaches. One of our major goals here at Christian Brothers is to hire teachers who are involved outside of the classroom. I will often hear a department chairperson say, "I just interviewed a great candidate for that teaching position." This is followed quickly by a question from Mr. Rutten, our Principal, or Mr. Clemons, our Athletic Director, or Mr. Limeberger, our Assistant Athletic Director, "But can they coach?" The best coaches are also great teachers.

And you know what? It's not just athletics. We have outstanding performing and fine arts programs. We have bands and choral groups and great drama productions. We have a jazz choir and a gospel choir, and I have been bugging the music folks about establishing a bell choir. Moot court recently won second place in competition against Sacramento County high schools. Young artists from Christian Brothers sponsor an art exhibit every spring, and we have had art displays at both Java City and the Crocker Art Museum. The best activity moderators are also great teachers.

Why is Brothers experiencing this resurgence? We have a great philosophy. We have great students. We have great parents. We have dedicated and competent teachers, instructors, and role models.

It doesn't get much better than this.

The 52-42 opening-game win over highly touted El Camino that brought the football team long-awaited recognition from the local media and alumni alike – and set up the Falcons' first winning season in several years. The decisive 65-40 defeat of Gustine High as the girls basketball team made it to the section playoffs yet again.

True (red and) blue teams: football and wrestling, soccer and baseball, softball and even roller hockey. Young athletes achieving an exciting, across-the-rosters quality of play that let head football coach

After years of flapping their wings against the cage, the Falcons are soaring again. And admit it, sports fans: As satisfying as it is when your school is a powerhouse, there's nothing so sweet as the comeback.

"This has been a good year, in retrospect, for CB athletics," says Athletic Director Mike Clemons. "The credit goes to the hard work of our student athletes, the dedication of our coaching staff and certainly the support of the administration."

A very good year – and not just for the celebrated boys basketball and football. Indeed, not just for CB's celebrated boys.

Take girls basketball: The team, coached by Joe Soto, shot its way to the second round of the playoffs while piling up a 20-8 overall and 10-4 league record. The girls are eager to top that mark next year, when scoring stars Shandyn Hicks, Paris Kidd and Patricia Williams will be seniors and Christina Johnson will be a junior.

"We believed we deserved everything we accomplished during the year," says senior basketball veteran Gina Carrasco, "and that is why we were in the playoffs. It was an honor to be in the playoffs, and our determination was to achieve the excitement of the next level."

"We still have four starters

coming back next year and have key players coming off the bench," Kidd told the Talon, "so we are looking for another playoff season."

And volleyball: Marshall and Farrell made All-City and first team All-Metro, respectively. The girls team – coached by David Dacong and Cathy Brink – made it to the second round of the playoffs while

posting a 12-2 league record and enjoying an impressive 15-4 year overall.

And soccer: All-Metro League stars Jady Nunan, Chris Vellanoweth and Aaron Tsuda led the boys team, coached by Vince Juarez, to the second round of the playoffs with a 10-1-1 year in league play, a first-place trophy in the Del Campo Tournament and a Metro League second-place finish.

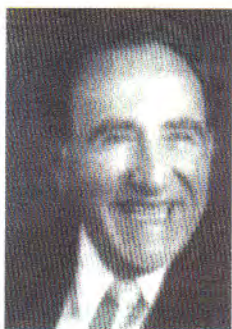

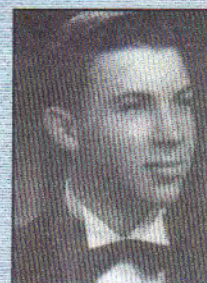

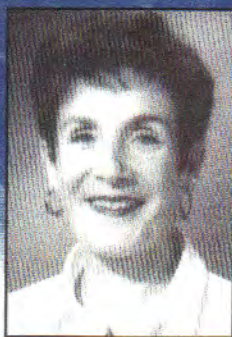

## Patrick Dullanty '45 agrees to be judge for the seventh annual La Salle Art Exhibit.

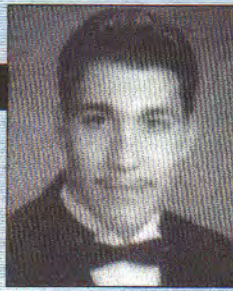
The Art Department is pleased to announce that Sacramento artist Patrick Dullanty has agreed to be the judge for the seventh annual La Salle Art Exhibit.

I worked at Lasallian educational opportunities (Leo Center) in Oakland last summer and over spring break, tutoring and living with Brothers there. We are planning on calling the class "World Cultures" and teaching about international development, which encompasses many disciplines, including, to name just a few, anthropology, soil science, nutrition, political science, and economics. I am excited about this opportunity to teach these children, many of whom I know from last year, and I think it will be a lot of fun.

I also have an internship in the Land, Air, and Water Resources Dept. at UC Davis, helping my professor on a couple of his research projects. One project is testing soil samples from patches of land, called "glades," in Kenya. These glades have lush vegetation growing on them, but they are surrounded by shrublands. We want to figure out what the characteristics of the soil are and why these glades are extremely fertile, while the surrounding landscape is infertile. The other research project I am helping on is testing the water quality in the Cosumnes River watershed. ♦

## Resurgence of CB Sports

The sports year is ending on an upbeat note, as well, with the baseball and softball teams enjoying winning seasons.

But this is America, after all, and the year's biggest headlines were reserved for the two teams that put CB's colors back on the regional sports map: boys basketball and football. For the football team, it was a reputation-rebuilding season in a sport that, for better or worse, can define a school's sports image. For the basketball team, the year was nothing less than historic.

Coach Meegan had high hopes for 1998 after enduring three disastrous years in which CB posted a total of just four victories – a far cry from the league-dominating eras that alums remember so fondly. And the new year started on a high note, with a come-from-behind 52-42 victory over El Camino that sent alums searching their closets for old pennants – and journalists searching for an answer to the question summed up in a Bee headline over a Davidson feature: "A Return to Glory at Christian Brothers?"

Davidson, who covers prep sports for The Bee, found several early signs pointing to an affirmative answer: a roster of recruitable players, the school's record enrollment, increased interest in playing football at all levels, better luck against Jesuit in recruiting Parochial Athletic League players – and coach Meegan's 70-hour-a-week enthusiasm. Not a bad combination.

The squad stumbled a bit after El Camino, enduring three frustrating losses, but then rallied for six straight wins that ensured a playoff berth – not to mention a 5-1 Metro League and 7-3 overall record for the season.

By season's end, despite a section playoff loss to Woodland, Meegan had re-established CB as a team well worth watching – if for no other reason than to see it post an average 30 points a

game. For that, grateful fans can thank the likes of veteran quarterback Steve Cuckovich and running back Albert Hollis II, whose 1,975 yards (10.4 per carry) and 27 touchdowns brought him co-Metro League Player of the Year status. Fullback Ronnie Gayton chimed in with 1,021 yards and eight TDs. Other top players included cornerback Joey Blecha, and linebackers Robbie Rose and Richard Chinakwe.

"We like how things worked out," Meegan told Neighbors. "We hit that bump, and the kids had to battle a little adversity. Every week, it seemed like we were the underdog, and every week, the kids stepped it up and improved."

Hollis, the junior who made many a short list of next year's seniors to watch for great things, summed up the feelings of fan and player alike after that first victory against El Camino:

"We're here and we're back."

And then there was ... boys basketball, and a season to tell the grandkids about. Led by coach Jim Stephens, seniors Graves, Maley, Cedric Franklin, T.J. Jennings and Jimmy Villa and freshman Matt Traverso – powered the Falcons to a second-place finish in the Metro League and a berth in the Division IV playoffs.

There had been playoff berths before – and frustrating first-round losses in the last two seasons. But this year things were wonderfully different: After defeating Summerville, St. Helena and Colfax for the Division IV section championship, the Falcons went on to a NorCal semifinal triumph against Palma and, finally, a breathtaking 55-53 victory over

Colfax for the north state championship. Jennings and Maley shared the glory at the end – Jennings for hitting his most important three-pointer of the season to tie the game at 53-53, Maley for hitting two free throws on a technical foul

to win.

But that wasn't where the glory ended: Up against the nationally recognized powerhouse Verbum Dei, CB came within a few free throws in overtime of winning the Sacramento area's third-ever boys state title. Not bad for a team with only one starter taller than 6-2. And no wonder that there was nothing but praise from Stephens after the state title game:



"I don't think any local team in recent memory played with such a size disadvantage, but these kids kept playing. I'm very proud of what these kids brought to CBS. They're the ones who brought this program up, and they set the bar pretty darn high for the future teams here."

The players shared Stephens' enthusiasm. "We're glad people are excited about CBS again," Jennings told The Bee. "We're something to talk about again." From Maley: "We've come so far. We don't want people to think we're just the other Catholic school here."

The crowning coda came not long after the season ended, when Graves – the gritty 6-2 senior forward who averaged 17 points, 10 rebounds and three steals a game and pushed the Falcons to victory despite injuries and asthma – was named one of The Bee's two 1998-99 Players of the Year for leading "resurgent programs that enjoyed their greatest seasons."

"He has the most complete game of anyone in the area," said coach Stephens. "It could be years before we see another player with the heart of a lion like Emon."

But maybe not many years, Coach. After all, the Mighty Falcons are back. ♦

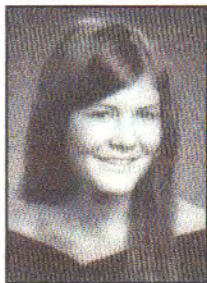
